

HOUSE BILL No. 5596

February 14, 1996, Introduced by Reps. LeTarte, McBryde, Middleton, Oxender, Geiger, Jellema, Gilmer, Bobier, Dolan, McNutt and Johnson and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

EXECUTIVE BUDGET BILL

A bill to make appropriations for community colleges for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1997; to provide for the expenditure of the appropriations; to establish or continue certain funds, programs, and categories; and to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state departments, officers, and employees.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 101. There is appropriated for community colleges and certain
- 2 other state purposes relating to education, subject to the conditions set
- 3 forth in this act, for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1997, the
- 4 following amounts:

22	Sec. 201. (1) Pursuant to section 30 of article IX of the state
23	constitution of 1963, total state spending from state sources for fiscal
24	year 1996-97 is estimated at \$261,250,215.00 in this bill and state
25	spending from state sources paid to local units of government for fiscal
26	year 1996-97 is estimated at \$261,250,215.00. The itemized statement
27	below identifies appropriations from which spending to units of local

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government will occur:

- 2 (2) If it appears to the principal executive officer of a department
- 3 or branch that state spending to local units of government will be less
- 4 than the amount that was projected to be expended under subsection (1),
- 5 the principal executive officer shall immediately give notice of the
- 6 approximate shortfall to the department of management and budget.
- 7 Sec. 202. The expenditures and funding sources authorized under this
- 8 bill are subject to the management and budget act, Act no. 431 of the
- 9 Public Acts of 1984, being sections 18.1101 to 18.1594 of the Michigan
- 10 Compiled Laws.
- 11 Sec. 203. (1) For community colleges with fiscal years ending June
- 12 30, 1997, the sums appropriated in this act are appropriated for their
- 13 fiscal years ending June 30, 1997, and shall be paid out of the state
- 14 treasury and distributed by the state treasurer to the respective
- 15 community colleges in 9 equal monthly installments for the period October
- 16 1, 1996 to June 30, 1997. However, if a community college fails to submit
- 17 all verified Michigan Community Colleges Activities Classification
- 18 Structure data for school year 1995-96 to the department of education by
- 19 November 1, 1996, the monthly installments shall be withheld from that
- 20 community college until those data are submitted. The department of
- 21 education shall publish the activity classification structure data book
- 22 on or before March 1, 1997 for use by the legislature during budget
- 23 development for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1998. The amount
- 24 distributed to a community college or department shall not exceed the net
- 25 state allocation authorized by this act.
- 26 (2) Except as otherwise provided by law, each of the amounts
- 27 appropriated shall be used solely for the respective purposes stated in
- 28 this act. The funds appropriated by this act may be used to match the
- 29 cost of any available programs under the Carl D. Perkins vocational and
- 30 applied technology education act, Public Law 88-210, 98 Stat. 2435,

- 1 including local administration.
- Sec. 204. (1) The auditor general or an independent public accounting 2 3 firm appointed by the auditor general shall audit data for the fiscal year 4 ending on June 30, 1996, as submitted on the department of education 5 request forms of 7 randomly selected community colleges. A community 6 college shall maintain and provide those records necessary for the auditor general or certified public accountant appointed by the auditor general 7 8 to determine the accuracy of the reported data. The audits shall be based 9 upon the definitions and requirements contained in the Michigan Public Community Colleges Manual for Uniform Financial Reporting, 1981, as 10 11 revised, and the Michigan Community Colleges Activities Classification 12 Structure, 1981, as revised. Before the submission of a final audit report, a community college may appeal the findings of the preliminary 13 report, and the auditor general shall consult legislative and executive 14 authorities concerning an interpretation of the manual if necessary, 15
- 16 pursuant to an appeal process to be established by the auditor general.
- 17 The auditor general shall submit a report of the findings to the house and
- 18 senate appropriations committees, the department of education, and the
- 19 department of management and budget before June 1, 1997.
- 20 (2) The auditor general or a certified public accountant appointed by
 21 the auditor general shall conduct not less than 3 performance audits of
 22 community colleges but may conduct more if the auditor general considers
 23 it necessary.
- 24 (3) Not more than 60 days after an audit report is released by the 25 office of the auditor general, the principal executive officer of the 26 community college that was audited shall submit to the house and senate 27 appropriations committees, the house and senate fiscal agencies, the 28 department of education, the auditor general, and the department of 29 management and budget a plan to comply with audit recommendations. The 28 plan shall contain projected dates and resources required, if any, to

