A bill to amend 1939 PA 280, entitled "The social welfare act,"

by amending sections 14i, 57, 57a, 57d, and 57e (MCL 400.14i, 400.57, 400.57a, 400.57d, and 400.57e), section 14i as amended by 2004 PA 571, section 57 as added by 1995 PA 223, section 57a as amended by 1999 PA 26, and sections 57d and 57e as amended by 2001 PA 280.

- 4 Sec. 57. (1) As used in this section and sections 57a to -57g

- 1 (a) "Adult-supervised household" means either of the
- 2 following:
- 3 (i) The place of residence of a parent, stepparent, or legal
- 4 quardian of a minor parent.
- 5 (ii) A living arrangement not described in subparagraph (i) that

- 14 DEPARTMENT determines is necessary to enable the family to achieve
