

# HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION AA

August 16, 2006, Introduced by Rep. Ward and referred to the Committee on House Oversight, Elections, and Ethics.

A joint resolution to petition the congress of the United States to call a convention to propose an amendment to the constitution of the United States to base apportionment of the house of representatives of the United States on the number of persons in each state who are citizens of the United States.

1 Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the  
2 state of Michigan, That pursuant to article V of the constitution  
3 of the United States, the legislature of the state of Michigan  
4 petitions the congress of the United States of America, at its  
5 session, to call a convention for the purpose of proposing an

1 amendment to the constitution of the United States to provide that  
2 representatives shall be apportioned among the several states  
3 according to their respective numbers, counting the number of  
4 persons in each state who are citizens of the United States.

5       Resolved further, That certified copies of this joint  
6 resolution be transmitted by the secretary of state to the  
7 president of the United States Senate, to the speaker of the United  
8 States House of Representatives, and to each member of this state's  
9 delegation to the congress and that printed copies be sent to each  
10 house of each state legislature in the United States.
