HOUSE BILL NO. 5210

November 07, 2019, Introduced by Reps. Miller, Leutheuser and Hoitenga and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled "Michigan vehicle code,"

by amending section 710 (MCL 257.710).

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1	Sec. 710. (1) (a) A motor vehicle, truck, motor bus, truck
2	tractor, semitrailer, recreational vehicle, or mobile home operated
3	on a highway of this state must be equipped with tires inflated
4	with compressed air, and all other vehicles operated on a highway
5	of this state must be equipped with tires of rubber or another

material or construction of equal resiliency to rubber. A person 1 shall not operate on a public highway of this state a motor 2 vehicle, or special mobile equipment which trailer, semitrailer, 3 recreational vehicle, or mobile home that has a metal or plastic 4 track or a tire which is equipped with metal that comes in contact 5 6 with the surface of the road, or which has a partial contact of 7 metal or plastic with the surface of the road, except as provided in subsections (c), (d), and (e).subsection (2). 8

(2) (b) A person shall not operate on a highway a vehicle, 9 10 which has a tire that including, but not limited to, a farm 11 tractor, an implement of husbandry, an animal-drawn vehicle, or road machinery, if that vehicle has on its the periphery of any of 12 its tires a block, stud, flange, cleat, spike, or other 13 14 protuberance of a material other than rubber which that projects 15 beyond the tread of the traction surface of the tire. , except as 16 provided in subsections (c), (d), and (c). A person may, however, 17 This subsection does not apply to any of the following:

18 (a) The use farm machinery of an implement of husbandry with a
19 metal tire having or a tire that has a protuberance which that will
20 not injure a highway. A person may also

(b) The use of a tire chain of reasonable proportion upon a
vehicle when required for safety because of snow, ice, or other
condition tending to cause a vehicle to skid.

(c) A person may operate on a highway a vehicle which has a pneumatic tire in which wire of .075 inches in diameter or less is or wire coils for improving traction on ice or snow are embedded if the tire is constructed so that the percent percentage of metal wire or wire coils in contact with the highway does not exceed 5% of the total tire area in contact with the roadway, except that

1 during the first 1,000 miles of use or operation of the tire the 2 metal in contact with the highway shall must not exceed 20% of the 3 area.

4 (d) A tire equipped with tungsten carbide studs, if both of 5 the following are satisfied:

6 (i) The tire is used on an authorized emergency vehicle, a
7 vehicle used to deliver mail, or a motor vehicle registered in
8 another state that is present in this state for 30 days or less.

9 (*ii*) The tungsten carbide studs do not project more than 1/8
10 inch beyond the tread surface of the tire.

11 (3) (d) The state transportation department of state highways 12 and transportation shall promulgate rules establishing acceptable 13 standards to permit designate the use of a tire with studs or other traction devices to be used on a street or highway after April 1, 14 15 1975. The rules shall make separate provision for the extreme 16 winter snow and ice conditions of the Upper Peninsula and the northern Lower Peninsula. The rules shall include a restriction on 17 18 the amount and dimension of protrusions that may be allowed on a 19 tire, the type of material that times during which the type of tire 20 described in subsection (2) (d) may be used. in a stud, traction 21 device, or tire, and the amount of road wear that a tire with studs 22 or other traction devices may cause on a street or highway. 23 (e) A person may operate on a highway a vehicle which has a pneumatic tire in which are inserted ice grips or tire studs if the 24 25 person is a law enforcement officer operating a vehicle owned by a 26 law enforcement agency, a person operating an ambulance, or a

27 United States postal service rural carrier driving a vehicle the

28 rural carrier owns and maintains as a prerequisite to employment in

29 the postal service.



(4) (f) A person shall not operate a vehicle on a highway when 1 2 a tire in use on that vehicle is unsafe as provided in under subsection (h). (6). 3 (5) (g) A person in the business of selling tires shall not 4 5 sell or offer for sale for highway use a tire which that is unsafe 6 as provided in under subsection (h). (6). 7 (6) (h) A tire is unsafe if it is in any of the following 8 conditions: 9 (a) (i) Has a part of the belting material, tire cords, or plys 10 plies exposed. 11 (b) (ii) Has evidence of cord or tread separations. 12 (c) (iii) Is worn to or below the minimum tread level in 2 or more adjacent major grooves at 3 or more locations spaced around 13 the circumference of the tire. Minimum allowable tread levels are 14 15 as follows: motorcycles and moped1/32 inch front and rear 16 17 passenger cars and vehicles 18 weighing less than 10,000 pounds2/32 inch front and rear 19 20 vehicles weighing 10,000 pounds 21 or more 4/32 inch front and 2/23 rear 22 Measurements shall must not be made at locations of tread wear indicators or tie bars. A motor vehicle licensed as an historic 23 24 vehicle under section 803a is exempt from the tread depth 25 requirements of this subsection. 26 (d) (iv) Has a marking "not for highway use", "for racing purposes only", "for farm use only", or "unsafe for highway use". 27

(e) (v) Has been regrooved or recut below the original tread
design depth. except in the case of special purpose designed This



subdivision does not apply to regrooved or recut commercial vehicle 1 tires having extra undertread rubber provided for this purpose and 2 identified as those tires.constructed in such a manner that 3 regrooving or recutting is an acceptable or safe practice, or to 4 regrooving or recutting performed as part of a tire recapping 5 6 process. 7 (7) R 247.171 to R 247.175 of the Michigan Administrative Code 8 are rescinded.

9 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days10 after the date it is enacted into law.
