## **SENATE BILL No. 521**

May 22, 2007, Introduced by Senator KAHN and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled

"Michigan vehicle code,"

by amending section 674 (MCL 257.674), as amended by 2000 PA 268.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 674. (1) A vehicle shall not be parked, except if
 necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance
 with the law or the directions of a police officer or traffic control device, in any of the following places:

- (a) On a sidewalk.
- (b) In front of a public or private driveway.
- (c) Within an intersection.
- (d) Within 15 feet of a fire hydrant.
  - (e) On a crosswalk.

(f) Within 20 feet of a crosswalk, or if there is not a
 crosswalk, then within 15 feet of the intersection of property
 lines at an intersection of highways.

4 (g) Within 30 feet of the approach to a flashing beacon, stop
5 sign, or traffic-control signal located at the side of a highway.
6 (h) Between a safety zone and the adjacent curb or within 30
7 feet of a point on the curb immediately opposite the end of a
8 safety zone, unless a different length is indicated by an official
9 sign or marking.

(i) Within 50 feet of the nearest rail of a railroad crossing.
(j) Within 20 feet of the driveway entrance to a fire station
and on the side of a street opposite the entrance to a fire station
within 75 feet of the entrance if properly marked by an official
sign.

15 (k) Alongside or opposite a street excavation or obstruction,16 if the stopping, standing, or parking would obstruct traffic.

17 (*l*) On the roadway side of a vehicle stopped or parked at the18 edge or curb of a street.

19 (m) Upon a bridge or other elevated highway structure or20 within a highway tunnel.

21 (n) At a place where an official sign prohibits stopping or22 parking.

(o) Within 500 feet of an accident at which a police officer
is in attendance, if the scene of the accident is outside of a city
or village.

- 27 (q) In a place or in a manner that blocks immediate egress

from an emergency exit conspicuously marked as an emergency exit of
 a building.

3 (r) In a place or in a manner that blocks or hampers the
4 immediate use of an immediate egress from a fire escape
5 conspicuously marked as a fire escape providing an emergency means
6 of egress from a building.

7 (s) In a parking space clearly identified by an official sign
8 as being reserved for use by disabled persons that is on public
9 property or private property available for public use, unless the
10 individual is a disabled person as described in section 19a or
11 unless the individual is parking the vehicle for the benefit of a
12 disabled person. In order for the vehicle to be parked in the
13 parking space the vehicle shall display 1 of the following:

14 (i) A certificate of identification or windshield placard15 issued under section 675 to a disabled person.

16 (*ii*) A special registration plate issued under section 803d to17 a disabled person.

18 (*iii*) A similar certificate of identification or windshield19 placard issued by another state to a disabled person.

20 (*iv*) A similar special registration plate issued by another21 state to a disabled person.

(v) A special registration plate to which a tab for personswith disabilities is attached issued under this act.

(t) In a clearly identified access aisle or access lane
immediately adjacent to a space designated for parking by persons
with disabilities.

(u) On a street or other area open to the parking of vehicles

that results in the vehicle interfering with the use of a curb-cut
 or ramp by persons with disabilities.

3 (v) Within 500 feet of a fire at which fire apparatus is in
4 attendance, if the scene of the fire is outside a city or village.
5 However, volunteer fire fighters responding to the fire may park
6 within 500 feet of the fire in a manner not to interfere with fire
7 apparatus at the scene. A vehicle parked legally previous to the
8 fire is exempt from this subdivision.

9 (w) In violation of an official sign restricting the period of10 time for or manner of parking.

(x) In a space controlled or regulated by a meter on a public highway or in a publicly owned parking area or structure, if the allowable time for parking indicated on the meter has expired, unless the vehicle properly displays 1 or more of the items listed in section 675(8).

16 (y) On a street or highway in such a way as to obstruct the 17 delivery of mail to a rural mailbox by a carrier of the United 18 States postal service.

(z) In a place or in a manner that blocks the use of an alley.
(aa) In a place or in a manner that blocks access to a space
clearly designated as a fire lane.

(2) A person shall not move a vehicle not owned by the person
into a prohibited area or away from a curb a distance that makes
the parking unlawful.

25 (3) A bus, for the purpose of taking on or discharging
26 passengers, may be stopped at a place described in subsection
27 (1)(b), (d), or (f) or on the roadway side of a vehicle illegally

parked in a legally designated bus loading zone. A bus, for the purpose of taking on or discharging a passenger, may be stopped at a place described in subsection (1)(n) if the place is posted by an appropriate bus stop sign, except that a bus shall not stop at such a place if the stopping is specifically prohibited by the responsible local authority, the state transportation department, or the director of the department of state police.

8 (4) A RAILROAD CAR SHALL NOT BE STORED OR PARKED LESS THAN 100
9 FEET FROM AN INTERSECTION.

10 (5) (4) A person who violates this section is responsible for 11 a civil infraction.
