A bill to amend 1927 PA 175, entitled "The code of criminal procedure,"

by amending section 26a of chapter XIV and section 6 of chapter XVI (MCL 774.26a and 776.6), section 26a of chapter XIV as amended by 1980 PA 506.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 CHAPTER XIV

- 2 Sec. 26a. (1) The county treasurer shall provide a munici-
- 3 pal court within the county with blank forms which have been
- 4 approved by the auditor general STATE TREASURER. The forms
- ${f 5}$ shall provide space for recording the following information with
- 6 respect to all sums of money which the municipal court receives
- 7 in a criminal case on account of any forfeiture of bail, bond,
- 8 recognizance, fine, penalty, or taxation of costs:

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- 1 (a) Receipt number.
- 2 (b) Docket number.
- 3 (c) Nature of offense.
- 4 (d) Amount of the fine.
- 5 (e) Amount of statutory court fees.
- 6 (f) Officers' fees.
- 7 (g) Other receipts, including a forfeitured bond.
- 8 (h) Total receipts.
- **9** (i) Disposition of the case.
- 10 (j) Name of defendant.
- 11 (k) The name of the municipal judge.
- 12 (l) The name of the city.
- 13 (2) Each municipal judge shall complete the forms and shall
- 14 furnish 1 copy to the county treasurer, and 1 copy either to the
- 15 county clerk or to the controller or board of auditors, in coun-
- 16 ties having a controller or board of auditors, and shall retain 1
- 17 completed form for the municipal court files.

- 19 Sec. 6. The governor of this state may in any case autho-
- 20 rized by the constitution and laws of the United States, appoint
