SENATE BILL No. 1458

November 3, 2004, Introduced by Senators BIRKHOLZ, BRATER, ALLEN, BASHAM, McMANUS and JACOBS and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources and Environmental Affairs.

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled "Natural resources and environmental protection act," by amending sections 14701, 14702, 14703, and 14705 (MCL 324.14701, 324.14702, 324.14703, and 324.14705) and by amending the part heading for part 147 and by adding sections 14721, 14722, 14723, and 14724.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

PART 147 - PCB COMPOUNDS - CHEMICAL SUBSTANCES SUBPART 1 PCB COMPOUNDS

Sec. 14701. As used in this part subpart:

(a) "Department" means the department of environmental quality.

6 (b) (a) "PCB" means the class of chlorinated biphenyl,
7 terphenyl, higher polyphenyl, or mixtures of these compounds
8 produced by replacing 2 or more hydrogen atoms on the biphenyl,

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1 terphenyl, or higher polyphenyl molecule with chlorine atoms.
2 PCB does not include chlorinated biphenyls, terphenyls, higher
3 polyphenyls, or mixtures of these compounds that have functional
4 groups attached other than chlorine unless that functional group
5 on the chlorinated biphenyls, terphenyls, higher polyphenyls, or
6 mixtures of these compounds is determined to be dangerous to the
7 public health, safety, and welfare under section 14703.

8 (c) <u>(b)</u> "Ppm" means parts per million.

9 Sec. 14702. The department is responsible for the
10 administration and implementation of this <u>part</u> subpart to
11 protect the public health, safety, and welfare from the toxic
12 effects and environmental dangers of PCB. The department shall
13 promulgate rules to implement and administer this <u>part</u>
14 subpart.

15 Sec. 14703. After receiving a recommendation by affirmative majority vote of a special committee consisting of a 16 representative of the department, the director of -commerce 17 labor and economic growth, and the director of -public - the 18 department of community health, the department shall by rule 19 20 determine, within the concentrations prescribed by this -part subpart, whether the chlorinated biphenyls, terphenyls, higher 21 polyphenyls, or mixtures of these compounds named in the 22 recommendation and having certain functional groups in addition 23 to chlorine attached to the molecule constitute a sufficient 24 danger to the public health, safety, and welfare as to be 25 regulated as a PCB by this <u>part</u> subpart. 26

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Sec. 14705. -(1) A person who violates this part subpart

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1 or a rule promulgated under this <u>part</u> subpart is guilty of a misdemeanor -, punishable by a fine of not less than \$2,500.00 2 or more than \$25,000.00. -(2) Each day that a violation of this 3 -part subpart or a rule promulgated under this -part subpart 4 5 continues shall be considered a separate violation. SUBPART 2 PBDE COMPOUNDS 6 7 Sec. 14721. As used in this subpart: 8 (a) "Department" means the department of environmental 9 quality. 10 (b) "Octa-BDE" means octabromodiphenyl ether. 11 (c) "PBDE" means polybrominated diphenyl ether. 12 (d) "Penta-BDE" means pentabromodiphenyl ether. Sec. 14722. (1) Beginning June 1, 2006, a person shall not 13 manufacture, process, or distribute a product or material that 14 contains more than 1/10 of 1% of penta-BDE or octa-BDE. 15 16 (2) This section does not apply to the processing of recyclables containing penta-BDE or octa-BDE in compliance with 17 applicable federal, state, and local laws. 18 19 Sec. 14723. The department may establish a PBDE advisory 20 committee to assist the department in determining the risk posed by the release of PBDEs, other than penta-BDE or octa-BDE, to 21 human health and the environment. The department shall use 22 existing programs to monitor the presence of PBDEs in the state's 23 environment to determine exposure and risk. If new scientific 24 information gathered by the advisory committee indicates a 25 significant risk to human health and the environment in the 26 27 state, the department shall advise the legislature of the risk.

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Sec. 14724. A person who violates this subpart is guilty of
 a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not less than \$2,500.00 or
 more than \$25,000.00. Each day that a violation of this subpart
 continues shall be considered a separate violation.

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
