## SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 413

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

by amending sections 18221, 18223, 18233, and 18237 (MCL 333.18221, 333.18223, 333.18233, and 333.18237), section 18221 as amended by 2006 PA 395, section 18223 as amended by 2018 PA 24, section 18233 as amended by 1994 PA 234, and section 18237 as amended by 1998 PA 496.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 18221. (1) The Michigan board of psychology is created in
- 2 the department. and shall consist Except as otherwise provided in
- 3 subsection (2), the board consists of the following 9 voting
- 4 members who shall must meet the requirements of part 161: 5
- 5 psychologists, including at least 1 nondoctoral psychologist, and 4





- 1 public members. Section 1212 does not apply to this board.
  - (2) Beginning after the effective date of the amendatory act that added this subsection, all of the following apply to the board described in subsection (1):
  - (a) The 4 public members shall continue in office for the remainder of their respective terms. When the term of office of the first public member expires, the governor shall not appoint a public member to fill that position but shall instead, subject to part 161, appoint 1 psychologist who holds a license under section 18223(1) to fill the position, thereby reducing the total number of public members on the board to 3 and increasing the number of psychologists who hold a license under section 18223(1) to 5.
  - (b) The governor shall, subject to part 161, appoint 2 psychologists who hold a limited license under section 18223(3) to the board, thereby increasing the total number of psychologists who hold limited licenses on the board to 3 and the total number of voting members on the board to 11.
- (3) (2)—The terms of office of individual members of the board created under this section, except those appointed to fill vacancies, expire 4 years after appointment on December 31 of the year in which the term expires.
  - Sec. 18223. (1) The department, in consultation with the board, shall promulgate rules requiring that to be require an individual who is granted a license under this part to engage in the practice of psychology to, except as provided in subsection (2), an individual must this section, meet both of the following requirements:
- 28 (a) Have been granted a doctoral degree in psychology, or a 29 doctoral degree in a closely related field, from a doctoral degree



- 1 program that meets all of the following requirements:
  - (i) Is offered by a regionally accredited or other college, university, or institution approved by the board, and includes education and training appropriate to the practice of psychology.
    - Psychology Boards' national register designation, has been accredited by the American Psychological Association or the Canadian Psychological Association, or has obtained a similar designation from or been accredited by an entity approved by the board. However, a program that is in the process of obtaining the designation or becoming accredited as required in this subparagraph before August 1, 2011, and that obtains the designation or becomes accredited on or before August 31, 2020, meets the requirements of this subparagraph.
    - (b) Have not less than 1 year of postdoctoral experience in the practice of psychology in an organized health care setting or other arrangement, as established by the board.
    - (2) In addition to section 16182, the board shall grant To be granted a limited license to engage in the practice of psychology, an individual granted must hold a master's degree in psychology from a regionally accredited college, or university, or institution approved by the board, if the individual has and have the education, training, and experience appropriate to the practice of psychology, as established by the department, in consultation with the board. An individual who applies for an initial limited license under this subsection before March 31, 2018 is not required to take an examination that is approved by the board to be granted a limited license under this part if the individual was granted a master's degree in psychology after January 1, 2007 but before June

30, 2010 from the college, university, or institution described in 1 2 this subsection, the individual has continuously held the temporary license described in this section since it was initially granted by 3 the board, and the disciplinary subcommittee has not imposed a 4 sanction against the individual while holding the temporary license 5 6 described in this section. Except for duties performed as an 7 employee of a governmental entity or of a nonprofit organization 8 serving benevolent and charitable purposes, the board shall place 2 9 limitations must be placed on a limited license granted to an individual under this subsection. The limitations must require 10 11 supervision by a psychologist who has a license other than a limited license and must prohibit advertising or other 12 representation to the public that will lead the public to believe 13 the individual is engaging in the practice of psychology. A limited 14 15 license granted under this subsection is renewable under part 161. An individual who is applying for a limited license under this 16 subsection must have 1 year of supervised postgraduate experience 17 18 in an organized health care setting or other arrangement, as established by the department, in consultation with the board. The 19 20 individual postgraduate experience described in this subsection 21 must be supervised by a psychologist who has a license other than a 22 limited license, or if a psychologist who has a license other than 23 a limited license is not available, by a psychologist who has at least a master's degree in psychology and at least 3 years of 24 25 experience in the practice of psychology or by any other individual approved by the board. This subsection does not limit the ability 26 27 to grant a limited license under section 16182. This subsection does not apply beginning 12 months after the effective date of the 28 29 amendatory act that added subsection (3).

