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SENATE BILL No. 1246

May 18, 2004, Introduced by Senators BROWN, BARCIA, CROPSEY, GEORGE, VAN WOERKOM, BIRKHOLZ, BRATER, CLARKE and BISHOP and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to establish an undergraduate tuition waiver program for children of certain deceased or disabled members of the armed forces of the United States; to provide for the administration of the tuition waiver program; to prescribe certain powers and duties of certain state officers, agencies, and departments; and to repeal acts and parts of acts.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
 "children of veterans tuition act".
 - Sec. 2. As used in this act:
 - (a) "Academic year" means the period from August 1 of a calendar year to July 31 of the next calendar year.
 - (b) "Authority" means the Michigan higher education assistance authority created by 1960 PA 77, MCL 390.951 to 390.961.

- 1 (c) "Eligible institution" means a degree or certificate
- 2 granting public or independent nonprofit college or university,
- 3 junior college, or community college in this state.
- 4 (d) "Eligible tuition" means the tuition charged by an
- 5 eligible institution for an undergraduate class.
- 6 (e) Full-time" means enrolled in at least 12 credit hours in
- 7 an academic semester or its equivalent number of credit hours in
- 8 a term or quarter, as determined by the authority.
- 9 (f) "Michigan veteran" means an individual whose legal
- 10 residence immediately before entering military service was in
- 11 this state and who does not later reside outside of this state
- 12 for a period of more than 2 years, or an individual who
- 13 establishes legal residency in this state after entering military
- 14 service.
- (g) "Undergraduate class" means a class or course that
- 16 provides a student with academic credit applicable toward a
- 17 bachelor or associate degree from an eligible institution.
- 18 Sec. 3. The children of veterans tuition waiver program is
- 19 created, to be administered by the authority. The authority
- 20 shall do all of the following:
- 21 (a) Provide tuition waivers at eligible institutions for
- 22 eligible students under this act.
- 23 (b) Develop a tuition waiver agreement to be entered into by
- 24 a tuition waiver recipient and the eligible institution that
- 25 contains the terms of a tuition waiver made under this act and
- 26 the rights and obligations of the recipient and the eligible
- 27 institution.

- 1 (c) Within 120 days after the effective date of this act,
- 2 notify recipients of benefits under 1935 PA 245, MCL 35.111 to
- 3 35.112, of the repeal of that act and the availability of tuition
- 4 waivers under this act.
- 5 (d) Promulgate rules to implement and administer this act
- 6 under the administrative procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL
- 7 24.201 to 24.328. The rules may include additional standards of
- 8 eligibility for students to receive tuition waivers under this
- 9 act.
- Sec. 4. (1) Beginning in the 2004-2005 academic year, an
- 11 eligible institution that agrees to participate in the tuition
- 12 waiver program established by this act shall waive tuition in an
- 13 amount determined under subsection (2) for any student who meets
- 14 all of the following requirements:
- 15 (a) Is enrolled in that academic year as a full-time student
- 16 in undergraduate classes at an eligible institution.
- 17 (b) Is a United States citizen or permanent resident of the
- 18 United States.
- 19 (c) Is more than 16 and less than 26 years of age.
- 20 (d) Is the natural or adopted child of a Michigan veteran
- 21 and the Michigan veteran meets or met any of the following:
- 22 (i) He or she was killed in action or died from another
- 23 cause while serving in a war or war condition in which the United
- 24 States was or is a participant.
- 25 (ii) The United States department of veterans affairs has
- 26 determined that he or she died or is totally and permanently
- 27 disabled as a result of a service-connected illness or injury.

- 1 (iii) The United States department of veterans affairs has
- 2 determined he or she was permanently and totally disabled as a
- 3 result of a service-connected illness or injury before death, and
- 4 he or she died from any cause.
- 5 (iv) He or she is officially listed by the United States
- 6 government as missing in action in a foreign country.
- 7 (e) Has resided continuously in this state for the 12 months
- 8 immediately preceding the date of his or her application and is
- 9 not a resident of any other state.
- 10 (f) Has maintained a cumulative grade point average of at
- 11 least 2.25 in any undergraduate classes he or she completed at
- 12 any eligible institution in any previous academic years.
- 13 (g) Has signed a written tuition waiver agreement with the
- 14 eligible institution.
- 15 (h) Is in compliance with this act and the rules promulgated
- 16 under this act.
- (i) Has not been convicted of a felony involving an assault,
- 18 physical injury, or death.
- 19 (j) Meets any other standards established in rules
- 20 promulgated by the authority under section 3.
- 21 (2) Except as provided in subsection (3), the amount of a
- 22 tuition waiver described in subsection (1) in an academic year is
- 23 \$2,800.00, or an amount equal to all of the student's eligible
- 24 tuition in that academic year, whichever is less.
- 25 (3) If a student is receiving tuition waiver assistance in
- 26 the 2003-2004 academic year under the tuition waiver program
- 27 provided in 1935 PA 245, MCL 35.111 to 35.112, is a person

- 1 described in section 1(1) of 1935 PA 245, MCL 35.111, and meets
- 2 the eligibility requirements of this act, the amount of the
- 3 tuition waiver for that student in the 2004-2005 academic year is
- 4 an amount equal to the student's eligible tuition in that
- 5 academic year.
- 6 (4) An individual shall not receive tuition waiver
- 7 assistance under this act, or under this act and the tuition
- 8 waiver program provided in 1935 PA 245, MCL 35.111 to 35.112, in
- 9 more than 4 academic years.
- 10 Sec. 5. (1) Beginning in the 2004-2005 academic year,
- 11 within 60 days after the end of an academic year an eligible
- 12 institution shall apply to the authority for reimbursement of
- 13 tuition waived under this act in that academic year. The
- 14 application shall include the total number of students whose
- 15 tuition was waived; the total amount of reimbursement requested
- 16 by the eliqible institution; and an itemization of the waivers
- 17 that includes the name of each student receiving a tuition
- 18 waiver, the amount of that waiver, the student's grade point
- 19 average for the academic year, the student's cumulative grade
- 20 point average, the student's transcript for the academic year,
- 21 and a certification that the student meets the eligibility
- 22 requirements for tuition reimbursement under this act in the
- 23 amount requested by the eligible institution.
- 24 (2) The authority shall verify the amount of reimbursement
- 25 to which an eligible institution is required and report that
- 26 information to the house and senate appropriation subcommittees
- 27 on higher education and community colleges.

- 1 (3) The legislature shall appropriate money for
- 2 reimbursement to the eligible institution if the institution
- 3 receives annual appropriations from this state or to the
- 4 authority for distribution to the eligible institution if the
- 5 institution does not receive annual appropriations from this
- 6 state. Money appropriated under this subsection shall be used
- 7 only for tuition waivers under this act.
- 8 Enacting section 1. 1935 PA 245, MCL 35.111 to 35.112, is
- 9 repealed effective July 31, 2004.

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
