## **SENATE BILL No. 101**

January 30, 2007, Introduced by Senators GARCIA, SWITALSKI, CHERRY, SCOTT, ALLEN, KUIPERS, HARDIMAN, RICHARDVILLE, CROPSEY, ANDERSON, WHITMER and BISHOP and referred to the Committee on Education.

A bill to amend 1976 PA 451, entitled
"The revised school code,"
by amending section 1481 (MCL 380.1481), as added by 2000 PA 230.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 1481. (1) Not later than the beginning of the 2000-2001

  school year, the THE Michigan virtual university shall develop,

  implement, and operate the Michigan virtual high school, as

  described in this section.
  - (2) The Michigan virtual high school shall have the following goals:
  - (a) Significantly expand curricular offerings for high schools across this state through agreements with school districts or licenses from other recognized providers.

- 18 include, but are not limited to, all of the following:

- (c) Courses and dual enrollment opportunities.

- 2 (4) In addition to its other duties under this section, the

- 7 university and the department shall submit a joint report on their
- 8 findings under this subsection to the legislature not later than 1

- 14 DIRECTORS OF A PUBLIC SCHOOL ACADEMY THAT OPERATES A HIGH SCHOOL
- 15 SHALL OFFER THE COURSE AS AN ELECTIVE FOR HIGH SCHOOL PUPILS AND
- 16 SHALL GRANT APPROPRIATE HIGH SCHOOL CREDIT FOR SUCCESSFUL
- 17 COMPLETION OF THE COURSE. THE COURSE SHALL INCLUDE COVERAGE OF AT
- 18 LEAST ALL OF THE FOLLOWING TOPICS:
- 19 (A) USE OF CONSUMER CREDIT.

- 23 (D) CREDIT SCORES AND THEIR EFFECT ON INDIVIDUALS.

- 25 (6) (5) Nonpublic school students and home-schooled children
- 26 may participate in course offerings of the Michigan virtual high
- 27 school to the same extent they are allowed to participate in school
