## SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 5559

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled
"Natural resources and environmental protection act,"

(MCL 324.101 to 324.90106) by adding sections 48714a and 48714b.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 48714a. (1) Beginning March 1, 2021, an individual shall not act as a sport fishing guide on an inland lake or stream, as that term is defined in section 30101, unless that individual possesses both of the following:
- 5 (a) A valid license issued under subsection (2).
- 6 (b) A valid fishing license.
- 7 (2) To obtain a license to act as a sport fishing guide, an 8 individual shall submit the application fee described in section 9 48714b and an application to the department. The application must





- 1 be in a format determined by the department. The department shall
- 2 only grant a license to an individual if the department determines
- 3 all of the following:
- 4 (a) That the individual holds a valid certification in first
- 5 aid and cardiopulmonary resuscitation issued by the American Red
- 6 Cross, the American Heart Association, or a comparable organization
- 7 as approved by the department, and that the individual can provide
- 8 to the department, upon request, a copy of the certification.
- 9 (b) The individual has a valid, lawfully obtained Michigan
- 10 driver license issued under the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300,
- 11 MCL 257.1 to 257.923, an official state personal identification
- 12 card issued under 1972 PA 222, MCL 28.291 to 28.300, or a sportcard
- 13 issued under section 43522.
- 14 (c) The individual has not been convicted of any of the
- 15 following within the past 3 years:
- 16 (i) A violation of any of the following:
- 17 (A) Section 40112.
- 18 (B) Section 40118(2), (3), (4), (5), (6), (14), (15), (16), or
- 19 (17).
- 20 (C) Section 41105.
- 21 (D) Section 44524.
- 22 (E) Section 48738(2) or (3).
- 23 (F) Section 48739(1), (2), or (3).
- 24 (ii) Any felony.
- 25 (iii) A violation of a law of a participating state
- 26 substantially corresponding to a violation described in
- 27 subparagraphs (i) to (ii).
- 28 (d) The individual is eligible to purchase a license for the
- 29 fish species for which the individual is acting as a sport fishing



- 1 guide.
- 2 (e) Unless the individual indicates in writing to the
- 3 department that sport fishing guiding activities will occur without
- 4 the use of a watercraft, the individual has either a valid state
- 5 pilot's license issued by the department under section 44510 or a
- 6 valid captain's license issued by the United States Coast Guard.
- 7 (3) An individual shall not act as a sport fishing quide
- 8 unless that individual, when acting as a sport fishing guide,
- 9 carries a basic first aid kit that includes, but is not limited to,
- 10 all of the following:
- 11 (a) Tourniquet, chest seals, and compression gauze.
- 12 (b) CPR mask.
- 13 (c) Trauma shears.
- 14 (d) Sterile eyewash.
- 15 (e) Mylar emergency blanket.
- 16 (f) Bandages.
- 17 (q) Moleskin.
- 18 (h) Tweezers.
- 19 (4) An individual shall not act as a sport fishing guide on
- 20 commercial forestland.
- 21 (5) A license issued under this section is valid for 3 years
- 22 after the date it is issued. The department shall allow an
- 23 individual to obtain a public boating access entry pass required
- 24 under section 78105(3) with any sport fishing guide license issued
- 25 under this section for each year that the sport fishing guide
- 26 license is valid. The department may revoke a license under this
- 27 section, after notice and opportunity for hearing pursuant to the
- 28 administrative procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 to
- 29 24.328, for either of the following reasons:

- 1 (a) The department determines that an individual is not 2 eligible to hold a license under this section.
- 3 (b) The individual provides false information under this 4 section.
- 5 (6) A sport fishing guide shall file monthly reports to the 6 department, in a format determined by the department, that contain 7 information related to all of the following:
- 8 (a) The species of fish for which the individual acted as a 9 sport fishing guide.
- 10 (b) The number of clients that the sport fishing guide had for 11 each fishing trip and the number of hours fished for each fishing 12 trip.
- 13 (c) The number of fish caught and released and the number of 14 fish harvested by the clients of the sport fishing guide.
- 15 (d) The bodies of water where the individual acted as a sport 16 fishing guide.
- 17 (e) Any additional information the department requires
  18 regarding the fishing activity or biological characteristics of the
  19 fish caught and released or harvested.
- 20 (f) For any month that the guide did not act as a sport
  21 fishing guide, a report stating that the individual did not act as
  22 a sport fishing guide during that month.
  - (7) If an individual fails to file a monthly report under subsection (6) and that report remains unfiled for more than 90 days after the date it is due, the individual is subject to the following:
- 27 (a) For a first violation, a \$100.00 civil fine.
- (b) For a second violation, a \$200.00 civil fine.
- 29 (c) For a third violation, a \$500.00 civil fine.