- 1 achieve compliance with the audit recommendations, or a documented
- 2 explanation of the college's noncompliance with the audit recommendations
- 3 concerning the matters on which the audited community college and office
- 4 of the auditor general disagree.
- 5 (4) Any community college whose audited activities classification
- 6 structure data is significantly different than the data used to determine
- 7 state aid under this act shall return overappropriated funds as provided
- 8 in this section. The department of education shall compare formula
- 9 computations for the audited colleges using pre and post audit data. If
- 10 the state allocation is 2% more than the post-audit allocation amount, the
- 11 college shall return the excess funds.
- 12 Sec. 205. The department of education shall revise and update the
- 13 taxonomy of the 7 community colleges selected for audit under section
- 14 203(1) pursuant to the Michigan Community Colleges Activities
- 15 Classification Structure, 1981, as revised.
- 16 Sec. 206. (1) A community college shall retain certified class
- 17 summaries, class lists, registration documents, and student transcripts
- 18 that are consistent with the taxonomy of courses. For each enrollment
- 19 period during the fiscal year, these certified documents shall identify
- 20 clearly by course the number of in-district and out-of-district student
- 21 credit and contact hours. The class summaries and class lists shall be
- 22 consistent with each other and shall include the course prefix and
- 23 numbers, course title, course credit and contact hours, credit and contact
- 24 hours generated by each student, and activity classifications consistent
- 25 with the taxonomy. An auditable process shall be used by the community
- 26 college to determine the unduplicated head count for in-district students,
- 27 out-of-district students, and prisoners, for each enrollment period during
- 28 the fiscal year.
- 29 (2) Contracts between the community college and agencies that
- 30 reimburse the community college for the costs of instruction shall be

- 1 retained for audit purposes.
- 2 Sec. 207. (1) Each community college shall have an annual audit of
- 3 all income and expenditures performed by an independent auditor and shall
- 4 furnish the independent auditor's management letter and an annual audited
- 5 accounting of all general and current funds income and expenditures
- 6 including audits of college foundations to the legislature, the senate and
- 7 house fiscal agencies, the auditor general, the department of education,
- 8 and the department of management and budget before December 1, 1996. If
- 9 a community college fails to furnish the audit materials, the monthly
- 10 state aid installments shall be withheld from that college until the
- 11 information is submitted. All reporting shall conform to the requirements
- 12 set forth in the Michigan Public Community Colleges Manual for Uniform
- 13 Financial Reporting, 1981, as revised.
- 14 Sec. 208. (1) Appropriations under this act shall not be expended in
- 15 contemplation of federal or other matching funds until federal or other
- 16 matching funds are available. The acceptance of federal or other matching
- 17 funds does not obligate this state to continue programs after those funds
- 18 are no longer available.
- 19 (2) A community college shall not establish special programs or expand
- 20 existing programs beyond the scope of the programs of the community
- 21 college already established and recognized by the legislature, including
- 22 programs that may develop as a result of gifts or money received or
- 23 available from the federal government, if that acceptance will require an
- 24 obligation or expenditure of state funds.
- 25 (3) A community college shall pay the employer's contributions to the
- 26 Michigan public school employees' retirement system created by the public
- 27 school employees retirement act of 1979, Act No. 300 of the Public Acts
- of 1980, being sections 38.1301 to 38.1408 of the Michigan Compiled Laws,
- 29 as a condition of receiving funds appropriated under this act. A
- 30 community college shall not pay an employer's contribution to more than

