August 29, 2007, Introduced by Reps. Sheltrown, Griffin, Robert Jones, Young, Donigan, Mayes, Rick Jones, Polidori, Pastor, Vagnozzi, Hansen and Dean and referred to the Committee on Military and Veterans Affairs and Homeland Security.

A bill to amend 1967 PA 150, entitled

"Michigan military act,"

by amending section 251 (MCL 32.651), as amended by 1988 PA 246.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 251. (1) When the president calls or orders all or part 2 of the national quard into federal service in time of a national 3 emergency or when it appears that the national guard may be called 4 to federal service, the THE governor, as commander-in-chief, may 5 activate within the military establishment such number of units to 6 be known as the Michigan emergency volunteers VOLUNTEER DEFENSE 7 FORCE, as the governor considers necessary for adequate emergency assistance to the state. When activated by proper authority, the 8 9 Michigan emergency volunteers VOLUNTEER DEFENSE FORCE shall perform 10 only aid to civil authority missions formerly reserved for the

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national guard as determined by the department of military AND
VETERANS affairs in cooperation with the department of state police
and the state emergency preparedness plan. During times other than
a national emergency, organization of the Michigan emergency
volunteers VOLUNTEER DEFENSE FORCE shall not exceed 15% of the
Michigan national guard authorized strength.

7 (2) Not later than 1 year after the effective date of the
8 amendatory act that added this subsection, and each year

9 thereafter, the department of military affairs shall report to the

10 standing committees of the senate and house of representatives that

11 are responsible for legislation concerning military affairs, and

12 the senate and house appropriations committees as to the proposed

13 and actual status of development of the Michigan emergency

14 volunteers. The reports shall include all of the following:

15 (a) Regulations or proposed regulations to define and limit

16 the type and duration of missions that may be undertaken by the

17 Michigan emergency volunteers.

18 (b) Proposals for meeting the training and equipment needs of

19 the Michigan emergency volunteers in fulfilling the missions that

20 may be undertaken, and a 3-year projection of the costs of that

21 training and equipment.

22 (c) A description of the requirements or proposed

23 requirements, including physical ability, for membership in the

24 Michigan emergency volunteers.

25 (d) Procedures that are used or are proposed to be used to

26 screen membership in the Michigan emergency volunteers as to

27 character and fitness, including standards that will ensure that no

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1 person with a serious criminal record is a member.

2 (e) The plan detailing methods and procedures for the

3 coordination of the operations of the Michigan emergency volunteers
4 with the state police, local law enforcement agencies, and state
5 and federal disaster relief authorities.

6 (2) (3) A list of former officers, warrant officers, and
7 enlisted personnel of the Michigan national guard shall be
8 maintained with their consent in the office of the adjutant general
9 to aid in forming the Michigan emergency volunteers VOLUNTEER
10 DEFENSE FORCE.

(3) (4) The adjutant general may accept funding for the Michigan emergency volunteers VOLUNTEER DEFENSE FORCE from sources other than the state or federal government but shall expend those funds only pursuant to an appropriations act. The adjutant general shall deposit such-THE funds in a special account within the department of military AND VETERANS affairs.

17 (4) (5) As used in this act, a reference to the Michigan
18 defense force means the Michigan emergency volunteers VOLUNTEER
19 DEFENSE FORCE.

(5) (6) The department shall establish affirmative action
 guidelines for membership goals in the Michigan emergency
 volunteers VOLUNTEER DEFENSE FORCE. The department shall take all
 steps necessary to carry out and implement those guidelines.

(6) (7) Members of the Michigan emergency volunteers VOLUNTEER
 DEFENSE FORCE shall not be equipped with any type of weapon except
 under the following conditions:

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(a) The president has called or ordered all or part of the

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national guard into federal service in time of a national emergency
 and the mission of the Michigan emergency volunteers VOLUNTEER
 DEFENSE FORCE to whom weapons are issued consists primarily of the
 protection of public property.

5 (b) During training to be conducted by the national guard or6 state police in the proper use of such weapons.

(7) NOT LATER THAN 1 YEAR AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE 7 AMENDATORY ACT THAT ADDED THIS SUBSECTION AND EACH YEAR THEREAFTER, 8 9 THE DEPARTMENT OF MILITARY AND VETERANS AFFAIRS SHALL REPORT TO THE 10 STANDING COMMITTEES OF THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES THAT 11 ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR LEGISLATION CONCERNING MILITARY AFFAIRS, AND 12 THE SENATE AND HOUSE APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEES AS TO THE PROPOSED AND ACTUAL STATUS OF DEVELOPMENT OF THE MICHIGAN VOLUNTEER DEFENSE 13 14 FORCE. THE REPORTS SHALL INCLUDE ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:

15 (A) REGULATIONS OR PROPOSED REGULATIONS TO DEFINE AND LIMIT
16 THE TYPE AND DURATION OF MISSIONS THAT MAY BE UNDERTAKEN BY THE
17 MICHIGAN VOLUNTEER DEFENSE FORCE.

(B) PROPOSALS FOR MEETING THE TRAINING AND EQUIPMENT NEEDS OF
THE MICHIGAN VOLUNTEER DEFENSE FORCE IN FULFILLING THE MISSIONS
THAT MAY BE UNDERTAKEN, AND A 3-YEAR PROJECTION OF THE COSTS OF
THAT TRAINING AND EQUIPMENT.

(C) A DESCRIPTION OF THE REQUIREMENTS OR PROPOSED
 REQUIREMENTS, INCLUDING PHYSICAL ABILITY, FOR MEMBERSHIP IN THE
 MICHIGAN VOLUNTEER DEFENSE FORCE.

(D) PROCEDURES THAT ARE USED OR ARE PROPOSED TO BE USED TO
SCREEN MEMBERSHIP IN THE MICHIGAN VOLUNTEER DEFENSE FORCE AS TO
CHARACTER AND FITNESS, INCLUDING STANDARDS THAT WILL ENSURE THAT NO

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1 PERSON WITH A SERIOUS CRIMINAL RECORD IS A MEMBER.

2 (E) THE PLAN DETAILING METHODS AND PROCEDURES FOR THE 3 COORDINATION OF THE OPERATIONS OF THE MICHIGAN VOLUNTEER DEFENSE 4 FORCE WITH THE STATE POLICE, LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES, AND 5 STATE AND FEDERAL DISASTER RELIEF AUTHORITIES.
