



SENATE BILL No. 813

January 17, 1996, Introduced by Senators SHUGARS and STEIL and referred to the Committee on Health Policy and Senior Citizens.

A bill to amend section 4 of Act No. 323 of the Public Acts of 1978, entitled as amended "Michigan health planning and health policy development act," being section 325.2004 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Section 1. Section 4 of Act No. 323 of the Public Acts of
2 1978, being section 325.2004 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, is
3 amended to read as follows:

4 Sec. 4. (1) "Health service area" means an area designated
5 by the secretary pursuant to FORMER section 1511 of title ~~15~~ XV
6 of the public health ~~services~~ SERVICE act, ~~42 U.S.C. 3001,~~
7 as a health service area.

8 (2) "Health systems agency" means a conditionally or fully
9 designated health systems agency for a health service area within
10 this state designated pursuant to section 1515 of title ~~15~~ XV

1 of the public health ~~services~~ SERVICE act. ~~, 42 U.S.C.~~

3 (3) "Health systems plan" means a plan developed by a health
4 systems agency pursuant to section 1513(b)(2) of title ~~15~~ XV of
5 the public health ~~services~~ SERVICE act. ~~, 42 U.S.C. 3001-2.~~

6 (4) "Institutional health services" means the health serv-
7 ices provided through health care facilities and health mainte-
8 nance organizations as defined under section 1122 of PART A OF
9 TITLE XI OF the social security act, 42 U.S.C. 1320a-1, ~~or under~~
10 ~~the state certificate of need program under Act No. 256 of the~~
11 ~~Public Acts of 1972, as amended, being sections 331.451 to~~
12 ~~331.462 of the Michigan Compiled Laws,~~ and includes the entities
13 in or through which those services are provided. The term does
14 not include a Christian science sanatorium operated, or listed
15 and certified, by the first church of Christ ~~,~~ scientist,
16 Boston, Massachusetts.

17 Section 2. This amendatory act shall not take effect unless
