## CHAPTER IV

2 Sec. 1e. (1) For purposes of sections 1a to 1d of this 3 chapter, a complaint signed by a peace officer shall be treated 4 as made under oath if the offense alleged in the complaint is a 5 misdemeanor or ordinance violation for which the maximum permis-6 sible penalty does not exceed 93 days in jail or a fine, or both, 7 that was committed in the signing officer's presence or that was 8 committed under circumstances permitting the officer's issuance 9 of a citation under section 625a or 728(8) of the Michigan 10 vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.625a and 257.728, OR UNDER

1 SECTION 80180 OF THE NATURAL RESOURCES AND ENVIRONMENTAL
