

**SUBSTITUTE FOR
SENATE BILL NO. 460**

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled
"Public health code,"
by amending sections 20904 and 20910 (MCL 333.20904 and 333.20910),
section 20904 as amended by 2000 PA 375 and section 20910 as
amended by 2006 PA 582.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 20904. (1) "Education program sponsor" means a person,
2 other than an individual, that meets the standards of the
3 department to conduct training at the following levels:
4 (a) Medical first responder.
5 (b) Emergency medical technician.
6 (c) Emergency medical technician specialist.
7 (d) Paramedic.



1 (e) Emergency medical services instructor-coordinator.

2 (2) "Emergency" means a condition or situation in which an
3 individual declares a need for immediate medical attention for any
4 individual, or where that need is declared by emergency medical
5 services personnel or a public safety official.

6 (3) **"Emergency medical services coordination committee" means**
7 **the state emergency medical services coordination committee created**
8 **in section 20915.**

9 (4) ~~(3)~~—"Emergency medical services instructor-coordinator"
10 means an individual licensed under this part to conduct and
11 instruct emergency medical services education programs.

12 (5) ~~(4)~~—"Emergency medical services" means the emergency
13 medical services personnel, ambulances, nontransport prehospital
14 life support vehicles, aircraft transport vehicles, medical first
15 response vehicles, and equipment required for transport or
16 treatment of an individual requiring medical first response life
17 support, basic life support, limited advanced life support, or
18 advanced life support.

19 (6) ~~(5)~~—"Emergency medical services personnel" means a medical
20 first responder, emergency medical technician, emergency medical
21 technician specialist, paramedic, or emergency medical services
22 instructor-coordinator.

23 (7) ~~(6)~~—"Emergency medical services system" means a
24 comprehensive and integrated arrangement of the personnel,
25 facilities, equipment, services, communications, medical control,
26 and organizations necessary to provide emergency medical services
27 and trauma care within a particular geographic region.

28 (8) ~~(7)~~—"Emergency medical technician" means an individual who
29 is licensed by the department to provide basic life support.



1 (9) ~~(8)~~—"Emergency medical technician specialist" means an
2 individual who is licensed by the department to provide limited
3 advanced life support.

4 (10) ~~(9)~~—"Emergency patient" means an individual with a
5 physical or mental condition that manifests itself by acute
6 symptoms of sufficient severity, including, but not limited to,
7 pain such that a prudent layperson, possessing average knowledge of
8 health and medicine, could reasonably expect to result in 1 or all
9 of the following:

10 (a) Placing the health of the individual or, in the case of a
11 pregnant woman, the health of the patient or the unborn child, or
12 both, in serious jeopardy.

13 (b) Serious impairment of bodily function.

14 (c) Serious dysfunction of a body organ or part.

15 (11) ~~(10)~~—"Examination" means a written and practical
16 evaluation approved or developed by the ~~national registry of~~
17 ~~emergency medical technicians~~ **National Registry of Emergency**
18 **Medical Technicians** or other organization with equivalent national
19 recognition and expertise in emergency medical services personnel
20 testing and approved by the department.

21 Sec. 20910. (1) The department shall do all of the following:

22 (a) Be responsible for the development, coordination, and
23 administration of a statewide emergency medical services system.

24 (b) Facilitate and promote programs of public information and
25 education concerning emergency medical services.

26 (c) In case of actual disasters and disaster training drills
27 and exercises, provide emergency medical services resources
28 ~~pursuant to~~ **under** applicable provisions of the Michigan emergency
29 preparedness plan, or as prescribed by the director of emergency



1 services ~~pursuant to~~**under** the emergency management act, 1976 PA
2 390, MCL 30.401 to 30.421.

3 (d) Consistent with the rules of the ~~federal communications~~
4 ~~commission,~~**Federal Communications Commission**, plan, develop,
5 coordinate, and administer a statewide emergency medical services
6 communications system.

7 (e) Develop and maintain standards of emergency medical
8 services and **emergency medical services** personnel as follows:

9 (i) License emergency medical services personnel in accordance
10 with this part.

11 (ii) License ambulance operations, nontransport prehospital
12 life support operations, and medical first response services in
13 accordance with this part.

14 (iii) At least annually, inspect or provide for the inspection
15 of each life support agency, except medical first response
16 services. As part of that inspection, the department shall conduct
17 random inspections of life support vehicles. If a life support
18 vehicle is determined by the department to be out of compliance,
19 the department shall give the life support agency 24 hours to bring
20 the life support vehicle into compliance. If the life support
21 vehicle is not brought into compliance in that time period, the
22 department shall order the life support vehicle taken out of
23 service until the life support agency demonstrates to the
24 department, in writing, that the life support vehicle has been
25 brought into compliance.

26 (iv) Promulgate rules to establish the requirements for
27 licensure of life support agencies, vehicles, and individuals
28 licensed under this part to provide emergency medical services and
29 other rules necessary to implement this part. The department shall



1 submit all proposed rules and changes to the ~~state~~-emergency
 2 medical services coordination committee and provide a reasonable
 3 time for the committee's review and recommendations before
 4 submitting the rules for public hearing under the administrative
 5 procedures act of 1969.

