## **HOUSE BILL No. 4248**

February 9, 2005, Introduced by Rep. Hummel and referred to the Committee on House Oversight, Elections, and Ethics.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 472, entitled

"An act to regulate political activity; to regulate lobbyists, lobbyist agents, and lobbying activities; to require registration of lobbyists and lobbyist agents; to require the filing of reports; to prescribe the powers and duties of the department of state; to prescribe penalties; and to repeal certain acts and parts of acts,"

by amending section 5 (MCL 4.415), as amended by 1986 PA 83.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 5. (1) "Legislative action" means introduction,
- 2 sponsorship, support, opposition, consideration, debate, vote,
- 3 passage, defeat, approval, veto, delay, or an official action by an
- official in the executive branch or an official in the legislative
- 5 branch on a bill, resolution, amendment, nomination, appointment,
- 5 report, or any matter pending or proposed in a legislative

- 1 committee or either house of the legislature. Legislative action
- 2 does not include the representation of a person who has been
- 3 subpoenaed to appear before the legislature or an agency of the
- 4 legislature.
- 5 (2) "Lobbying" means communicating directly with an official
- 6 in the executive branch of state government or an official in the
- 7 legislative branch of state government for the purpose of
- 8 influencing legislative or administrative action. Lobbying does not
- 9 include the providing of technical information by a person other
- 10 than a person as defined in subsection (5) or an employee of a
- 11 person as defined in subsection (5) when appearing before an
- 12 officially convened legislative committee or executive department
- 13 hearing panel. As used in this subsection, "technical information"
- 14 means empirically verifiable data provided by a person recognized
- 15 as an expert in the subject area to which the information provided
- 16 is related.
- 17 (3) "Influencing" means promoting, supporting, affecting,
- 18 modifying, opposing or delaying by any means, including the
- 19 providing of or use of information, statistics, studies, or
- 20 analysis.
- 21 (4) "Lobbyist" means any of the following:
- 22 (a) A person whose expenditures for lobbying are more than
- 23 \$1,000.00 in value in any 12-month period.
- 24 (b) A person whose expenditures for lobbying are more than
- 25 \$250.00 in value in any 12-month period, if the amount is expended
- 26 on lobbying a single public official.
- (c) For the purpose of subdivisions (a) and (b), groups of 25

- 1 or more people shall not have their personal expenditures for food,
- 2 travel, and beverage included, providing those expenditures are not
- 3 reimbursed by a lobbyist or lobbyist agent.
- 4 (d) The state or a political subdivision which— THAT
- 5 contracts for a lobbyist agent.
- **6** (5) "Lobbyist agent" means a person who receives compensation
- 7 or reimbursement of actual expenses, or both, in a combined amount
- 8 in excess of \$250.00 in any 12-month period for lobbying.
- 9 (6) "Representative of the lobbyist" means any of the
- 10 following:
- 11 (a) An employee of the lobbyist or lobbyist agent.
- (b) For purposes of <u>section</u> **SECTIONS** 8(1)(b)(i) and 9(1)(b),
- 13 a member of the lobbyist or employee of a member of the lobbyist,
- 14 when IF the lobbyist is a membership organization or association,
- 15 and -when- IF the lobbyist agent or an employee of the lobbyist or
- 16 lobbyist agent is present during any part of the period during
- 17 which the purchased food or beverage is consumed.
- 18 (c) A person who is reimbursed by the lobbyist or lobbyist
- 19 agent for an expenditure, other than an expenditure for food or
- 20 beverage, -which THAT was incurred for the purpose of lobbying.
- 21 (7) Lobbyist or lobbyist agent does not include:
- 22 (a) A publisher, owner, or working member of the press, radio,
- 23 or television while disseminating news or editorial comment to the
- 24 general public in the ordinary course of business.
- 25 (b) —All— AN elected or appointed public —officials— OFFICIAL
- 26 of state or local government who -are- IS acting in the course or
- 27 scope of the office for no compensation, other than that provided

- 1 by law for the office.
- 2 (c) For the purposes of this act, subdivision (b) -shall DOES
- 3 not include:
- 4 (i) Employees of public or private colleges, community
- 5 colleges, junior colleges or universities.
- 6 (ii) Employees of townships, villages, cities, counties or
- 7 school boards.
- 8 (iii) Employees of state executive departments.
- 9 (iv) Employees of the judicial branch of government.
- 10 (d) A member of a lobbyist, if the lobbyist is a membership
- 11 organization or association, and if the member of a lobbyist does
- 12 not separately qualify as a lobbyist under subsection (4).
- 13 (8) "Mass mailing" means not less than 1,000 pieces of
- 14 substantially similar material mailed within a 7-day period.
- 15 (9) "Official in the executive branch" means the governor,
- 16 lieutenant governor, secretary of state, attorney general; -or- an
- 17 individual who is in the executive branch of state government and
- 18 not under civil service; OR a classified director, chief deputy
- 19 director, or deputy director of a state department. This includes
- 20 an individual who is elected or appointed and has not yet taken, or
- 21 an individual who is nominated for appointment to, any of the
- 22 offices or agencies enumerated in this subsection. An official in
- 23 the executive branch does not include a person serving in a
- 24 clerical, nonpolicy-making, or nonadministrative capacity BUT DOES
- 25 INCLUDE ANY AT-WILL EMPLOYEE. In addition to all of the foregoing,
- 26 an official in the executive branch includes all of the following:
- 27 (a) In the executive office of the governor, the chief and ANY

