## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 5 have provisions for written and practical examinations and shall

- 4 (2) THE SAFE MICHIGAN FUND IS CREATED WITHIN THE STATE

- 16 MENT OF CONSUMER AND INDUSTRY SERVICES SHALL EXPEND MONEY FROM
- 17 THE FUND, UPON APPROPRIATION, ONLY FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING
- 18 ADDITIONAL EDUCATION AND TRAINING FOR EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES
- 19 PERSONNEL.
