## ENROLLED HOUSE BILL No. 5804

AN ACT to amend section 43533 of Act No. 451 of the Public Acts of 1994, entitled "An act to protect the environment and natural resources of the state; to codify, revise, consolidate, and classify laws relating to the environment and natural resources of the state; to regulate the discharge of certain substances into the environment; to regulate the use of certain lands, waters, and other natural resources of the state; to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state and local agencies and officials; to provide for certain charges, fees, and assessments; to prescribe penalties and provide remedies; to repeal certain parts of this act on a specific date; and to repeal certain acts and parts of acts," as added by Act No. 57 of the Public Acts of 1995, being section 324.43533 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

The People of the State of Michigan enact:

Section 1. Section 43533 of Act No. 451 of the Public Acts of 1994, as added by Act No. 57 of the Public Acts of 1995, being section 324.43533 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 43533. A resident or nonresident may purchase a limited fishing license entitling that person to fish for all species of fish in all waters of this state. The fee for a limited fishing license is \$5.00 per designated consecutive 24-hour period.

This act is ordered to take immediate effect.