6 (f) Promulgate rules to establish and maintain standards for
 7 and regulate the use of descriptive words, phrases, symbols, or
 8 emblems that represent or denote that an ambulance operation,
 9 nontransport prehospital life support operation, or medical first
 10 response service is or may be provided. The department's authority
 11 to regulate use of the descriptive devices includes use for the
 12 purposes of advertising, promoting, or selling the services
 13 rendered by an ambulance operation, nontransport prehospital life
 14 support operation, or medical first response service, or by
 15 emergency medical services personnel.

16 (g) Designate a medical control authority as the medical
 17 control for emergency medical services for a particular geographic
 18 region as provided for under this part.

19 (h) Develop and implement field studies involving the use of
 20 skills, techniques, procedures, or equipment that are not included
 21 as part of the standard education for medical first responders,
 22 emergency medical technicians, emergency medical technician
 23 specialists, or paramedics, if all of the following conditions are
 24 met:

25 (i) The ~~state~~-emergency medical services coordination committee
 26 reviews the field study prior to implementation.

27 (ii) The field study is conducted in an area for which a
 28 medical control authority has been approved ~~pursuant to~~ **under**
 29 subdivision (g).



1 (iii) The medical first responders, emergency medical
 2 technicians, emergency medical technician specialists, and
 3 paramedics participating in the field study receive training for
 4 the new skill, technique, procedure, or equipment.

5 (i) ~~Collect~~ **Except as otherwise provided in subsection (3),**
 6 **collect** data as necessary to assess the need for and quality of
 7 emergency medical services throughout ~~the~~ **this** state pursuant to
 8 **under** 1967 PA 270, MCL 331.531 to ~~331.533~~ **331.534**.

9 (j) Develop, with the advice of the emergency medical services
 10 coordination committee, an emergency medical services plan that
 11 includes rural issues.

12 (k) Develop recommendations for territorial boundaries of
 13 medical control authorities that are designed to ~~assure~~ **ensure** that
 14 there exists reasonable emergency medical services capacity within
 15 the boundaries for the estimated demand for emergency medical
 16 services.

17 (l) Within 1 year after the statewide trauma care advisory
 18 subcommittee is established under section 20917a and in
 19 consultation with the statewide trauma care advisory subcommittee,
 20 develop, implement, and promulgate rules for the implementation and
 21 operation of a statewide trauma care system within the emergency
 22 medical services system consistent with the document entitled
 23 "Michigan Trauma Systems Plan" prepared by the Michigan ~~trauma~~
 24 ~~coalition~~, **Trauma Coalition**, dated November 2003. The
 25 implementation and operation of the statewide trauma care system,
 26 including the rules promulgated in accordance with this
 27 subdivision, are subject to review by the emergency medical
 28 services coordination committee and the statewide trauma care
 29 advisory subcommittee. The rules promulgated under this subdivision



1 ~~shall~~**must** not require a hospital to be designated as providing a
2 certain level of trauma care. Upon implementation of a statewide
3 trauma care system, the department shall review and identify
4 potential funding mechanisms and sources for the statewide trauma
5 care system.

6 (m) Promulgate other rules to implement this part.

7 (n) Perform other duties as set forth in this part.

8 (2) The department may do all of the following:

9 (a) In consultation with the emergency medical services
10 coordination committee, promulgate rules to require an ambulance
11 operation, nontransport prehospital life support operation, or
12 medical first response service to periodically submit designated
13 records and data for evaluation by the department.

14 (b) Establish a grant program or contract with a public or
15 private agency, emergency medical services professional
16 association, or emergency medical services coalition to provide
17 training, public information, and assistance to medical control
18 authorities and emergency medical services systems or to conduct
19 other activities as specified in this part.

20 **(3) The department shall not require a medical first response**
21 **service to submit data for purposes of the Michigan emergency**
22 **medical services information system if the medical first response**
23 **service is composed of only medical first responders who provide**
24 **services regulated under this part without expecting or receiving**
25 **money, goods, or services in return for providing those services. A**
26 **medical first response service described in this subsection shall**
27 **ensure that a medical first responder provides, in writing, at**
28 **least all of the following information to an emergency medical**
29 **technician, emergency medical technician specialist, or paramedic,**



1 arriving at the scene after the medical first responder:

2 (a) The time of the initial medical first responder's arrival
3 at the scene.

4 (b) The patient's condition at the time of the initial medical
5 first responder's arrival at the scene.

6 (c) Information gathered from a patient assessment, including,
7 but not limited to, the patient's vital signs and level of
8 consciousness.

9 (d) Each treatment provided to the patient, the time that each
10 treatment is provided, and the patient's response to each
11 treatment, if any.

12 (e) Any change in the patient's condition after the initial
13 patient assessment and the time of each change.

14 (f) The name of each emergency medical services personnel who
15 arrives at the scene.

16 (4) Subsection (3) does not apply to data collection and
17 sharing required by a medical control authority for the purpose of
18 a quality monitoring and improvement activity or by a medical
19 control authority that has approved extended interventions for
20 medical first responders.

21 (5) The department may develop and circulate to each medical
22 first response service described in subsection (3) a standardized
23 form that may be used by a medical first responder when providing
24 the information described in subsection (3).
