## SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 5952

A bill to amend 1970 PA 169, entitled "Local historic districts act,"

by amending section 3 (MCL 399.203), as amended by 2001 PA 67.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 3. (1) A local unit may, by ordinance, establish 1 or
- 2 more historic districts. The historic districts shall be
- 3 administered by a commission established pursuant to section 4.
- 4 Before establishing a historic district, the legislative body of
- 5 the local unit shall appoint a historic district study committee.
- 6 The committee shall contain a majority of persons who have a
- 7 clearly demonstrated interest in or knowledge of historic
- 8 preservation, and shall contain representation from 1 or more duly
- 9 organized local historic preservation organizations. The committee
- 10 shall do all of the following:
- 11 (a) Conduct a photographic inventory of resources within each

- 1 proposed historic district following procedures established or
- 2 approved by the department.
- 3 (b) Conduct basic research of each proposed historic district
- 4 and the historic resources located within that district.
- 5 (c) Determine the total number of historic and nonhistoric
- 6 resources within a proposed historic district and the percentage of
- 7 historic resources of that total. In evaluating the significance of
- 8 historic resources, the committee shall be guided by the selection
- 9 criteria for evaluation issued by the United States secretary of
- 10 the interior for inclusion of resources in the national register of
- 11 historic places, as set forth in 36 C.F.R. CFR part 60, and
- 12 criteria established or approved by the department, if any.
- 13 (d) Prepare a preliminary historic district study committee
- 14 report that addresses at a minimum all of the following:
- 15 (i) The charge of the committee.
- 16 (ii) The composition of the committee membership.
- 17 (iii) The historic district or districts studied.
- 18 (iv) The boundaries for each proposed historic district in
- 19 writing and on maps.
- 20 (v) The history of each proposed historic district.
- (vi) The significance of each district as a whole, as well as a
- 22 sufficient number of its individual resources to fully represent
- 23 the variety of resources found within the district, relative to the
- 24 evaluation criteria.
- 25 (e) Transmit WITHIN 1 YEAR AFTER APPOINTMENT OF THE COMMITTEE
- 26 OR OF REFERRAL OF A PROPOSED HISTORIC DISTRICT TO A STANDING
- 27 COMMITTEE, TRANSMIT copies of the preliminary report for review and

1 recommendations to the local planning body, to the department, to

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- 2 the Michigan historical commission, and to the state historic
- 3 preservation review board. BY MAJORITY VOTE, THE COMMITTEE MAY
- 4 ADOPT A 1-TIME EXTENSION OF THE DEADLINE TO SUBMIT THE PRELIMINARY
- 5 REPORT, WHICH SHALL ALLOW NO LONGER THAN 12 ADDITIONAL MONTHS.
- 6 (f) Make copies of the preliminary report available to the
- 7 public pursuant to subsection  $\frac{(4)}{(6)}$ .
- 8 (2) Not less than 60 calendar days after the transmittal of
- 9 the preliminary report, the committee shall hold a public hearing
- 10 in compliance with the open meetings act, 1976 PA 267, MCL 15.261
- 11 to 15.275. Public notice of the time, date, and place of the
- 12 hearing shall be given in the manner required by the open meetings
- 13 act, 1976 PA 267, MCL 15.261 to 15.275. Written notice shall be
- 14 mailed by first-class mail not less than 14 calendar days before
- 15 the hearing to the owners of properties within the proposed
- 16 historic district, as listed on the tax rolls of the local unit.
- 17 (3) After WITHIN 6 MONTHS AFTER the date of the public
- 18 hearing, the committee and the legislative body of the local unit
- 19 shall have not more than 1 year, unless otherwise authorized by the
- 20 legislative body of the local unit, to take the following actions:
- 21 (a) The committee—shall prepare and submit a final report
- 22 ADDRESSING THE ISSUES IN SUBSECTION (1) (D) with its recommendations
- 23 and the recommendations, if any, of the local planning body to the
- 24 legislative body of the local unit. If the recommendation is to
- 25 establish a historic district or districts, the final report shall
- 26 include a draft of a proposed ordinance or ordinances AND A LIST OF
- 27 THE HISTORIC AND NONHISTORIC RESOURCES IDENTIFIED BY STREET NUMBER

- 1 AND ADDRESS.
- 2 (4) (b)—After receiving a final report that recommends the
- 3 establishment of a historic district or districts, the legislative
- 4 body of the local unit, at its discretion, may introduce and pass
- 5 or reject an ordinance or ordinances. THE LOCAL UNIT OF GOVERNMENT
- 6 SHALL NOT ADOPT AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING 1 OR MORE HISTORIC
- 7 DISTRICTS LATER THAN 1 YEAR AFTER RECEIPT OF THE FINAL REPORT
- 8 FOLLOWING THE PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSED DISTRICT OR DISTRICTS.
- 9 BEFORE THE EXPIRATION OF THE PERIOD FOR CONSIDERING THE ORDINANCE,
- 10 THE LOCAL UNIT OF GOVERNMENT MAY ADOPT A RESOLUTION EXTENDING THE
- 11 TIME LIMIT FOR CONSIDERING THE ADOPTION OF THE ORDINANCE FOR NOT
- 12 MORE THAN 1 YEAR. THE LOCAL UNIT SHALL NOT ADOPT MORE THAN 1
- 13 RESOLUTION EXTENDING THE TIME FOR CONSIDERATION OF ANY PROPOSED
- 14 HISTORIC DISTRICT OR DISTRICTS.
- 15 (5) If the local unit passes an ordinance or ordinances
- 16 establishing 1 or more historic districts, the local unit shall
- 17 file DO BOTH OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 18 (A) FILE a copy of that ordinance or those ordinances,
- 19 including a legal description of the property or properties located
- 20 within the historic district or districts, with the register of
- 21 deeds. A local unit shall not pass an ordinance establishing a
- 22 contiguous historic district less than 60 days after a majority of
- 23 the property owners within the proposed historic district, as
- 24 listed on the tax rolls of the local unit, have approved the
- 25 establishment of the historic district pursuant to a written
- 26 petition.
- 27 (B) WITHIN 45 DAYS AFTER ADOPTING THE ORDINANCE, PROVIDE THE

- 1 STATE HISTORIC PRESERVATION OFFICE OF THE MICHIGAN HISTORICAL
- 2 CENTER OF THE DEPARTMENT OR ITS SUCCESSOR AGENCY WITH A COPY OF THE
- 3 FINAL REPORT OF THE HISTORIC DISTRICT STUDY COMMITTEE AND THE
- 4 ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE HISTORIC DISTRICT.
- 5 (6) (4) A writing prepared, owned, used, in the possession of,
- 6 or retained by a committee in the performance of an official
- 7 function shall be made available to the public in compliance with
- 8 the freedom of information act, 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.231 to 15.246.
