



HOUSE BILL No. 5385

November 8, 1995, Introduced by Reps. Gire, Horton, Green, Perricone, Kukuk, Bush, Hill, Pitoniak, Curtis, Harder, Willard, Munsell and Baade and referred to the Committee on Human Services.

A bill to provide for the suspension of certain occupational licenses under certain circumstances; and to provide for certain powers and duties for certain state agencies.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
2 "regulated occupation support enforcement act".

3 Sec. 2. As used in this act:

4 (a) "License" means a certificate, registration, or license
5 issued by an occupational regulatory agency that allows an indi-
6 vidual to engage in a regulated occupation or that allows an
7 individual to use a specific title in the practice of an occupa-
8 tion, profession, or vocation.

9 (b) "Occupational regulatory agency" means a department,
10 bureau, or agency of this state that has regulatory authority
11 over a regulated occupation.

1 (c) "Office of the friend of the court" means an agency
2 created by section 3 of the friend of the court act, Act No. 294
3 of the Public Acts of 1982, being section 552.503 of the Michigan
4 Compiled Laws.

5 (d) "Regulated occupation" means an occupation, profession,
6 or vocation that requires a license as a predicate for the prac-
7 tice of the occupation, profession, or vocation or that provides
8 for the use of a specific title in the practice of the occupa-
9 tion, profession, or vocation.

10 Sec. 3. An occupational regulatory agency shall comply with
11 a suspension order issued as provided in the support and visita-
12 tion enforcement act, Act No. 295 of the Public Acts of 1982,
13 being sections 552.601 to 552.650 of the Michigan Compiled Laws,
14 within 7 business days after receipt of the suspension order.

15 Sec. 4. An order rescinding a suspension order issued under
16 the support and visitation enforcement act, Act No. 295 of the
17 Public Acts of 1982, being sections 552.601 to 552.650 of the
18 Michigan Compiled Laws, is effective upon its entry by the court
19 and payment by the licensee of the customary reinstatement fee,
20 if any, charged by the occupational regulatory agency. The occu-
21 pational regulatory agency shall reinstate the license of a
22 licensee whose suspension order is rescinded within 7 business
23 days after receipt of the rescission order and payment of the
24 appropriate reinstatement fee. An occupational regulatory agency
25 shall send a notice of the license reinstatement to the licensee
26 upon reinstatement.

1 Sec. 5. This act shall not take effect unless all of the
2 following bills of the 88th Legislature are enacted into law:
