

HOUSE BILL No. 4013

January 11, 1995, Introduced by Rep. Clack and referred to the Committee on Judiciary and Civil Rights.

A bill to amend section 234f of Act No. 328 of the Public Acts of 1931, entitled as amended "The Michigan penal code," as amended by Act No. 218 of the Public Acts of 1992, being section 750.234f of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Section 1. Section 234f of Act No. 328 of the Public Acts 2 of 1931, as amended by Act No. 218 of the Public Acts of 1992, 3 being section 750.234f of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is amended 4 to read as follows:

5 Sec. 234f. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2), an 6 individual less than 18 years of age shall not possess a firearm 7 in public except under the direct supervision of an individual 18 8 years of age or older. 1 (2) Subsection (1) does not apply to an individual less than 2 18 years of age who possesses a firearm in accordance with the 3 wildlife conservation act, Act No. 256 of the Public Acts of 4 1988, being sections 300.251 to 300.270 of the Michigan Compiled 5 Laws, or the hunting and fishing license act, Act No. 86 of the 6 Public Acts of 1980, being sections 316.101 to <u>316.902</u> 316.901 7 of the Michigan Compiled Laws. However, an individual less than 8 18 years of age may possess a firearm without a hunting license 9 while at, or going to or from, a recognized target range or trap 10 or skeet shooting ground if, while going to or from the range or 11 ground, the firearm is enclosed and securely fastened in a case 12 or locked in the trunk of a motor vehicle.

13 (3) An individual who violates this section is guilty of a 14 misdemeanor —, punishable by <u>imprisonment</u> 1 OR MORE OF THE 15 FOLLOWING:

17 (B) A fine of not more than \$100.00. -, or both.

18 (C) COMMUNITY SERVICE FOR NOT MORE THAN 100 HOURS.

(4) AS PART OF THE SENTENCE FOR A VIOLATION OF THIS SECTION,
THE COURT SHALL ORDER THE SECRETARY OF STATE TO SUSPEND THE
INDIVIDUAL'S OPERATOR'S OR CHAUFFEUR'S LICENSE FOR NOT MORE THAN
YEAR OR TO WITHHOLD ISSUANCE OF THE INDIVIDUAL'S OPERATOR'S OR
CHAUFFEUR'S LICENSE FOR NOT MORE THAN 1 YEAR AFTER THE DATE ON
WHICH THE INDIVIDUAL WOULD OTHERWISE BE ELIGIBLE FOR A LICENSE.
Section 2. This amendatory act shall not take effect unless
