A SUMMARY OF HOUSE BILLS 4779-4781 AS INTRODUCED 5-14-97

The bills would, in general, require health insurers to allow a female enrollee or member to designate a participating obstetrician-gynecologist as her primary care provider for those insurance plans that require enrollees or members to designate participating primary care providers, or to allow a female enrollee or member to see a participating obstetrician-gynecologist without prior authorization or referral, or both. Further, notice of an enrollee's or member's right to designate an obstetrician-gynecologist as a primary care provider or to have access to one without a prior authorization or referral would have to be included in communications sent to the individual or group purchaser of the coverage. The bills would take effect June 1, 1997.

<u>House Bill 4779</u> would amend the Public Health Code (MCL 333.21053d) to apply to group and individual contracts of health maintenance organizations (HMOs). <u>House Bill 4780</u> would amend the Insurance Code (MCL 500.3406j) to apply to expense-incurred hospital, medical, or surgical policies and certificates of commercial health insurance companies. <u>House Bill 4781</u> would amend the Nonprofit Health Care Corporation Reform Act (MCL 550.401f) to apply to group and nongroup certificates of Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Michigan.
