HOUSE BILL No. 6594

November 6, 2008, Introduced by Rep. Proos and referred to the Committee on Agriculture.

A bill to provide for the establishment of a grant program and procedures of administering that program; to provide for methods for certain farm product producers to access school-related food programs; to provide for the setting of standards for qualification for the grant program; to provide for certain powers and duties for the department of agriculture; and to provide for the dissemination of certain information to schools and farm product producers.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "farm to-school grant act".
- 3 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
 - (a) "Department" means the Michigan department of agriculture.
 - (b) "Farm product" means that term as defined in section 2 of the Michigan right to farm act, 1981 PA 93, MCL 286.472.

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- 1 (c) "Grant applicant" means any K-12 school or a consortium of
- 2 schools, a school district or a consortium of school districts, or
- 3 a technical assistance provider as determined by the department.
- 4 (d) "Technical assistance provider" means any person
- 5 determined by the department to be skilled and qualified in
- 6 assisting a grant applicant in fulfilling the purpose of a grant
- 7 awarded under this act by the department.
- 8 Sec. 3. (1) The department shall establish a farm-to-school
- 9 grant program to award local grants to grant applicants designed to
- 10 aid the grant applicants to develop relationships with local
- 11 farmers and producers.
- 12 (2) The department may accept money from state appropriations,
- 13 federal grant programs, private donations, or any other source to
- 14 fund the program.
- 15 (3) Grant applicants may apply to the department for a grant
- 16 for any of the following:
- 17 (a) To fund equipment, resources, training, or materials that
- 18 will help to increase the use of local farm products in a school
- 19 food service program.
- 20 (b) To fund items including, but not limited to, local farm
- 21 products that will aid teachers to use hands-on educational
- 22 techniques to teach students about nutrition and farm-to-school
- 23 connections.
- 24 (c) To provide for professional development and technical
- 25 assistance to help teachers educate students about nutrition and
- 26 farm-to-school connections.
- 27 (4) The department shall determine whether there is

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- 1 significant interest in the school or school district regarding the
- 2 development of farm-to-school connections and education.
- 3 (5) A grant shall not exceed \$15,000.00 per grant applicant.
- 4 (6) The department shall work with and utilize existing
- 5 programs and organizations to develop and implement the
- 6 opportunities of farm product producers to increase their market
- 7 through selling their farm products to schools and school
- 8 districts.
- 9 Sec. 4. The department shall, in conjunction with grantees,
- 10 make an effort to identify local farm product producers,
- 11 processors, and suppliers and work with grantees to disseminate
- 12 information on food procurement procedures available to schools and
- 13 school districts to help both producers and schools to access local
- 14 farm products. The department shall cooperate with commodity
- 15 groups, growers, and producer organizations to utilize existing
- web-based marketing tools.
- Sec. 5. The department, in consultation with farm product
- 18 producers, school districts, and schools, may promulgate rules
- 19 under the administrative procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL
- 20 24.201 to 24.328, to establish the criteria for awarding grants and
- 21 for the administration of this act.
