

HOUSE SUBSTITUTE FOR  
SENATE BILL NO. 1093

A bill to make appropriations for community colleges and certain state purposes related to education for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2009; to provide for the expenditure of those appropriations; to establish or continue certain funds, programs, and categories; and to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state departments, institutions, agencies, employees, and officers.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

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PART 1

LINE-ITEM APPROPRIATIONS

Sec. 101. Subject to the conditions set forth in this act, the amounts listed in this part are appropriated for community colleges and certain other state purposes relating to education for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2009, from the funds indicated in

this part. The following is a summary of the appropriations in this part:

## PART 2

## PROVISIONS CONCERNING APPROPRIATIONS

GENERAL SECTIONS

Sec. 201. Pursuant to section 30 of article IX of the state constitution of 1963, total state spending from state resources under part 1 for fiscal year 2008-2009 is \$310,617,000.00 and state spending from state resources to be paid to local units of government for fiscal year 2008-2009 is \$310,617,000.00. The itemized statement below identifies appropriations from which spending to local units of government will occur:

Sec. 202. The appropriations authorized under this act are subject to the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1101 to 18.1594.

Sec. 203. Unless otherwise specified, a community college receiving appropriations in part 1 and the department of labor and economic growth shall use the Internet to fulfill the reporting requirements of this act. This requirement may include transmission of reports via electronic mail to the recipients identified for each reporting requirement or it may include placement of reports on an Internet or Intranet site.

Sec. 209. Funds appropriated in part 1 shall not be used for

1 the purchase of foreign goods or services, or both, if  
2 competitively priced and of comparable quality American goods or  
3 services, or both, are available. Preference should be given to  
4 goods or services, or both, manufactured or provided by Michigan  
5 businesses, if they are competitively priced and of comparable  
6 quality. In addition, preference should be given to goods or  
7 services, or both, that are manufactured or provided by Michigan  
8 businesses owned and operated by veterans, if they are  
9 competitively priced and of comparable quality.

10 Sec. 210. The principal executive officer of each community  
11 college receiving appropriations in part 1 shall take all  
12 reasonable steps to ensure businesses in deprived and depressed  
13 communities compete for and perform contracts to provide services  
14 or supplies, or both. Each principal executive officer shall  
15 strongly encourage firms with which the community college contracts  
16 to subcontract with certified businesses in depressed and deprived  
17 communities for services or supplies, or both.

18 Sec. 211. (1) The money appropriated in this act is  
19 appropriated for community colleges with fiscal years ending June  
20 30, 2009 and shall be paid out of the state treasury and  
21 distributed by the state treasurer to the respective community  
22 colleges in 11 monthly installments on the sixteenth of each month,  
23 or the next succeeding business day, beginning with October 16,  
24 2008. Each community college shall accrue its July and August 2009  
25 payments to its institutional fiscal year ending June 30, 2009.  
26 However, if a community college fails to submit all verified  
27 Michigan community colleges activities classification structure

1 data for school year 2007-2008 to the department of labor and  
2 economic growth by November 1, 2008, the monthly installments shall  
3 be withheld from that community college until those data are  
4 submitted. The amount from the money appropriated in part 1 that is  
5 allocated to address the special needs of at-risk students shall be  
6 paid in full by the state treasurer by November 1, 2008. The amount  
7 distributed to a community college or department shall not exceed  
8 the net state allocation authorized by this act.

9 (2) Except as otherwise provided by law, each of the amounts  
10 appropriated shall be used solely for the respective purposes  
11 stated in this act. The money appropriated in this act may be used  
12 to match the cost of any available programs under the Carl D.  
13 Perkins vocational and applied technology education act of 1998, 20  
14 USC 2301 to 2415, including local administration.

15 Sec. 216. (1) A community college shall pay the employer's  
16 contributions to the Michigan public school employees' retirement  
17 system created by the public school employees retirement act of  
18 1979, 1980 PA 300, MCL 38.1301 to 38.1408, as a condition of  
19 receiving money appropriated under this act.

20 (2) A community college shall not pay an employer's  
21 contribution to more than 1 retirement fund providing benefits for  
22 an employee.

23 Sec. 217. Money appropriated in part 1 shall not be used to  
24 pay for the construction or maintenance of a self-liquidating  
25 project. A community college shall comply with the current use and  
26 finance requirements of the joint capital outlay subcommittee  
27 (JCOS) for any construction, renovation, or other capital outlay

1 projects pursuant to JCOS policy.

