## SENATE BILL NO. 683

September 21, 1999, Introduced by Senator JAYE and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

A bill to amend 1961 PA 236, entitled

"Revised judicature act of 1961,"

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 8391. (1) With the approval of the governing body of a district control unit, the district court may establish within the court a traffic bureau <u>which</u> THAT may be administered by clerks or other personnel of the district court to accept, as authorized by the judges of the district, admissions <u>for civil</u> infractions under Act No. 300 of the Public Acts of 1949, as mended, being sections 257.1 to 257.923 of the Michigan Compiled <u>B Laws, or a local ordinance corresponding thereto</u>, and to collect 1 civil fines and costs as prescribed by the judges of the district
2 — FOR THE FOLLOWING CIVIL INFRACTIONS:

3 (A) CIVIL INFRACTIONS UNDER THE MICHIGAN VEHICLE CODE, 1949
4 PA 300, MCL 257.1 TO 257.923, OR A CORRESPONDING LOCAL
5 ORDINANCE.

6 (B) STATE CIVIL INFRACTIONS UNDER PART 801 OF THE NATURAL
7 RESOURCES AND ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION ACT, 1994 PA 451, MCL
8 324.80101 TO 324.80199H.

9 (2) Beginning August 1, 1979, a traffic bureau ESTABLISHED

(3) SUBJECT TO SUPREME COURT SUPERVISION, THE presiding
judge of the A district , subject to the supervision of the
supreme court, shall have HAS authority over the personnel OF A
TRAFFIC BUREAU ESTABLISHED UNDER SUBSECTION (1) and SHALL determine the location and number of traffic bureau offices IN THAT
DISTRICT.

(4) Appeals as of right may be taken from the AN APPEAL
 FROM A DECISION OF A traffic bureau ESTABLISHED UNDER SUBSECTION
 (1) MAY BE TAKEN AS OF RIGHT to the district court. Appeals
 shall be taken within 7 days after the entry of the civil infrac tion admission and shall be heard de novo.

6 Sec. 8511. A district court magistrate shall have HAS the
7 following jurisdiction and duties:

8 (a) To arraign and sentence upon pleas of guilty or nolo
9 contendere for violations of the following acts or parts of acts,
10 or a local ordinance substantially corresponding to these acts or
11 parts of acts, when IF authorized by the chief judge of the

18 (c) To fix bail and accept bond in all cases.

19 (d) To issue A search warrants WARRANT, when IF autho20 rized to do so by a district court judge.

Sec. 8512. (1) A district court magistrate may hear and preside over civil infraction admissions and admissions with explanation and conduct informal hearings in civil infraction actions pursuant to section 746 of the Michigan vehicle code, Act No. 300 of the Public Acts of 1949, being section 257.746 of the Michigan Compiled Laws 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.746, section 8719, or section 8819, as applicable. 1 authority conferred by this subsection, the magistrate may 2 administer oaths, examine witnesses, and make findings of fact 3 and conclusions of law. If the defendant is determined to be 4 responsible for a civil infraction, the magistrate may impose the 5 civil sanctions authorized by section 907 of <u>Act No. 300 of the</u> 6 Public Acts of 1949, being section 257.907 of the Michigan 7 Compiled Laws THE MICHIGAN VEHICLE CODE, 1949 PA 300, MCL 8 257.907, section 8727, or section 8827, as applicable.
