HOUSE BILL NO. 6300

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code," by amending section 20950 (MCL 333.20950), as amended by 2000 PA 375.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 20950. (1) An individual shall not practice or advertise
 to practice as a medical first responder, emergency medical
 technician, emergency medical technician specialist, paramedic, or
 emergency medical services instructor-coordinator unless licensed
 to do so by the department.

6 (2) The department shall issue a license under this section
7 only to an individual who meets all of the following requirements:
8 (a) Is 18 years of age or older.

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(b) Has successfully completed the appropriate education
 program approved under section 20912.

3 (c) Subject to subsection (3), has attained a passing score on4 the appropriate department prescribed examination, as follows:

5 (i) Within 3 years after the effective date of the amendatory 6 act that added this subparagraph, $a = \mathbf{A}$ medical first responder shall pass the written examination proctored by the department or 7 the department's designee and a practical examination approved by 8 9 the department. The practical examination shall be administered by the instructors of the medical first responder course. The 10 11 department or the department's designee may also proctor the 12 practical examination.

13 (*ii*) An emergency medical technician, emergency medical 14 technician specialist, and a paramedic shall pass the written 15 examination proctored by the department or the department's 16 designee and a practical examination proctored by the department or 17 the department's designee.

(*iii*) The fee for the written examinations required under
subparagraphs (*i*) and (*ii*) shall be paid directly to the national
registry of emergency medical technicians or other organization
approved by the department.

22 (d) Meets other requirements of this part.

(3) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (2)(c)(i), not
more than 6 months after the effective date of the amendatory act
that added this subsection, the THE department shall require for
purposes of compliance with subsection (2)(c) successful passage by
each first-time applicant of an examination as that term is defined

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1 in section 20904(10).

2 (4) The department shall issue a license as an emergency 3 medical services instructor-coordinator only to an individual who 4 meets the requirements of subsection (2) for an emergency medical 5 services instructor-coordinator and at the time of application is 6 currently licensed as <u>an</u> A MEDICAL FIRST RESPONDER, emergency medical technician, emergency medical technician specialist, or 7 paramedic and has at least 3 years' field experience WITH A 8 LICENSED LIFE SUPPORT AGENCY as -an- A MEDICAL FIRST RESPONDER, 9 emergency medical technician, EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN 10 11 SPECIALIST, OR PARAMEDIC. The department shall provide for the 12 development and administration of an examination for emergency medical services instructor-coordinators. THE LICENSE SHALL SPECIFY 13 THE LEVEL OF INSTRUCTION-COORDINATION THE INDIVIDUAL IS LICENSED TO 14 PROVIDE. AN EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES INSTRUCTOR-COORDINATOR SHALL 15 NOT INSTRUCT OR COORDINATE EMERGENCY MEDICAL TRAINING COURSES AT A 16 17 LEVEL THAT EXCEEDS HIS OR HER DESIGNATED LEVEL OF LICENSURE AND FOR WHICH HE OR SHE DOES NOT HAVE AT LEAST 3 YEARS' FIELD EXPERIENCE AT 18 19 THAT LEVEL OF LICENSURE.

20 (5) Except as provided by section 20952, a license under this
21 section is effective for 3 years from the date of issuance unless
22 revoked or suspended by the department.

23 (6) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (7), an
24 applicant for licensure under this section shall pay the following
25 triennial licensure fees:

26 (a) Medical first responder - no fee.

27 (b) Emergency medical technician - \$40.00.

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1 (c) Emergency medical technician specialist - \$60.00.

2 (d) Paramedic - \$80.00.

3 (e) Emergency medical services instructor-coordinator -4 \$100.00.

(7) If a life support agency certifies to the department that 5 an applicant for licensure under this section will act as a 6 volunteer and if the life support agency does not charge for its 7 services, the department shall not require the applicant to pay the 8 fee required under subsection (6). If the applicant ceases to meet 9 10 the definition of a volunteer under this part at any time during 11 the effective period of his or her license and is employed as a 12 licensee under this part, the applicant shall at that time pay the fee required under subsection (6). 13