2       Sec. 220. It is the intent of the legislature that the  
3 legislature restore the infrastructure, technology, equipment, and  
4 maintenance (ITEM) funding provided in previous fiscal years.

5       Sec. 224. (1) Recognizing the critical importance of education  
6 in strengthening Michigan's workforce, the legislature encourages  
7 the state's public community colleges to explore ways of increasing  
8 collaboration and cooperation with 4-year universities,  
9 particularly in the areas related to training, instruction, and  
10 program articulation.

11       (2) Recognizing the central role of community colleges in  
12 responding to local employment needs and challenges, community  
13 colleges shall develop and continue efforts to collaborate with  
14 local employers and students to identify local employment needs and  
15 strategies to meet them.

16       (3) Community colleges are encouraged to collaborate with each  
17 other on innovations to identify and meet local employment needs.

18       (4) Community colleges are encouraged to organize and  
19 participate in a legislative summit on a strategy for meeting the  
20 employment needs of the entire state. The community colleges shall  
21 report the results of the summit to the senate and house  
22 appropriations subcommittees on community colleges.

23       Sec. 234. Community colleges shall do the following:

24       (a) Undertake active measures to promote equal opportunities,  
25 eliminate discrimination, and foster a diverse student body and  
26 administration among all people including, but not limited to,  
27 women, minorities, seniors, veterans, and people with disabilities.

1 (b) Review, analyze, and eradicate activities that may tend to  
2 discriminate.

3 Sec. 239. The legislature intends that any executive or  
4 legislative proposal or action, subsequent to the adoption of a  
5 recommendation for appropriations for community colleges for the  
6 fiscal year ending September 30, 2009, to increase appropriations  
7 to state-supported 4-year universities in excess of the governor's  
8 original recommendation for the fiscal year ending September 30,  
9 2009, will be accompanied by a similar action or proposal for  
10 state-supported community colleges.

11 Sec. 241. Community colleges are encouraged to expand their  
12 current nursing education programs and increase nursing education  
13 program enrollments. This expansion may include, but is not limited  
14 to, creating partnerships with hospitals and other health care  
15 providers, expanding the focus and utilization of the nursing  
16 scholarship program, and redirecting existing institutional  
17 resources toward nursing education programs.

18 Sec. 242. It is the intent of the legislature that the  
19 Michigan community college association, the legislature, and other  
20 interested parties continue the discussion regarding payments in  
21 lieu of taxes, especially for those community college districts  
22 that contain significant portions of nontaxable land.

23 Sec. 243. It is the intent of the legislature to develop and  
24 pass enact legislation that would authorize community colleges to  
25 issue debt to fund customized workforce development training. This  
26 program would be known as the Michigan new jobs training program.  
27 The principal and interest payments on any debt issued under the



1 program would be paid by capturing the incremental increase in the  
2 state income tax associated with the wages of new employees and  
3 redirecting it to the community college instead of the state. The  
4 program would offer an incentive for employers creating new jobs or  
5 expanding operations in Michigan. This program has the potential to  
6 be a cornerstone of Michigan's workforce and economic development  
7 efforts, with the state's community colleges collaboratively  
8 partnering with state and local economic development, the Michigan  
9 works agencies, and the private sector to implement unified  
10 strategies for regional growth.

11 Sec. 246. It is the intent of the legislature that a workgroup  
12 be formed including representatives of community colleges, state  
13 universities, and the health care community to address and resolve  
14 the nursing shortage in the state of Michigan. The workgroup shall  
15 submit a report to the house and senate appropriations  
16 subcommittees on community colleges, the house and senate fiscal  
17 agencies, and the department of management and budget no later than  
18 December 31, 2008.

19 Sec. 247. Funds appropriated in part 1 shall not be used for  
20 the purchase of foreign automobiles if competitively priced and of  
21 comparable quality automobiles made in the state of Michigan or  
22 elsewhere in the United States of America are available.

### 23 **STATE AID - OPERATIONS**

24 Sec. 301. Unless otherwise stated, all data items used in  
25 determining state aid in this act are as defined in the 2001 Manual  
26 for Uniform Financial Reporting, Michigan Public Community

1 Colleges, which shall be the basis for reporting data, and the  
2 Activities Classification Structure Manual for Michigan Community  
3 Colleges, as amended, which shall be used to document financial  
4 needs of the community colleges.

