HOUSE BILL NO. 4394

(As passed the House, April 20, 1999)

(As amended May 18, 1999)

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled
"Natural resources and environmental protection act,"
(MCL 324.101 to 324.90106) by adding sections 81140a and 82147a.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 SEC. 81140A. (1) IF THE OPERATOR'S OR CHAUFFEUR'S LICENSE
2 OF A PERSON WHO IS A RESIDENT OF THIS STATE IS SUSPENDED OR
3 REVOKED BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE UNDER THE MICHIGAN VEHICLE
4 CODE, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.1 TO 257.923, OR IF THE DRIVER LICENSE
5 OF A PERSON WHO IS A NONRESIDENT IS SUSPENDED OR REVOKED UNDER
6 THE LAW OF THE STATE IN WHICH HE OR SHE RESIDES, THAT PERSON
7 SHALL NOT OPERATE AN ORV UNDER THIS PART FOR THE SAME PERIOD.
8 (2) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS SECTION IS GUILTY OF A MISDE-
9 MEANOR PUNISHABLE AS FOLLOWS:
10 (A) FOR A FIRST CONVICTION, IMPRISONMENT FOR NOT MORE THAN
11 93 DAYS OR A FINE OF NOT MORE THAN \$500.00, OR BOTH.

8 OF A PERSON WHO IS A NONRESIDENT IS SUSPENDED OR REVOKED UNDER

14 (A) FOR A FIRST CONVICTION, IMPRISONMENT FOR NOT MORE THAN
15 93 DAYS OR A FINE OF NOT MORE THAN \$500.00, OR BOTH.

16 (B) FOR A SECOND OR SUBSEQUENT CONVICTION, IMPRISONMENT FOR
17 NOT MORE THAN 180 DAYS OR A FINE OF NOT MORE THAN \$1,000.00, OR
18 BOTH.