- 1 deputy chief -of staff OPERATING OFFICER, press secretary,
- 2 director of job training COMMUNICATIONS, and director of personnel
- 3 OPERATIONS.
- 4 (b) In the department of agriculture, the racing commissioner
- 5 and a member of the MICHIGAN COMMISSION OF agriculture.
- 6 commission.
- 7 (c) In the department of civil rights, a member of the civil
- 8 rights commission.
- 9 (d) In the department of civil service, a member of the civil
- 10 service commission.
- 11 (e) In the department of -commerce LABOR AND ECONOMIC GROWTH,
- 12 the commissioner of financial -institutions AND INSURANCE
- 13 SERVICES, the executive director of the housing development
- 14 authority, and a member of the liquor control commission, strategic
- 15 fund board, state housing development authority, travel commission,
- 16 UTILITY CONSUMER PARTICIPATION BOARD, MICHIGAN OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY
- 17 AND HEALTH COMMISSION, or public service commission.
- 18 (f) In the department of education, a member of the state
- 19 board of education -, higher education facilities commission,
- 20 higher education facilities authority, higher education assistance
- 21 authority, higher education student loan authority, or state
- 22 tenure commission.
- 23 (g) In the department of labor AND ECONOMIC GROWTH, the
- 24 director of the bureau of workers' -disability compensation
- 25 AGENCY, the director of the employment security commission, and a
- 26 member of the construction code commission, employment relations
- 27 commission, employment security board of review, employment

- 1 security commission, or wage deviation board.
- 2 (h) In the department of -licensing and regulation, the state
- 3 insurance commissioner COMMUNITY HEALTH, THE DIRECTOR OF THE
- 4 OFFICE OF SERVICES TO THE AGING AND THE CHAIRPERSON OF THE CRIME
- 5 VICTIM SERVICES COMMISSION.
- 6 (i) In the department of management and budget, the lottery
- 7 commissioner, the director of the office of services to the aging,
- 8 the director of the office of state employer, -the chairperson of
- 9 the crime victims compensation board, and a member of the -council
- 10 for the arts, state administrative board, state building
- 11 authority. , toxic substance control commission, or utility
- 12 consumer participation board.
- 13 (j) In the department of natural resources OR DEPARTMENT OF
- 14 ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY, the supervisor of wells and a member of the
- 15 air pollution control commission, OR natural resources commission.
- 16 , or water resources commission.
- 17 (k) In the department of public health, a member of the
- 18 occupational health standards commission.
- 19 (K) (H) In the department of transportation, a member of the
- 20 aeronautics commission and a state transportation commissioner.
- 21 (l) (m) In the department of treasury, **THE LOTTERY**
- 22 COMMISSIONER, a member of the hospital finance authority,
- 23 investment advisory committee, -or state tax commission, HIGHER
- 24 EDUCATION FACILITIES COMMISSION, HIGHER EDUCATION FACILITIES
- 25 AUTHORITY, HIGHER EDUCATION ASSISTANCE AUTHORITY, OR HIGHER
- 26 EDUCATION STUDENT LOAN AUTHORITY.
- 27 (N) IN THE DEPARTMENT OF HISTORY, ARTS, AND LIBRARIES, A

- 1 MEMBER OF THE COUNCIL FOR THE ARTS.
- 2 (10) "Official in the legislative branch" means a member of
- 3 the legislature OR AN AT-WILL EMPLOYEE ON THE MEMBER'S STAFF, the
- 4 auditor general, the deputy auditor general, an employee of the
- 5 consumer's council, the director of the legislative retirement
- 6 system, or any other employee of the legislature other than an
- 7 individual employed by the state in a clerical or nonpolicy-making
- 8 capacity.
- 9 (11) "Governmental body" means any state legislative or
- 10 governing body, including a board, commission, committee,
- 11 subcommittee, authority, or council, which THAT is empowered by
- 12 state constitution, statute, or rule to exercise governmental or
- 13 proprietary authority or perform a governmental or proprietary
- 14 function, or a lessee thereof performing an essential public
- 15 purpose and function under the lease agreement.