1 (3) Beginning 12 months after the effective date of the 2 amendatory act that added this subsection, to be granted a limited 3 license to engage in the practice of psychology, an individual must 4 hold a master's degree in psychology from a regionally accredited 5 college, university, or institution approved by the department in 6 consultation with the board, and have the education, training, and 7 experience appropriate to the practice of psychology, as 8 established by the department, in consultation with the board. 9 Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, an individual who is applying for a limited license under this subsection who is 10 11 granted a master's degree in psychology before August 31, 2027, must have 2 years, totaling not less than 3,000 hours, of 12 13 supervised postgraduate experience, and an individual who is 14 granted a master's degree in psychology on or after August 31, 15 2027, must have 2 years, totaling not less than 4,000 hours, of supervised postgraduate experience. An individual who is satisfying 16 17 the supervised postgraduate experience described in subsection (2) 18 on or immediately before 12 months after the effective date of the 19 amendatory act that added this subsection must have 1 year of 20 supervised postgraduate experience to be granted a limited license 21 under this subsection. The postgraduate experience described in 22 this subsection must be completed in an organized health care 23 setting or other arrangement, as established by the department, in consultation with the board, and must be supervised by a 24 25 psychologist who is granted a license under subsection (1) or, if a 26 psychologist who is granted a license under subsection (1) is not 27 available, by a psychologist who has at least a master's degree in 28 psychology and at least 3 years of experience in the practice of 29 psychology or by any other individual approved by the department,



- in consultation with the board. An individual who is granted a 1 2 limited license under this subsection may engage in the practice of 3 psychology without supervision and shall perform an act, task, or 4 function within the practice of psychology for which the individual is qualified by education, training, or experience. An individual 5 6 who holds a limited license under this subsection shall not perform, offer to perform, or represent that the individual is 8 qualified to perform any of the acts, tasks, or functions within 9 the scope of practice of psychology that the individual is not 10 qualified by education, training, or experience to perform, or that 11 the individual is otherwise prohibited by law from performing. An individual who holds a limited license under subsection (2) on the 12 effective date of the amendatory act that added this subsection is 1.3 14 considered to hold a limited license under this subsection and is 15 not subject to the limitations on the license as described in subsection (2). The department, in consultation with the board, 16 17 shall promulgate rules to implement this subsection. This 18 subsection does not limit the ability to grant a license under section 16182. 19
  - (4) (3) The board shall grant a temporary license to an An individual described in subsection (2) or (3) must be granted a temporary license for the purpose of obtaining the 1 year of postgraduate experience described in that subsection. Beginning on March 31, 2018, a subsection (2) or (3). A temporary license granted under this subsection is valid for 24 months and may be renewed for 1—2 additional 24-month term. terms. If an individual described in subsection (2) was granted a temporary license by the board before March 31, 2018, his or her the individual's temporary license may be renewed for 1 additional 24-month term.

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- (5) (4) The board shall grant a temporary license to an An individual who is enrolled in a doctoral degree program that meets the requirements of subsection (1) must be granted a temporary license. Beginning on March 31, 2018, a temporary license granted under this subsection is valid for 24 months and may be renewed for 3 additional 24-month terms. If an individual enrolled in a doctoral program that meets the requirements of subsection (1) was granted a temporary license by the board before March 31, 2018, his or her the individual's temporary license may be renewed for 3 additional 24-month terms.
  - (6) An individual whose temporary license under subsection (4) or (5) has lapsed for failure to renew the temporary license may apply for relicensure in accordance with section 16201. An individual who is relicensed may renew the temporary license described in subsection (4) or (5) for any 24-month term remaining before the temporary license lapsed.
  - Sec. 18233. (1) In addition to the requirements of part 161, the board may require—a licensee seeking renewal of a license to shall furnish the board—department with satisfactory evidence that during the 2 years immediately preceding application for renewal, the licensee has attended continuing education courses or programs approved by the department, in consultation with the board, totaling not less than a number of hours established by rule of the board—in subjects related to the practice of psychology and designed to further educate licensees.
  - (2) As required under section 16204, the board shall promulgate rules requiring each applicant for license renewal to must complete as part of the continuing education requirement of subsection (1) an appropriate number of hours or courses in pain

- 4 **psychologist's** supervision cannot be compelled to disclose
- 5 confidential information acquired from an individual consulting the

- 7 if the information is necessary to enable the psychologist to
- 8 render services. Information may be disclosed with the consent of
- 9 the individual consulting the psychologist, or if the individual
- 10 consulting the psychologist is a minor, with the consent of the
- 11 minor's guardian, pursuant to section 16222 if the psychologist
- 12 reasonably believes it is necessary to disclose the information to
- 13 comply with section 16222, or under section 16281. In a contest on
