FY 2007-08 SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS Summary: House Bill 5344 (H-1) As Reported by the House Appropriations Committee



Overview

House Bill 5344 (H-1) is a fiscal year 2007-08 supplemental budget bill. The total Gross appropriation for the bill is \$155.2 million. Of that total, a net amount of \$57.4 million represents GF/GP appropriations. An additional \$1.0 million GF/GP appropriation is created by the boilerplate transfer of GF/GP funds to the Comprehensive Transportation Fund (section 571).

The table below shows individual appropriation items in the substitute bill by budget area, as compared to those items that have been recommended by the State Budget Office. The table on the following page summarized boilerplate sections included in the bill.