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- 1 (d) For a fourth violation, after notice and an opportunity
- 2 for hearing pursuant to the administrative procedures act of 1969,
- 3 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 to 24.328, a revocation of the individual's
- 4 license under this section.
- 5 (8) Information submitted in reports under subsection (6) is
- 6 confidential and is exempt from disclosure under the freedom of
- 7 information act, 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.231 to 15.246.
- 8 (9) The department shall annually post on its website all of
- 9 the following:
- 10 (a) The number of applications submitted under subsection (2)
- 11 in the previous year.
- 12 (b) The number of licenses issued under this section in the
- 13 previous year.
- 14 (c) A list of individuals who have valid licenses under this
- 15 section.
- 16 (10) An individual shall carry his or her sport fishing quide
- 17 license and shall exhibit the license upon the demand of a
- 18 conservation officer, a peace officer, a tribal conservation
- 19 officer, a park and recreation officer if sport fishing guiding
- 20 takes place on property regulated under part 741 or 781, or the
- 21 owner or occupant of any land where the individual is acting as a
- 22 sport fishing guide.
- 23 (11) An individual who acts as a sport fishing guide without a
- 24 valid license issued under this section or who acts as a sport
- 25 fishing guide on commercial forestland is subject to a civil fine
- 26 of not more than \$500.00. An individual who acts as a sport fishing
- 27 quide without a valid license issued under this section or who acts
- 28 as a sport fishing guide on commercial forestland a second or
- 29 subsequent time is subject to a civil fine of not more than

- 1 \$1,000.00. A civil fine collected under this subsection or
- 2 subsection (7) must be deposited in the game and fish protection
- 3 account established in section 2010.
- 4 (12) An individual who provides false information to the
- 5 department under this section is subject to a civil fine of not
- 6 more than \$500.00 and the costs of prosecution.
- 7 (13) As used in this section:
- 8 (a) "Consideration of value" means an economic benefit,
- 9 inducement, right, or profit, including monetary payment accruing
- 10 to an individual or person. Consideration of value does not include
- 11 a voluntary sharing of the actual expenses of the guiding activity,
- 12 by monetary contribution or donation of fuel, food, beverage, or
- 13 other supplies.
- 14 (b) "Participating state" means that term as defined in
- 15 section 1615.
- (c) "Sport fishing guide" means an individual who, for a fee
- 17 or other consideration, provides assistance to another individual
- 18 in pursuing, capturing, catching, killing, taking, or attempting to
- 19 take fish. Sport fishing guide does not include any of the
- 20 following:
- 21 (i) An employee or member of an organization conducting a not-
- 22 for-profit activity to recruit, retain, or promote fishing, while
- 23 providing assistance to another individual in taking fish during
- 24 that activity.
- 25 (ii) The owner of private land while providing assistance to
- 26 another individual in pursuing, capturing, catching, killing,
- 27 taking, or attempting to take fish on that private land.
- 28 (iii) An individual who complies with subsection (2)(c) and who
- 29 is working under the direct supervision of a licensed sport fishing

- 1 guide. As used in this subparagraph, "direct supervision" means
- 2 that visual and vocal contact is constantly maintained between the
- 3 individual and the licensed sport fishing guide.
- 4 Sec. 48714b. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section,
- 5 the department shall charge a resident applying for a sport fishing
- 6 quide license under section 48714a an application fee of \$150.00.
- 7 The department shall charge a nonresident applying for a sport
- 8 fishing guide license under section 48714a an application fee of
- 9 \$300.00. The operator of a charter boat licensed under part 445 is
- 10 not required to pay an application fee under this section. Money
- 11 collected under this section must be deposited in the game and fish
- 12 protection account established in section 2010.
- 13 (2) If an individual elects to obtain a public boating access
- 14 entry pass with the sport fishing guide license under section
- 15 48714a, the department shall charge that individual a \$300.00 fee.
- 16 Money collected for a public boating access entry pass under this
- 17 section must be deposited in the waterways account established in
- 18 section 2035.
- 19 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 20 after the date it is enacted into law.
- 21 Enacting section 2. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 22 unless all of the following bills of the 100th Legislature are
- 23 enacted into law:
- 24 (a) House Bill No. 5558.
- 25 (b) House Bill No. 5560.