5       Sec. 302. A community college shall not include in the  
6 enrollment data reported for determining state aid under this act  
7 any student credit hours or student contact hours for a student  
8 incarcerated in a Michigan penal institution. Exclusion of these  
9 students is intended to avoid the payment of state aid under this  
10 act for the same individuals for whom reimbursement is provided by  
11 the state correctional system.

12       Sec. 304. (1) The appropriations in part 1 for community  
13 college operations include an aggregate 3% increase distributed  
14 pursuant to the funding formula developed by the performance  
15 indicators task force formed pursuant to section 242 of 2005 PA  
16 154.

17       (2) It is the intent of the legislature that the  
18 recommendations and performance measures developed by the  
19 performance indicators task force formed pursuant to section 242 of  
20 2005 PA 154 be reviewed and more fully implemented for distribution  
21 of state funding to community colleges in future years.

22 Specifically, it is the intent of the legislature that the  
23 performance indicators task force review and implement 1 or more  
24 measurable data items for the local strategic value indicator and  
25 review and implement 1 or more measurable data items for an  
26 administrative cost formula component.

**GRANTS**

Sec. 401. (1) The community college at-risk student success program is continued. The funding shall be prorated among community colleges based on the number of student contact hours for developmental and preparatory instruction reported by each community college to the department of labor and economic growth pursuant to the Activities Classification Structure Manual for Michigan Community Colleges, as amended. Of the amount appropriated in part 1 for the at-risk student success program, \$1,120,000.00 is allocated for base grants of \$40,000.00 each, to address the special needs of at-risk students at community colleges.

(2) Of the amount appropriated in part 1 for the at-risk student success program, the balance of the appropriated money shall be distributed on a proration utilizing the sum of the most recent 3 years developmental/preparatory contact hours divided by the sum of the 3-year total contact hours at each college. Each community college's percentage shall be divided by the sum of all the percentages systemwide to obtain each community college's prorated grant amount.

(3) For the fiscal year ending September 30, 2009, the at-risk student success program money is allocated as follows:

23       (4) As used in this act, "at-risk students" means students who  
 24 meet 1 or more of the following criteria:

25       (a) Are initially placed in 1 or more developmental courses as  
 26 a result of standardized testing or as a result of failure to make  
 27 satisfactory academic progress.

1 (b) Are diagnosed as learning disabled.

2 (c) Require English as a second language (ESL) assistance.

3 (5) Grant funding under this section shall be utilized to  
4 address the special needs of at-risk students. Activities related  
5 to services provided to at-risk students include, but are not  
6 limited to, pretesting for academic ability, counseling contacts,  
7 and special programs. Equipment or information technology hardware  
8 or software purchased under this section must be associated with  
9 the operation of a program designed to address the needs of at-risk  
10 students.

11 (6) Grant funding under this section shall not be used for  
12 indirect costs including, but not limited to, rent, utilities, or,  
13 except as provided in this section, college administration.

14 (7) Each community college shall report to the department of  
15 labor and economic growth a summary of all accomplishments under,  
16 expenditures for, and compliance with the intent of this program,  
17 including the number of at-risk students served. The report is  
18 subject to audit as provided for in section 502(1). The report  
19 shall be submitted not later than 90 days after the end of the  
20 state's fiscal year.

21 Sec. 404. The appropriation in part 1 for renaissance zone  
22 reimbursements shall be made to each eligible recipient no later  
23 than 60 days after the department of treasury certifies to the  
24 state budget director that it has received all necessary  
25 information to properly determine the amounts due each eligible  
26 recipient under section 12 of the Michigan renaissance zone act,  
27 1996 PA 376, MCL 125.2692.

1       Sec. 405. Community college nursing programs are part of a  
2 comprehensive solution to Michigan's nursing shortage. Community  
3 college students are eligible to apply for financial assistance  
4 through the Michigan nursing scholarship program established in the  
5 Michigan nursing scholarship act, 2002 PA 591, MCL 390.1181 to  
6 390.1189. The Michigan nursing corps grants described in section  
7 431 of 2007 PA 118 and administered by the department of labor and  
8 economic growth provide funding to address the shortage of  
9 qualified nursing faculty. Community colleges are encouraged to  
10 coordinate with the chief nurse executive in the department of  
11 community health and with 4-year universities to improve access to  
12 nursing programs and to assist students to successfully enter the  
13 nursing workforce.

