SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 5280

A bill to prohibit the switching of a customer's telecommunications provider without the authorization of the customer; to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state agencies and officials; and to provide for penalties.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
- 2 "Michigan slamming prohibition act".
- 3 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- 4 (a) "Commission" means the Michigan public service commis-
- 5 sion in the department of consumer and industry services.
- 6 (b) "Customer" means a person to whom telecommunications
- 7 services are furnished.
- 8 (c) "Person" means an individual, corporation, partnership,
- 9 association, governmental entity, or any other legal entity.

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- 1 (d) "Telecommunications provider" or "provider" means a
- 2 person that provides 1 or more telecommunications services for
- 3 compensation.
- 4 (e) "Telecommunications services" or "services" includes
- 5 regulated and unregulated intrastate services offered to custom-
- 6 ers for the transmission of 2-way, interactive communications and
- 7 associated usage.
- 8 Sec. 3. (1) A customer of a telecommunications provider
- 9 shall not be switched to another provider without the authoriza-
- 10 tion of the customer.
- 11 (2) The commission shall promulgate rules to ensure that a
- 12 customer of a telecommunications provider is not switched to
- 13 another provider without the customer's oral authorization, writ-
- 14 ten confirmation, or confirmation through an independent third
- 15 party of the customer's intent to make a switch and has approved
- 16 the specific details of the switch. The rules promulgated under
- 17 this act shall require that all providers comply with the regula-
- 18 tions established by the federal communications commission on
- 19 verification procedures for the switching of a customer's tele-
- 20 communications provider.
- 21 Sec. 4. (1) A customer who has been switched to another
- 22 provider in violation of this act, a provider who has been
- 23 removed as a customer's provider without the customer's authori-
- 24 zation, or the commission on its own motion may file a complaint
- 25 with the commission under this act.

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- (2) Hearings held under this act shall be held in the same
- 2 manner as a proceeding under section 203 of the Michigan
- 3 telecommunications act, 1991 PA 179, MCL 484.2203.
- (3) If after notice and hearing the commission finds that a
- 5 person has violated this act or a rule promulgated under this
- 6 act, the commission shall order remedies and penalties to protect
- 7 and make whole customers and other persons who have suffered dam-
- 8 ages as a result of the violation, including, but not limited to,
- 9 1 or more of the following:
- 10 (a) The person to pay a fine for the first offense of not
- 11 less than \$1,000.00 or more than \$20,000.00 per day that the
- 12 person is in violation of this act. For the second and any sub-
- 13 sequent offense, to pay a fine of not less than \$2,000.00 or more
- 14 than \$40,000.00 per day that the person is in violation of this
- **15** act.
- 16 (b) A refund to the customer of any collected excessive
- 17 rates.
- 18 (c) If the person is a licensee under the Michigan telecom-
- 19 munications act, 1991 PA 179, MCL 484.2101 to 484.2604, that the
- 20 person's license may be revoked for a pattern of violations of
- 21 this act.
- (d) Cease and desist orders. 22
