> SENATE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 4352

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

by amending section 17757 (MCL 333.17757), as amended by 2021 PA 36, and by adding section 17757b.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 17757. (1) On receipt of When a pharmacist engaged in the 1 2 business of selling drugs receives a prescription, the pharmacist may, or, when the pharmacist receives a request made in person or 3 by telephone, a the pharmacist engaged in the business of selling 4 drugs at retail shall provide the current selling price of a drug 5 6 dispensed by that pharmacy or comparative current selling prices of generic and brand name drugs or biosimilar drug products dispensed 7 by that pharmacy. The If information must be is provided to the 8

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person making the request under this subsection, it must be 1 provided before a drug is dispensed. to the person. A person that 2 makes a request for **or receives** price information under this 3 subsection is not obligated to purchase the drug for which the 4 5 price or comparative prices are requested or received. A pharmacy 6 or a pharmacist described in this subsection shall not enter into a 7 contract that prohibits the disclosure of the information described 8 in this subsection.

9 (2) A pharmacist engaged in the business of selling drugs at
10 retail shall conspicuously display the notice described in
11 subsection (3) at each counter over which prescription drugs are
12 dispensed.

13 (3) The notice required under subsection (2) must be in14 substantially the following form:

NOTICE TO CONSUMERS
ABOUT PRESCRIPTION DRUGS
Under Michigan law, you have the right to find out the price

18 of a prescription drug before the pharmacist fills the 19 prescription. You are under no obligation to have the prescription 20 filled here and may use this price information to shop around at 21 other pharmacies. You may request price information in person or by 22 telephone.

23 Every pharmacy has the current selling prices of both generic24 and brand name drugs dispensed by the pharmacy.

Ask your pharmacist if a lower-cost generic drug is available to fill your prescription. A generic drug contains the same medicine as a brand name drug and is a suitable substitute in most instances.

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A generic drug may not be dispensed by your pharmacist if your

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1 doctor has written "dispense as written" or the initials "d.a.w." 2 on the prescription.

3 If you have questions about the drugs that have been
4 prescribed for you, ask your doctor or pharmacist for more
5 information.

To avoid dangerous drug interactions, let your doctor and
pharmacist know about any other medications you are taking. This is
especially important if you have more than 1 doctor or have
prescriptions filled at more than 1 pharmacy.

10 (4) The notice required under subsection (2) must also contain 11 the address and phone number of the board and the department. The 12 text of the notice must be in at least 32-point bold type and must 13 be printed on paper at least 11 inches by 17 inches in size. The 14 notice may be printed on multiple pages.

15 (5) The department shall provide a copy of the notice required 16 under subsection (2) to each licensee. The department shall provide 17 additional copies if needed. A person may duplicate or reproduce 18 the notice if the duplication or reproduction is a true copy of the 19 notice as produced by the department, without any additions or 20 deletions.

(6) The pharmacist shall furnish to the purchaser of a prescription drug at the time the drug is delivered to the purchaser a receipt evidencing the transactions that contains all of the following:

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(a) The brand name of the drug, if applicable.

(b) The name of the manufacturer or the supplier of the drug,if the drug does not have a brand name.

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(c) The strength of the drug, if significant.

29 (d) The quantity dispensed, if applicable.

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(e) The name and address of the pharmacy.

2 (f) The serial number of the prescription, a reference to the
3 standing order issued under section 17744e, or, if the prescription
4 drug is dispensed pursuant to section 17744f, a reference to
5 section 17744f.

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(g) The date the prescription was originally dispensed.

7 (h) The name of the prescriber or, if prescribed under the
8 prescriber's delegatory authority, the name of the delegatee. If
9 the prescription drug is dispensed pursuant to section 17744f, the
10 name of the original prescriber and the pharmacist dispensing the
11 prescription drug.

12 (i) Except as otherwise authorized under section 5110, 17744a,
13 17744b, or 17744e, the name of the patient for whom the drug was
14 prescribed or dispensed.

15 (j) The price for which the drug was sold to the purchaser. 16 (7) The items required under subsection (6)(a), (b), and (c) 17 may be omitted from a receipt by a pharmacist only if the omission is expressly required by the prescriber. The pharmacist shall 18 retain a copy of each receipt furnished under subsection (6) for 90 19 20 days. The inclusion of the items required under subsection (6) on the prescription container label is a valid receipt to the 21 purchaser. Including the items required under subsection (6) on the 22 23 written prescription form and retaining the form constitutes retention of a copy of the receipt. 24

25 (8) The department, in consultation with the board, may26 promulgate rules to implement this section.

27 Sec. 17757b. (1) A pharmacy or pharmacist engaged in the 28 business of selling drugs shall not enter into a contract with a 29 pharmacy benefit manager that violates section 26 of the third

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party administrator act, 1984 PA 218, MCL 550.926, or that prevents or interferes with in any manner a patient's choice to receive an eligible prescription drug from a 340b entity or a pharmacy when dispensing a 340b drug.

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(2) As used in this section:

6 (a) "340b drug" means a covered drug as that term is defined 7 in 42 USC 256b.

8 (b) "340b entity" means a covered entity as that term is9 defined in 42 USC 256b.

10 (c) "Pharmacy benefit manager" means that term as defined in
11 section 2 of the third party administrator act, 1984 PA 218, MCL
12 550.902.