14       Sec. 406. (1) The funds appropriated in part 1 for nursing  
15 programs shall be allocated to each community college on a  
16 proportional basis based on the number of 2006-2007 ADN/RN nursing  
17 program awards reported by the community college to the office of  
18 postsecondary services in the department of labor and economic  
19 growth.

20       (2) It is the intent of the legislature that community  
21 colleges use the funds allocated under subsection (1) to increase  
22 nursing program completions and expand existing nursing program  
23 capacity. These funds may be used for any of the following:

24       (a) Maintaining sustainability of existing programs in order  
25 to ensure that current programs are not reduced or eliminated due  
26 to high operational costs.

27       (b) Reducing attrition by utilizing counselors, mentors,

1 better assessment and screening tools, and other student support  
2 services to ensure that students who enter a nursing program  
3 complete that program.

4 (c) Purchasing equipment and technology to increase efficiency  
5 and program capacity through the use of simulators, software,  
6 online curriculum development, and other program technology.

7 (d) Retaining and acquiring qualified faculty in an  
8 increasingly competitive recruiting market.

9 (3) By January 1, 2009, each community college receiving funds  
10 under this section shall report to the house and senate  
11 appropriations subcommittees on community colleges, the house and  
12 senate fiscal agencies, and the department of management and budget  
13 on the impact of these funds on nursing program completions at that  
14 college. In addition, each community college shall include in its  
15 report its plans for future nursing program enrollment expansion  
16 and indicate any barriers to that expansion.

#### 17 **REPORTS AND AUDITS**

18 Sec. 501. The department of labor and economic growth shall  
19 publish the activities classification structure data book for  
20 Michigan community colleges on or before March 1, 2009.

21 Sec. 502. (1) The auditor general or a certified public  
22 accountant appointed by the auditor general may conduct performance  
23 audits of community colleges as the auditor general considers  
24 necessary.

25 (2) Not more than 60 days after an audit report is released by  
26 the office of the auditor general, the principal executive officer

1 of the community college that was audited shall submit to the house  
2 and senate appropriations committees, the house and senate fiscal  
3 agencies, the department of labor and economic growth, the auditor  
4 general, and the state budget director a plan to comply with audit  
5 recommendations. The plan shall contain projected dates and  
6 resources required, if any, to achieve compliance with the audit  
7 recommendations, or a documented explanation of the college's  
8 noncompliance with the audit recommendations concerning the matters  
9 on which the audited community college and office of the auditor  
10 general disagree.

11       Sec. 504. (1) A community college shall retain certified class  
12 summaries, class lists, registration documents, and student  
13 transcripts that are consistent with the taxonomy of courses. For  
14 each enrollment period during the fiscal year, these certified  
15 documents shall identify clearly by course the number of in-  
16 district and out-of-district student credit and contact hours. The  
17 class summaries and class lists shall be consistent with each other  
18 and shall include the course prefix and numbers, course title,  
19 course credit and contact hours, credit and contact hours generated  
20 by each student, and activity classifications consistent with the  
21 taxonomy. An auditable process shall be used by the community  
22 college to determine the unduplicated head count for in-district  
23 students, out-of-district students, and prisoners for each  
24 enrollment period during the fiscal year.

25       (2) Contracts between the community college and agencies that  
26 reimburse the community college for the costs of instruction shall  
27 be retained for audit purposes.



1       Sec. 505. Each community college shall have an annual audit of  
2 all income and expenditures performed by an independent auditor and  
3 shall furnish the independent auditor's management letter and an  
4 annual audited accounting of all general and current funds income  
5 and expenditures including audits of college foundations to the  
6 members of the senate and house appropriations subcommittees on  
7 community colleges, the senate and house fiscal agencies, the  
8 auditor general, the department of labor and economic growth, and  
9 the state budget director before November 15, 2008. If a community  
10 college fails to furnish the audit materials, the monthly state aid  
11 installments shall be withheld from that college until the  
12 information is submitted. All reporting shall conform to the  
13 requirements set forth in the 2001 Manual for Uniform Financial  
14 Reporting, Michigan Public Community Colleges.

