HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION Z

July 26, 2006, Introduced by Rep. Ward and referred to the Committee on House Oversight, Elections, and Ethics.

A joint resolution proposing an amendment to the state constitution of 1963, by amending section 2 of article XII, to provide that a constitutional amendment proposed by petition be approved by a majority of electors at two successive general elections before becoming part of the constitution.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the state of Michigan, That the following amendment to the state constitution of 1963, to provide that a constitutional amendment proposed by petition be approved by a majority of electors at two successive general elections before becoming part of the constitution, is proposed, agreed to, and submitted to the people of the state:

2 Sec. 2. Amendments may be proposed to this constitution by 3 petition of the registered electors of this state. Every petition 4 shall include the full text of the proposed amendment, and be 5 signed by registered electors of -the- THIS state equal in number to at least 10 percent of the total vote cast for all candidates 6 for governor at the last preceding general election at which a 7 governor was elected. -Such- THE petitions shall be filed with the 8 9 person authorized by law to receive the -same- PETITIONS at least 10 120 days before the **GENERAL** election at which the proposed 11 amendment is to be voted upon. - Any such EVERY petition shall be 12 in the form, and shall be signed and circulated in such manner, as prescribed by law. The person authorized by law to receive -such 13 14 THE petition shall upon its receipt determine, as provided by law, 15 the validity and sufficiency of the signatures on the petition, and make an official announcement - thereof - OF THE VALIDITY AND 16 17 SUFFICIENCY OF THE SIGNATURES ON THE PETITION at least 60 days prior to the GENERAL election at which the proposed amendment is to 18 19 be voted upon. 20 -Any AN amendment proposed by -such petition shall be submitted, not less than 120 days after it was filed, to the 21 22 electors at the next general election. - Such - THE proposed 23 amendment, existing provisions of the constitution -which THAT 24 would be altered or abrogated - thereby BY THE PROPOSED AMENDMENT, and the question as it shall appear on the ballot shall be 25 published in full as provided by law. Copies of -such- THE 26 27 publication shall be posted in each polling place and furnished to

- 2 The ballot to be used in -such THE GENERAL election shall

- 3 contain a statement of the purpose of the proposed amendment,
- 4 expressed in not more than 100 words, exclusive of caption. -Such
- 5 THE statement of purpose and caption shall be prepared by the
- 6 person authorized by law, and shall consist of a true and impartial
- 7 statement of the purpose of the amendment in -such- language as
- 8 shall create no prejudice for or against the proposed amendment.
- 9 If the proposed amendment is approved by a majority of the
- 10 electors voting on the question AT THE GENERAL ELECTION, THE
- 11 QUESTION SHALL BE RESUBMITTED TO A VOTE OF THE ELECTORS, IN THE
- 12 SAME MANNER THAT THE QUESTION WAS ORIGINALLY SUBMITTED, AT THE NEXT
- 13 SUCCEEDING GENERAL ELECTION. THE QUESTION SHALL BE REPUBLISHED IN
- 14 FULL IN THE SAME MANNER THAT THE ORIGINAL QUESTION WAS PUBLISHED.
- 15 IF THE PROPOSED AMENDMENT IS APPROVED AT THE NEXT SUCCEEDING
- 16 GENERAL ELECTION BY A MAJORITY OF THE ELECTORS VOTING ON THE
- 17 QUESTION, it shall become part of the constitution, and shall
- 18 abrogate or amend existing provisions of the constitution at the
- 19 end of 45 days after the date of the GENERAL election at which it
- 20 was FINALLY approved. If two or more amendments THAT ARE FINALLY
- 21 approved by the electors at the same election conflict, that
- 22 amendment receiving the highest affirmative vote shall prevail.
- 23 Resolved further, That the foregoing amendment shall be
- 24 submitted to the people of the state at the next general election
- 25 in the manner provided by law.
