## HOUSE BILL No. 6014

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled

"Natural resources and environmental protection act," by amending sections 80205 and 80215 (MCL 324.80205 and 324.80215), section 80205 as amended by 2007 PA 8 and section 80215 as added by 2000 PA 229; and to repeal acts and parts of acts.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 80205. (1) Until March 16, 2009, except as otherwise
 provided in this section, a person shall not operate a personal
 watercraft on the waters of this state unless each person riding on
 or being towed behind the personal watercraft is wearing a type I,
 type II, or type III personal flotation device as described in R
 281.1234 of the Michigan administrative code.

(2) Beginning March 16, 2009, except as otherwise provided in

April 24, 2008, Introduced by Reps. Hammon, Sheltrown, Constan, Hammel, Johnson, Robert Jones, Jackson, Meadows, Coulouris, Polidori, Gonzales, Vagnozzi and Miller and referred to the Committee on Tourism, Outdoor Recreation and Natural Resources.

1 this section, a person shall not operate a personal watercraft on 2 the waters of this state unless each person 12 years of age or 3 older riding on or being towed behind the personal watercraft is 4 wearing a type I, type II, or type III personal flotation device as 5 described in R 281.1234 of the Michigan administrative code.

6 (3) Beginning March 16, 2009, a person shall not operate a 7 personal watercraft on the waters of this state unless each person 8 on board or being towed by the personal watercraft who is less than 9 12 years of age is wearing a type I or type II personal flotation 10 device as described in R 281.1234 of the Michigan administrative 11 code.

12 (4) A person shall not operate a personal watercraft on the 13 waters of this state unless each person on board the personal 14 watercraft is wearing a personal flotation device that is not 15 inflatable.

16 (5) A person shall not operate a personal watercraft on the 17 waters of this state if a child who is under 7 years of age is on 18 board or being towed behind the personal watercraft unless the 19 child is in the company of his or her parent or guardian or a 20 designee of the parent or guardian.

(6) While operating a personal watercraft equipped by the manufacturer with a lanyard-type engine cutoff switch on the waters of this state, a person shall have the lanyard attached to his or her person, clothing, or personal flotation device as is appropriate for the personal watercraft.

26 (7) A person shall not operate a personal watercraft on the
27 waters of this state during the period that begins 1 hour before AT

sunset and ends at 8 a.m. As used in this subsection, "sunset"
 means that time as determined by the national weather service.

3 (8) A person operating a personal watercraft on the waters of
4 this state shall not cross within 150 feet behind another vessel,
5 other than a personal watercraft, unless the person is operating
6 the personal watercraft at slow-no wake speed. A person who
7 violates this subsection is responsible for a state civil
8 infraction and may be ordered to pay a civil fine of not more than
9 \$500.00.

10 (9) A person shall not operate a personal watercraft on the 11 waters of this state where the water depth is less than 2 feet, as 12 determined by vertical measurement, unless 1 or both of the 13 following circumstances exist:

14 (a) The personal watercraft is being operated at slow-no wake15 speed.

16 (b) The personal watercraft is being docked or launched.

17 (10) A person who violates subsection (9) is responsible for a
18 state civil infraction and may be ordered to pay a civil fine of
19 not more than \$500.00.

(11) A person shall operate a personal watercraft in a reasonable and prudent manner. A maneuver that unreasonably or unnecessarily endangers life, limb, or property, including, but not limited to, all of the following, constitutes reckless operation of a personal watercraft under section 80208:

(a) Weaving through congested vessel traffic.

26 (b) Jumping the wake of another vessel unreasonably or27 unnecessarily close to the other vessel or when visibility around

1 the other vessel is obstructed.

2 (c) Waiting until the last possible moment before swerving to3 avoid a collision.

4 (12) A person shall not operate a personal watercraft on the
5 waters of this state carrying more persons than the personal
6 watercraft is designed to carry.

7 (13) A violation of subsection (12) is prima facie evidence of
8 reckless operation of a watercraft under section 80208.

9 (14) A person operating a personal watercraft in excess of the
10 speeds established under part 801 is guilty of reckless operation
11 of a personal watercraft under section 80208.

12 (15) This section does not apply to a performer engaged in a 13 professional exhibition or a person preparing to participate or 14 participating in a regatta, race, marine parade, tournament, or 15 exhibition held in compliance with section 80164 under a permit 16 issued by the department and at the time and place specified in the 17 permit.

18 (16) The department shall annually prepare and submit to the 19 standing committees of the senate and house of representatives with 20 primary jurisdiction over marine safety issues an accident report 21 related to the use of personal watercraft, the types of personal 22 flotation devices that were being used, and the injuries that 23 resulted.

Sec. 80215. (1) Except UNTIL OCTOBER 1, 2010, EXCEPT as provided in subsections (2) and (3), a person under the age of 14 shall not use OPERATE a personal watercraft on the waters of this state.

(2) A-UNTIL OCTOBER 1, 2010, A person who is 12 or more and
 less than 14 years of age before January 1, 1999 may use-OPERATE a
 personal watercraft on the waters of this state if before January
 1, 1999 he or she obtained a boating safety certificate.

5 (3) A-UNTIL OCTOBER 1, 2010, A person who is 12 or more and
6 less than 14 years of age may use OPERATE a personal watercraft on
7 the waters of this state if all of the following circumstances
8 exist:

9 (a) The person is accompanied solely by the person's parent or10 legal guardian.

(b) Both the person and the parent or legal guardian haveobtained a boating safety certificate.

(c) The personal watercraft is equipped by the manufacturer
with a lanyard-type engine cutoff switch, and the parent or legal
guardian has the lanyard attached to his or her person, clothing,
or personal flotation device.

17 (d) The personal watercraft is designed to carry not less than18 2 persons.

(4) A person who was born after December 31, 1978 shall not
operate a personal watercraft upon the waters of this state unless
he or she first obtains a boating safety certificate.

(5) Not later than March 23, 2004, the graduated age
provisions of this section shall be reviewed by the appropriate
committee of both houses of the legislature to ascertain the
effect, if any, these provisions have had upon the safe operation
of personal watercraft upon the waters of this state. BEGINNING
OCTOBER 1, 2010, A PERSON UNDER THE AGE OF 16 SHALL NOT OPERATE A

1 PERSONAL WATERCRAFT ON THE WATERS OF THIS STATE.

2 (6) The owner of a personal watercraft or a person having
3 charge over or control of a personal watercraft shall not authorize
4 or knowingly permit the personal watercraft to be operated in
5 violation of this section.

6 (7) This section does not apply to a performer engaged in a 7 professional exhibition or a person preparing to participate or 8 participating in a regatta, race, marine parade, tournament, or 9 exhibition held in compliance with section 80164 under a permit 10 issued by the department and at the time and place specified in the 11 permit.
