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MINUTES

The Senate Committee on Transportation held a meeting on Tuesday, October 29, 2013 at 12:30 p.m. in Room 100 of the Farnum Building.

Senator Casperson called the meeting to order at 12:33 p.m.

Attendance was recorded as follows:

Present: Senators Casperson (C), Kowall, Brandenburg, Pavlov, and Hood

Absent: None

Excused: Senators Hansen and Ananich

Senator Casperson announced the following order of business:

- Adoption of the minutes from the October 22, 2013 meeting
- SB 463 Sen. Caswell Vehicles; registration plates; required attachment of registration plate to rear of vehicle; eliminate requirement for certain historic military vehicles.
- SB 491 Sen. Brandenburg Vehicles; registration; off-road vehicle eligibility for registration and certificate of title; modify to allow for off-road vehicles that may be modified for on-road use under certain circumstances.

Senator Casperson led the members in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Senator Pavlov made a motion to adopt the minutes from the October 22, 2013 meeting; being no objection, the motion carried.

Senator Kowall made a motion to excuse absent members and, without objection, they were excused.

Senator Casperson announced Senate Bill 463 was the next order of business. Senator Caswell gave members a brief overview of the bill.

The following individuals testified before the members on SB 463:

Senator Casperson advised members that since this was the first week the bill was on the agenda, voting would be held for a future meeting.

Senator Casperson announced the next order of business was Senate Bill 491. Senator Brandenburg gave members a brief overview of the bill and placed an (S-1) substitute before them.
