

## **HOUSE BILL No. 4030**

January 11, 1995, Introduced by Rep. Baade and referred to the Committee on Judiciary and Civil Rights.

A bill to amend section 92 of Act No. 306 of the Public Acts of 1969, entitled as amended

"Administrative procedures act of 1969,"

being section 24.292 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Section 1. Section 92 of Act No. 306 of the Public Acts of 2 1969, being section 24.292 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is 3 amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 92. (I) Before the commencement of proceedings for
- 5 suspension, revocation, annulment, withdrawal, recall, cancella-
- 6 tion or amendment of a license, an agency shall give notice, per-
- 7 sonally or by mail, to the licensee of facts or conduct which
- 8 warrant the intended action. The- EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED
- 9 IN THE REGULATED OCCUPATIONS SUPPORT ENFORCEMENT ACT, THE

- 1 licensee shall be given an opportunity to show compliance with
  2 all lawful requirements for retention of the license.
- 3 (2) If the agency finds that the public health, safety or
- 4 welfare requires emergency action and incorporates this finding
- 5 in its order, summary suspension of a license may be ordered
- 6 effective on the date specified in the order or on service of a
- 7 certified copy of the order on the licensee, whichever is later,
- 8 and effective during the proceedings. The proceedings shall be
- 9 promptly commenced and determined.
- 10 Section 2. This amendatory act shall not take effect unless