15       Sec. 506. (1) Each community college shall report the  
16 following to the department of labor and economic growth no later  
17 than November 1, 2008:

18       (a) The number of North American Indian students enrolled each  
19 term for the previous fiscal year, using guidelines and procedures  
20 developed by the department of labor and economic growth and the  
21 Michigan commission on Indian affairs.

22       (b) The number of Indian tuition waivers granted each term,  
23 and the monetary value of the waivers for the previous fiscal year.

24       (2) Colleges shall use the criteria cited in 1976 PA 174, MCL  
25 390.1251 to 390.1253, to determine eligibility for tuition waivers,  
26 and shall grant those waivers to individuals who meet the criteria  
27 and request tuition waivers.

1           (3) The department of labor and economic growth shall compile  
2 the information received under subsection (1) and shall submit this  
3 compilation to the house and senate appropriations subcommittees on  
4 community colleges, the senate and house fiscal agencies, and the  
5 state budget director by January 7, 2009.

6           Sec. 507. Upon request, a community college shall inform  
7 interested Michigan high schools of the aggregate academic status  
8 of its students for the prior academic year, in a manner prescribed  
9 by the Michigan community college association and in cooperation  
10 with the Michigan association of secondary school principals.

11          Sec. 508. (1) Each community college shall report to the house  
12 and senate fiscal agencies, the state budget director, and the  
13 department of labor and economic growth by August 31, 2008, the  
14 tuition and mandatory fees paid by a full-time in-district student  
15 and a full-time out-of-district student as established by the  
16 college governing board for the 2008-2009 academic year. This  
17 report should also include the annual cost of attendance based on a  
18 full-time course load of 30 credits. Each community college shall  
19 also report any revisions to the reported 2008-2009 academic year  
20 tuition and mandatory fees adopted by the college governing board  
21 to the house and senate fiscal agencies, the state budget director,  
22 and the department of labor and economic growth within 15 days of  
23 being adopted.

24          (2) The department of labor and economic growth shall prepare  
25 and provide to community colleges a standard format for reporting  
26 tuition and fees pursuant to subsection (1).

27          Sec. 509. (1) Each community college shall report to the

1 department of labor and economic growth the numbers and type of  
2 associate degrees and other certificates awarded during the  
3 previous fiscal year. The report shall be made not later than  
4 November 15, 2008.

5 (2) The department of labor and economic growth shall compile  
6 the information received under subsection (1) and shall submit this  
7 compilation to the house and senate appropriations subcommittees on  
8 community colleges, the senate and house fiscal agencies, and the  
9 state budget director by January 7, 2009.

10 Sec. 510. A community college receiving funding under this act  
11 and also subject to the student right-to-know and campus security  
12 act, Public Law 101-542, 104 Stat. 2381, shall make a copy of all  
13 material prepared in accordance with the public information  
14 reporting requirements under the crime awareness and campus  
15 security act of 1990, title II of the student right-to-know and  
16 campus security act, Public Law 101-542, 104 Stat. 2384, available  
17 in hard copy and electronic format accessible through the Internet  
18 for school districts, parents, and students.

19 Sec. 511. (1) At least 30 days before submission of a new  
20 state plan to the United States department of education for  
21 approval under the Perkins act, the department of labor and  
22 economic growth shall provide copies of the proposed plan to the  
23 members of the senate and house appropriations subcommittees on  
24 community colleges for their review and comment. Copies of the  
25 proposed plan shall be provided to the senate and house fiscal  
26 agencies and the state budget director at the same time that they  
27 are provided to the senate and house subcommittees.

1           (2) The Perkins grant application process and content shall be  
2 streamlined to the extent possible.

3           (3) As used in this section, "Perkins act" means the Carl D.  
4 Perkins vocational and applied technology education act of 1998, 20  
5 USC 2301 to 2415.

6           Sec. 513. The department of treasury shall annually collect  
7 and compile data on the tax revenue losses to community colleges  
8 resulting from tax increment financing authorities (TIFA) and tax  
9 abatements. The department of treasury shall produce a report  
10 detailing the data. The report shall be completed and presented to  
11 the house and senate appropriations subcommittees on community  
12 colleges, the department of labor and economic growth, and the  
13 department of management and budget not later than March 1, 2009.  
14 The report shall include, but is not limited to, the following:

15           (a) Estimated revenue losses for each community college for  
16 the calendar year 2008.

17           (b) Confirmed revenue losses for each community college for
