4	elected. Nominations and elections for commissioners shall be by
5	partisan elections. To obtain the printing of the name of any
6	person as a candidate for nomination for the office of commis-
7	sioner upon the official primary ballot there shall be filed with

The deadline for filing 7 nomination petitions or filing fees shall be the same as candi-8 dates for state representative.
