SENATE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 5104

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled "Michigan vehicle code,"

by amending section 627 (MCL 257.627), as amended by 2004 PA 62.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 627. (1) A person driving OPERATING a vehicle on a
- 2 highway shall -drive OPERATE THAT VEHICLE at a careful and prudent
- 3 speed not greater than nor less than is reasonable and proper,
- 4 having due regard to the traffic, surface, and width of the highway
- 5 and of any other condition then existing. A person shall not -drive
- 6 OPERATE a vehicle upon a highway at a speed greater than that which
- 7 will permit a stop within the assured, clear distance ahead.
- 8 (2) Subject to subsection (1) and except in those instances
- 9 where a lower speed is specified in this chapter, it is prima facie

- 1 lawful for the driver OPERATOR of a vehicle to drive OPERATE
- 2 THAT VEHICLE at a speed not exceeding the following, except when
- 3 this speed would be unsafe:
- 4 (a) 25 miles an hour on all highways in a business or
- 5 residence district as defined in this act.
- 6 (b) 25 miles an hour in public parks unless a different speed
- 7 is fixed and duly posted.
- 8 (3) It is prima facie unlawful for a person to exceed the
- 9 speed limits prescribed in subsection (2), except as provided in
- **10** section 629.
- 11 (4) The driver of A PERSON OPERATING a vehicle in a mobile
- 12 home park as defined in section 2 of the mobile home commission
- 13 act, 1987 PA 96, MCL 125.2302, shall drive OPERATE THAT VEHICLE
- 14 at a careful and prudent speed, not greater than a speed -which
- 15 THAT is reasonable and proper, having due regard for the traffic,
- 16 surface, width of the roadway, and all other conditions existing,
- 17 and not greater than a speed -which will permit THAT PERMITS a
- 18 stop within the assured clear distance ahead. It is prima facie
- 19 unlawful for the <u>driver</u> OPERATOR of a vehicle to <u>drive</u> OPERATE
- 20 THAT VEHICLE at a speed exceeding 15 miles an hour in a mobile home
- 21 park as defined in section 2 of the mobile home commission act,
- 22 1987 PA 96, MCL 125.2302.
- 23 (5) A person <u>driving</u> **OPERATING** a passenger vehicle drawing
- 24 another vehicle or trailer shall not exceed -a speed of 55 miles
- 25 per hour, unless the vehicle or trailer has 2 wheels or less and
- 26 does not exceed the combined weight of 750 pounds for the vehicle
- 27 or trailer and load, or a trailer coach of not more than 26 feet in

- 1 length with brakes on each wheel and attached to the passenger
- 2 vehicle with an equalizing or stabilizing coupling unit THE POSTED
- 3 SPEED LIMIT.
- 4 (6) A EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN THIS SUBSECTION, A
- 5 truck with a gross weight of 10,000 pounds or more, A TRUCK-
- 6 TRACTOR, a truck-tractor with a SEMI-TRAILER OR trailer, or a
- 7 combination of these vehicles shall not exceed a speed of 55 miles
- 8 per hour on highways, streets, or freeways and shall not exceed a
- 9 speed of 35 miles per hour during the period when reduced loadings
- 10 are being enforced in accordance with this chapter. HOWEVER, A
- 11 TRUCK, A TRUCK-TRACTOR, OR A TRUCK-TRACTOR WITH A SEMI-TRAILER OR
- 12 TRAILER DESCRIBED IN THIS SUBSECTION SHALL NOT EXCEED A SPEED OF 60
- 13 MILES PER HOUR ON A FREEWAY IF THE MAXIMUM SPEED LIMIT ON THAT
- 14 FREEWAY IS 70 MILES PER HOUR.
- 15 (7) A person <u>driving</u> OPERATING a school bus shall not exceed
- 16 the speed of 50 miles per hour.
- 17 (8) The maximum rates of speeds allowed pursuant to UNDER
- 18 this section are subject to the maximum rate established -pursuant
- 19 to UNDER section 629b.
- 20 (9) A person operating a vehicle on a highway, when entering
- 21 and passing through a work zone described -in section 79e(a), or,
- 22 beginning April 8, 2004, described in section 79d(a) where a
- 23 normal lane or part of the lane of traffic has been closed due to
- 24 highway construction, maintenance, or surveying activities, shall
- 25 not exceed a speed of 45 miles per hour unless a different speed
- 26 limit is determined for that work zone by the state transportation
- 27 department, a county road commission, or a local authority. The

- 1 state transportation department, a county road commission, or a
- 2 local authority shall post speed limit signs in each work zone
- 3 described -in section 79e(a), or, beginning April 8, 2004,
- 4 described in section 79d(a) that indicate the speed limit in
- 5 that work zone and shall identify that work zone with any other
- 6 traffic control devices necessary to conform to the Michigan manual
- 7 of uniform traffic control devices. A person shall not exceed a
- 8 speed limit established under this section or a speed limit
- 9 established under section 628 or 629.
- 10 (10) A person who violates this section is responsible for a
- 11 civil infraction.
- 12 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 9 months
- 13 after the date it is enacted into law.