- 1 1 retirement fund providing benefits for an employee.
- 2 (4) An appropriation contained in this act shall not be used for the
- 3 construction of buildings or for operations of a community college not
- 4 expressly authorized in section 101. Funds appropriated in section 101
- 5 shall not be used to pay for the construction or maintenance of any self-
- 6 liquidating project.
- 7 (5) The governing body of a community college shall reduce
- 8 expenditures authorized by appropriations when it appears that actual
- 9 revenues for a fiscal period will fall below the revenue estimates on
- 10 which appropriations for that period were based.
- 11 (6) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, funds
- 12 appropriated in section 101 shall not be used for travel outside the
- 13 United States. This subsection does not apply to expenses of students,
- 14 administrators, faculty, or college trustees necessarily incurred for
- 15 involvement in a foreign study program offered by a community college, for
- 16 travel to fulfill a reciprocal education program with a postsecondary
- 17 educational institution, or for program-specific curriculum, educational,
- 18 or exchange policy discussions with a foreign postsecondary institution
- 19 or government.
- 20 Sec. 209. Each community college shall report to the house and senate
- 21 fiscal agencies, the department of education, and the department of
- 22 management and budget a modification in credit or contact hour tuition or
- 23 mandatory non-course-related student fees not later than 30 days after the
- 24 modification is established by the college governing board.
- 25 Sec. 210. The appropriations made and the expenditures authorized
- 26 under this act and the departments, agencies, commissions, boards,
- 27 offices, and programs for which an appropriation is made under this act
- 28 are subject to the management and budget act, Act No. 431 of the Public
- 29 Acts of 1984, being sections 18.1101 to 18.1594 of the Michigan Compiled
- 30 Laws.

- Sec. 211. Each community college shall report to the department of
- 2 education, the house and senate appropriations committees, and the house
- 3 and senate fiscal agencies, the numbers and type of associate degrees and
- 4 other certificates awarded during the previous fiscal year. The report
- 5 shall be made not later than November 15 of each year.
- 6 Sec. 212. Each community college shall submit the following
- 7 information relating to the community college to the civil rights
- 8 commission and the house and senate appropriations subcommittees on
- 9 community colleges in a format established by the department of civil
- 10 rights and the community colleges that incorporates the requirements of
- 11 state and federal law:
- 12 (a) An affirmative action plan for employment of minorities, women,
- and handicappers, including the plan requirements set forth in executive
- 14 directive 1979-4.
- 15 (b) A statistical report for minorities and women employees for the
- 16 most recent school year as submitted to the federal government on the EEO-
- 17 6 form.
- 18 (c) A statistical report for the most recent school year that includes
- 19 enrollment statistics for minorities and women as submitted to the
- 20 department of education.
- 21 Sec. 213. (1) Guidelines and procedures developed by the Michigan
- 22 department of education, the Michigan commission on Indian affairs, and
- 23 each state supported community college shall be used to ensure accurate
- 24 and consistent reporting and auditing of North American Indian student
- 25 enrollments. Community college financial aid programs shall comply with
- 26 all of the quidelines and procedures developed pursuant to this section.
- 27 (2) As used in this section, "North American Indian" means a person
- 28 who is not less than 1/4 quantum blood Indian as certified by the person's
- 29 tribal association.
- 30 Sec. 214. For the fiscal year beginning October 1, 1996, community

- 1 colleges shall systematically inform Michigan high schools of the
- 2 aggregate academic status of students in a manner prescribed by the
- 3 Michigan community college association and in cooperation with the
- 4 Michigan association of secondary school principals.

5 STATE AID-OPERATIONS

- 6 Sec. 301. Unless otherwise stated, all data items used in determining
- 7 state aid in this act are as defined in the Michigan Public Community
- 8 Colleges Manual for Uniform Financial Reporting, 1981, as revised, which
- 9 shall be the basis for reporting data, and the Michigan Community Colleges
- 10 Activities Classification Structure, 1981, as revised, which shall be used
- 11 to document financial needs of the community colleges.
- 12 Sec. 302. A community college shall not include in the enrollment
- 13 report any student credit hours or student contact hours for a student
- 14 taking a college course to complete high school graduation requirements
- 15 or generated by a student incarcerated in Michigan penal institutions.
- 16 Exclusion of these students is intended to avoid the payment of state aid
- 17 under this act for the same individuals for whom a community college has
- 18 already been reimbursed under the state school aid act of 1979, Act No.
- 19 94 of the Public Acts of 1979, being sections 388.1601 to 388.1772 of the
- 20 Michigan Compiled Laws, for completion of high school requirements or for
- 21 whom reimbursement is provided by the state correctional system.

