

HOUSE BILL No. 6066

September 12, 1996, Introduced by Reps. Bush, Lowe, DeMars, Ryan and LaForge and referred to the Committee on Senior Citizens and Veterans Affairs.

A bill to require those state agencies and departments administering federally or state funded employment services or job training programs to give priority to certain veterans and certain other persons; and to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state agencies and departments.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
- 2 "veteran right to employment services act".
- 3 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- 4 (a) "Armed forces" means the army, air force, navy, marine
- 5 corps, coast guard, or other military force designated by con-
- 6 gress as a part of the armed forces of the United States.
- 7 (b) "Disabled veteran" means a person who is not a special
- 8 disabled veteran and who is either of the following:

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- 1 (i) A veteran entitled to, or who but for the receipt of
- 2 military retirement pay would be entitled to, compensation under
- 3 laws administered by the United States department of veteran
- 4 affairs.
- 5 (ii) A veteran who was discharged or released from active
- 6 duty because of a service connected disability.
- 7 (c) "Employment services" means referrals to employers, sup-
- 8 portive services, or assistance in finding employment training.
- 9 (d) "Job training services" means any program that provides
- 10 training or training services to eligible applicants.
- (e) "Other eligible person" means the spouse or dependent
- 12 child of a person in the armed forces, if the person in the armed
- 13 forces was or is any of the following:
- 14 (i) A veteran who has a permanent and total service con-
- 15 nected disability, or who died of a service connected disability,
- 16 or who died while in the armed forces or while the disability was
- 17 in existence.
- (ii) Described in section 55! of chapter 10 of title 37 of
- 19 the United States Code, 37 U.S.C. 551, as being 1 or more of the
- 20 following:
- 21 (A) Missing.
- 22 (B) Missing in action.
- (C) Captured, beleaguered, or besieged by a hostile force.
- 24 (D) Interned in a foreign country.
- 25 (E) Detained in a foreign country against his or her will.
- (f) "Other veteran" means a veteran not classified as a
- 27 Vietnam era veteran or a recently separated veteran.

- 1 (g) "Recently separated veteran" means a veteran who did
 2 each of the following:
- 3 (i) Served in the armed forces for a period of more than 90
 4 days.
- 5 (ii) Separated from the armed services without a dishonor-6 able discharge.
- 7 (h) "Special disabled veteran" means either of the 8 following:
- 9 (i) A veteran who is entitled to, or who but for the receipt
 10 of military pay would be entitled to, compensation under any law
 11 administered by the United States department of veteran affairs
 12 for a disability rated by that department at 30% or more.
- (ii) A veteran determined under section 3106 of title 38 of the United States Code, 38 U.S.C. 3106, to have a serious employ15 ment handicap, and who is entitled to, or who but for the receipt of military pay would be entitled to, compensation under any law administered by the United States department of military affairs for a disability rated by that department at 10% to 20%.
- (i) "Veteran" means any of the following:
- (i) A person who served on active duty in the armed forcesfor a period of more than 90 days and separated from the armedservices in a manner other than a dishonorable discharge.
- (ii) A person discharged or released from active dutybecause of a service related disability.
- 25 (iii) A member of a reserve branch of the armed forces at
 26 the time he or she was ordered to active duty pursuant to
 27 section 672(a), (d), or (g), or sections 673 or 673b of title 10

- 1 of the United States Code, 10 U.S.C. 672, 673, and 673b, who
- 2 served on active duty during a period of war, or in a campaign or
- 3 expedition for which a campaign badge is authorized, and was
- 4 released from active duty in a manner other than a dishonorable
- 5 discharge.
- 6 (j) "Vietnam era veteran" means a veteran who served on
- 7 active duty in the armed forces at any time between August 5,
- 8 1964 and May 7, 1975.
- 9 Sec. 3. A state agency or department that administers a
- 10 federally or state funded employment services or job training
- 11 program, including a service or program administered under the
- 12 job training partnership act, Public Law 97-300, 96 Stat. 1322,
- 13 shall, to the extent permitted by federal law and in the manner
- 14 described in section 4, give priority to a candidate for a pro-
- 15 gram or a qualified service who is any of the following:
- 16 (a) A special disabled veteran.
- (b) A Vietnam era veteran.
- 18 (c) A disabled veteran who is not a special disabled
- 19 veteran.
- 20 (d) A recently separated veteran.
- (e) Any other veteran.
- (f) Any other eligible person.
- Sec. 4. The state agency or department that administers
- 24 employment services or job training services as described in sec-
- 25 tion 3 shall do each of the following:

- 1 (a) Provide to persons described in section 3 priority in
- 2 employment services and job training services available from that
- 3 agency or department over other candidates for those services.
- 4 (b) Provide to a person described in section 3 referral
- 5 assistance and a pamphlet prepared by the state agencies or
- 6 departments that administer employment services and job training
- 7 services that identifies employment services and job training
- 8 benefits and services available to that person through other
- 9 agencies or departments.
- (c) Prepare and submit to the speaker of the house of repre-
- 11 sentatives and the majority leader of the senate and to the house
- 12 and senate committees on military affairs an annual written
- 13 report separately identifying each of the following:
- 14 (i) Each employment service or job training service or pro-
- 15 gram provided by that agency or department to persons described
- 16 in section 3.
- 17 (ii) The procedures employed by that agency or department to
- 18 ensure compliance with this act.
