- 1 Sec. 81129. (1) Subject to subsections (2), (3), and (17), AND
- 2 (18), a parent or legal guardian of a child less than 16 years of

- 4 is under the direct visual supervision of an adult and the child
- has in his or her immediate possession an ORV safety certificate
 - issued pursuant to this part or a comparable ORV safety certificate

- 18 STAFF OF THE EVENT ORGANIZER AND A STAFF MEMBER SERVES AS A FLAGGER
- 19 TO WARN ORV RIDERS IF ANOTHER ORV RIDER IS INJURED OR AN ORV IS
- 20 INOPERABLE IN THE ORV OPERATING AREA.
- 21 (F) FENCING OR ANOTHER MEANS OF CROWD CONTROL IS USED TO KEEP
- 22 SPECTATORS OUT OF THE ORV OPERATING AREA.
- 23 (G) IF THE EVENT IS ON A CLOSED COURSE, DUST IS CONTROLLED IN
- 24 THE ORV OPERATING AREA AND THE RIDING SURFACE IN THE ORV OPERATING
- 25 AREA IS OTHERWISE PROPERLY PREPARED.
- 26 (H) THREE-WHEELED ATVS ARE NOT USED BY PARTICIPANTS.
- 27 (I) ANY ATVS USED BY PARTICIPANTS ARE EQUIPPED WITH A SIDE

- 1 STEP BAR OR COMPARABLE SAFETY EQUIPMENT AND WITH A TETHER KILL
- 2 SWITCH, AND THE TETHER IS USED BY ALL PARTICIPANTS.
- 3 (J) EACH PARTICIPANT IN THE EVENT WEARS A CRASH HELMET
- 4 APPROVED BY THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, A
- 5 PROTECTIVE LONG-SLEEVED SHIRT OR JACKET, LONG PANTS, BOOTS, AND
- 6 PROTECTIVE GLOVES.
- 7 (K) ANY OTHER APPLICABLE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS PART OR RULES
- 8 PROMULGATED UNDER THIS PART ARE MET.