22 GRANTS

- 23 Sec. 401. (1) The community college at risk student success program
- 24 is continued. The funding shall be prorated among community colleges
- 25 based on the number of student contact hours for developmental and
- 26 preparatory instruction reported by each community college to the
- 27 department of education for use in the Michigan Community Colleges
- 28 Activities Classification Structure, 1981, as revised. Of the amount
- 29 appropriated in section 101 for the at risk student success program,
- 30 \$1,120,000.00 shall be allocated for base grants of \$40,000.00 each, to

- 1 address the special needs of at risk students at community colleges.
- 2 (2) Of the amount appropriated in section 101 for the at risk student
- 3 success program, the balance of the appropriated funds shall
- 4 distributed on a prorated basis utilizing the sum of the most recent 3
- 5 years developmental/preparatory contact hours divided by the sum of the
- 6 3-year total contact hours at each college. Each community college's
- 7 percentage shall be divided by the sum of all such percentages system wide
- 8 to obtain each community college's prorated grant amount.
- 9 (3) For the fiscal year ending September 30, 1997, the at risk student

success program funds shall be allocated as follows: 10

- 9 (4) For the purposes of this section, "at risk students" means
 10 students who meet 1 or more of the following criteria:
- 11 (a) Are initially placed in 1 or more developmental courses as a 12 result of standardized testing or as a result of failure to make 13 satisfactory academic progress.
- 14 (b) Are diagnosed as learning disabled.
- 15 (c) Require English as a second language (ESL) assistance.
- (5) Grant funding under this section shall be used only for the acquisition, enhancement, or upgrade of equipment and software related to telecommunications, computers or computer systems, or other technologies for use by students, faculty, or administrators or for activities related to services provided to at risk students. Activities related to services provided to at risk students. Activities related to provided to at risk students include, but are not limited to, pretesting for academic ability, counseling contacts, and special programs.
- 23 (6) Grant funding under this section shall not be used for indirect 24 costs including, but not limited to, rent, utilities, or, except as 25 provided in this section, college administration.
- 26 (7) Each community college shall report to the house and senate 27 appropriations subcommittees on community colleges, the house and senate 28 fiscal agencies, and the director of the department of management and 29 budget, a summary of all accomplishments under, expenditures for, and 30 compliance with the intent of this program, including the number of at

- 1 risk students served. The report is subject to audit as provided for in
- 2 section 204(1). The report shall be submitted not later than 90 days
- 3 after the end of the state's fiscal year.
- 4 (8) Each community college receiving grant funds under this section
- 5 shall, not more than 12 months after receipt of those funds, return to the
- 6 department of management and budget all the grant funds that are not
- 7 expended or encumbered. Those funds not expended or encumbered shall
- 8 lapse to the general fund.
- 9 Sec. 402. If the Michigan college tuition and fees credit, section
- 10 274 of Act No. 281 of the Public Acts of 1967, as added by Act No. 7 of
- 11 the Public Acts of 1995, being section 206.274 of the Michigan compiled
- 12 laws, is repealed effective for the 1996 tax year, an additional
- \$5,635,588.00 is appropriated from general fund-general purpose revenues
- 14 to be allocated to public community colleges for the fiscal year ending
- 15 September 30, 1997, to be distributed as provided in sections 403 and 404.
- Sec. 403. (1) An allocation of \$400,000.00 from the contingent
- 17 appropriation in section 402 shall be used for the continuous quality
- 18 improvement initiative to permit the state's public community colleges to
- 19 review quality management practices. The grant is appropriated to a
- 20 consortium of Michigan community colleges to be selected jointly by the
- 21 director of the department of management and budget and the superintendent
- 22 of public instruction, with the advice of the chairs of the house and
- 23 senate appropriation committees or their designees. The grants allocated
- 24 under this section shall be administered by a consortium of Michigan
- 25 community colleges.
- 26 (2) Of the funding in section 402 for the continuous quality
- 27 improvement initiative, \$15,000.00 shall be allocated for an expert peer
- 28 review panel. The funding may be used for costs associated with the
- 29 panel's work including, but not limited to, travel and lodging expenses
- 30 for panel members. The funds may be used for per diem payments to panel

