SUBSTITUTE FOR

HOUSE BILL NO. 5966

A bill to amend 1972 PA 251, entitled

"An act to provide for the reciprocal exchange of educational services between this state and other states; to provide for reduced or waived tuition, and to designate the state agency for negotiating agreements,"

by amending sections 1, 3, and 4 (MCL 390.501, 390.503, and 390.504).

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. As used in this act, "reciprocal agreement" means a
- 2 contractual arrangement permitting resident students of a
- 3 designated state to be admitted to a public institution of higher
- 4 education in another state at an agreed tuition rate less than
- 5 normally charged nonresident students of that state. The term
- 6 includes a contractual arrangement that renews or extends an
- 7 existing reciprocal agreement.
- 8 Sec. 3. (1) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the
- 9 contrary, a reciprocal agreement may include provisions for the

- 1 reduction or waiver of nonresident tuition and fees for residents
- 2 of the states of Wisconsin, Illinois, Indiana, and Ohio and the
- 3 Province of Ontario admitted to designated public institutions of
- 4 higher education in this state and for the designation of
- 5 categories of students to be admitted to specific educational
- 6 programs or courses of study.
- 7 (2) A reciprocal agreement shall not contain a provision
- 8 establishing an indefinite term for the agreement or establishing
- 9 a fixed term of more than 3 years. If a reciprocal agreement
- 10 provides for renewal or extension of the agreement, that
- 11 provision shall not provide for automatic renewal or extension,
- 12 establish an indefinite term for a renewal or extension, or
- 13 establish a fixed term of more than 3 years for any renewal or
- 14 extension. [The tuition rate for a student attending a public institution of higher education in this state] under a reciprocal agreement shall be
- 15 the rate for in-state, out-of-district students.
- 16 Sec. 4. Reciprocal agreements A reciprocal agreement, or
- 17 a renewal or extension of a reciprocal agreement, entered into by
- 18 the state board of education -are- is not valid until approved by
- 19 the appropriations committees of the house of representatives and
- 20 the senate.
