HOUSE BILL No. 5957

June 7, 1996, Introduced by Rep. Jaye and referred to the Committee on Local Government.

A bill to amend section 761 of Act No. 116 of the Public Acts of 1954, entitled as amended

"Michigan election law,"

as amended by Act No. 261 of the Public Acts of 1995, being section 168.761 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Section 1. Section 761 of Act No. 116 of the Public Acts of
 1954, as amended by Act No. 261 of the Public Acts of 1995, being
 section 168.761 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is amended to read
 as follows:

5 Sec. 761. (1) If the clerk of a city, township, or village 6 receives an application for an absent voter ballot from a person 7 registered to vote in that city, township, or village and if the 8 signature on the application agrees with the signature on the 9 registration card, the clerk immediately upon receipt of the

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1 application or, if the application is received before the 2 printing of the absent voter ballots, as soon as the ballots are 3 received by the clerk, shall forward by mail, postage prepaid, or 4 shall deliver personally 1 of the ballots or set of ballots if 5 there is more than 1 kind of ballot to be voted to the 6 applicant. Absent voter ballots may be delivered to an applicant 7 OR TO A MEMBER OF THE APPLICANT'S IMMEDIATE FAMILY IF THE APPLI-8 CANT IS 60 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER in person at the office of the 9 clerk.

10 (2) Notwithstanding section 759, providing that no absent II voter applications shall be received by the clerk after 2 p.m. on 12 the Saturday before the election, a person gualified to vote as 13 an absent voter may apply in person at the clerk's office before 14 4 p.m. on a day preceding the election except Sunday or a legal 15 holiday to vote as an absent voter. The applicant shall receive 16 his or her absent voter ballot and vote the ballot in the clerk's 17 office. All other absent voter ballots, except ballots delivered 18 pursuant to an emergency absent voter ballot application under 19 section 759b, shall be mailed or delivered to the registration 20 address of the applicant unless the application requests delivery 21 to an address outside the city, village, or township or to a hos-22 pital or similar institution, in which case the absent voter bal-23 lots shall be mailed or delivered to the address given in the 24 application. However, a clerk may mail or deliver an absent 25 voter ballot, upon request of the absent voter, to a post office 26 box if the post office box is where the absent voter normally

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1 receives personal mail and the absent voter does not receive mail
2 at his or her registration address.

3 (3) Absent voter ballots shall be issued in the same order 4 in which applications are received by the clerk of a city, town-5 ship, or village, as nearly as may be, and each ballot issued 6 shall bear the lowest number of each kind available for this 7 purpose. However, this provision does not prohibit a clerk from 8 immediately issuing an absent voter ballot to an absent voter who 9 applies in person in the clerk's office for absent voter 10 ballots. The clerk shall enclose with the ballot or ballots a 11 return envelope properly addressed to the clerk and bearing upon 12 the back of the envelope a printed statement in substantially the 13 following form:

WARNING

PERSONS WHO CAN LEGALLY BE IN POSSESSION OF AN ABSENT VOTER BALLOT ISSUED TO AN ABSENT VOTER ARE LIMITED TO THE ABSENT VOTER; A PERSON WHO IS A MEMBER OF THE ABSENT VOTER'S IMMEDIATE FAMILY A OR RESIDES IN THE ABSENT VOTER'S HOUSEHOLD AND WHO HAS BEEN ASKED BY THE ABSENT VOTER TO RETURN THE BALLOT; A PERSON WHOSE JOB IT BY THE ABSENT VOTER TO RETURN THE BALLOT; A PERSON WHOSE JOB IT BY THE ABSENT VOTER, DURING, OR AFTER BEING TRANSPORTED BY A PUBLIC POSTAL SERVICE, EXPRESS MAIL SERVICE, PARCEL POST SERVICE, BOR COMMON CARRIER, BUT ONLY DURING THE NORMAL COURSE OF HIS OR HER EMPLOYMENT; AND THE CLERK, ASSISTANTS OF THE CLERK, AND OTHER AUTHORIZED ELECTION OFFICIALS OF THE CITY, TOWNSHIP, VILLAGE, OR SCHOOL DISTRICT. ANY OTHER PERSON IN POSSESSION OF AN ABSENT VOTER BALLOT IS GUILTY OF A FELONY.

(4) An absent voter who knowingly makes a false statement on
the absent voter ballot return envelope is guilty of a
misdemeanor. A person who assists an absent voter and who knowingly makes a false statement on the absent voter ballot return
envelope is guilty of a felony.

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