- 1 members at a rate determined appropriate by the department of management
- 2 and budget. This panel shall be composed of the following:
- 3 (a) Community college executives from outside Michigan who have
- 4 substantial practical experience initiating total quality management
- 5 practices.
- 6 (b) Private sector management executives who have substantial
- 7 practical experience initiating total quality management practices.
- 8 (3) The expert peer review panel shall review grant applications made
- 9 to the administering consortium under this section and recommend to the
- 10 consortium grants for experienced institutions, evolving institutions, and
- 11 staff development. The panel shall also evaluate the programs and
- 12 practices funded under this section and shall report to the department of
- 13 management and budget and the house and senate appropriations
- 14 subcommittees on community colleges its findings and recommendations.
- 15 (4) To receive a grant under this section, an experienced institution
- 16 shall apply to the administering consortium to expand its current
- 17 continuous quality management practices and to develop a mentoring
- 18 resource base for evolving institutions. No more than 3 grants, not to
- 19 exceed \$50,000.00 each, shall be made to experienced institutions under
- 20 this subsection. If less than 3 grants are awarded under this section,
- 21 the remaining funding shall be used to increase the number of evolving
- 22 institutions receiving grants under subsection (5).
- 23 (5) To receive a grant under this section, an evolving institution
- 24 shall apply to the administering consortium for a grant to initiate
- 25 continuous quality management practices. No more than 5 grants, not to
- 26 exceed \$40,000.00 each, shall be made to evolving institutions.
- 27 (6) Each institution receiving a grant under subsection (4) or (5) is
- 28 also eligible to receive a staff development grant. Total funding for
- 29 staff development grants shall not exceed \$25,000.00. Of this funding,
- 30 50% shall be used for cooperative staff development activities among the

- 1 experienced institutions and evolving institutions.
- 2 (7) Of the appropriation in section 101 for the continuous quality 3 improvement initiative, not more than \$10,000.00 may be used by the
- 4 consortium of community colleges to administer this program. The
- 5 administering consortium shall convene such meetings of the expert review
- 6 panel as necessary to carry out the requirements of this section and
- 7 coordinate the staff development efforts under subsection (6). This
- 8 funding may be used for costs associated with soliciting grant proposals,
- 9 the production of all relevant and required written materials, and the
- 10 meetings of the expert peer review panel. The administering consortium
- 11 shall not include general management costs in the administration of this
- 12 program and shall keep such records of activities and expenditures
- 13 associated with the administration of this grant program as required by
- 14 the department of management and budget.
- 15 (8) As used in this section:
- 16 (a) "Experienced institutions" means those colleges that demonstrate
- 17 to the expert review panel that they have had substantial experience with
- a quality management program that is referred to in management literature
- 19 as "total quality management" or "continuous quality improvement"
- 20 (b) "Evolving institutions" means those colleges that demonstrate to
- 21 the expert review panel little or no experience with a quality management
- 22 program described in subdivision (a) but demonstrate an interest and
- 23 commitment to initiate a program.
- Sec. 404. From the \$5,635,588.00 contingency appropriation in section
- 25 402, \$5,235,588.00 shall be allocated as provided in this section. Th
- 26 allocations shall be computed on the basis of a distribution of 75% of the
- funds on an across the board basis, and 25% by using the Gast-Mathieu
- 28 formula. The resulting allocations are as follows:
