MINUTES

The Senate Committee on Transportation held a meeting on Tuesday, May 28, 2013 at 12:30 p.m. in Room 100 of the Farnum Building.

Senator Casperson called the meeting to order at 12:31 p.m.

Attendance was recorded as follows:

Present: Senators Casperson (C), Kowall, Brandenburg, Pavlov, Hood, and Ananich

Absent: None

Excused: Senator Hansen

Senator Casperson announced the following order of business:

- Adoption of the minutes from the May 21, 2013 meeting
- SB 263 Sen. Caswell Transportation; railroads; provision in state transportation preservation act of 1976 allowing for rail divestiture or leases to current operators of certain railroad properties; remove, and repeal other provisions.
- SB 390 Sen. Moolenaar Traffic control; driver license; motorcycle endorsement for operation of an autocycle; eliminate.

Senator Casperson led the members in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Senator Casperson announced the first order of business was Senate Bill 390. Senator Moolenaar and Joel Sheltrown, of Elio Motors, Inc., gave members an overview of the bill.

The following individuals testified before the members regarding SB 390:

Senator Casperson announced the next order of business was Senate Bill 263. Senator Casperson gave members an overview of the bill.

Senator Kowall made a motion to report Senate Bill 263 with recommendation that the bill pass.

Senator Casperson offered a motion to recommend immediate effect; being no objection, the motion carried.
