

# HOUSE BILL No. 6176

November 12, 1996. Introduced by Rep. Profit and referred to the Committee on Judiciary and Civil Rights.

A bill to amend section 2 of chapter VI of Act No. 3 of the Public Acts of 1895, entitled as amended

"The general law village act,"

as amended by Act No. 41 of the Public Acts of 1996, being section 66.2 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Section 1. Section 2 of chapter VI of Act No. 3 of the
 Public Acts of 1895, as amended by Act No. 41 of the Public Acts
 of 1996, being section 66.2 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is
 amended to read as follows:

### CHAPTER VI

6 Sec. 2. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this act, the 7 council of a village authorized to pass an ordinance may 8 prescribe a sanction for a violation of the ordinance. If a 9 sanction is prescribed, it shall be prescribed in the ordinance.

(2) Consistent with any of the following statutes, the
 village council may adopt an ordinance that designates a viola tion of the ordinance as a civil infraction and provides a civil
 fine for that violation:

8 (b) Act No. 235 of the Public Acts of 1969, being

12 (3) The village council may adopt an ordinance that desig-13 nates a violation of the ordinance as a municipal civil infrac-14 tion and provides a civil fine for that violation. An ordinance 15 may not designate a violation as a municipal civil infraction if 16 that violation may be designated as a civil infraction under 17 subsection (2). A statute may provide that a violation of a spe-18 cific type of ordinance is a municipal civil infraction whether 19 or not the ordinance designates the violation as a municipal 20 civil infraction.

21 (4) An ordinance shall not make an act or omission a munici-22 pal civil infraction if that act or omission constitutes a crime 23 under any of the following:

(a) Article 7 or section 17766a of the public health code,

26 to 333.7545 and 333.17766a of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

1 (5) An ordinance not described in subsection (2) or (3) may 2 provide that a person who violates the ordinance is subject to 3 either, or both, of the following: (a) Punishment VIOLATION OF 4 THE ORDINANCE IS PUNISHABLE by imprisonment for not more than 5 -90- 93 days or by a fine of not more than \$500.00, or both.
