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SENATE BILL No. 840

October 18, 2007, Introduced by Senators BASHAM and RICHARDVILLE and referred to the Committee on Commerce and Tourism.

A bill to regulate certain individuals engaged in residential carpentry; to provide for certain powers and duties of certain state departments and agencies; to impose fees and provide for remedies and penalties; and to promulgate rules.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
 "residential carpenter registration act".
- 3 Sec. 3. As used in this act:
 - (a) "Carpentry" means activity on a residential structure involving the erecting, installing, framing, altering, or repairing of structures and their structural parts including decks, walls,
- 7 doors, windows, ceilings, roofs, drywall, countertops, cabinets,
 - flooring, trim, and any components that make the framing of a

- 1 structure complete, including the prefabrications of any structure.
- 2 For purposes of this subdivision, "wood construction" and "wooden
- 3 structure" include construction methods utilizing substitute
- 4 materials, including, but not limited to, metal stud and composite
- 5 framing and finish materials that replace or are used in
- 6 conjunction with traditional wood construction and the preparation
- 7 and installation of concrete foundation forms or wood foundations
- 8 that do not include trench footers. Carpentry does not include
- 9 minor repair or the construction, maintenance, or repair of farm
- 10 structures and their appurtenances, greenhouses, fences, or
- 11 structures used for the production or care of farm plants and
- 12 animals.
- 13 (b) "Department" means the department of labor and economic
- 14 growth.
- (c) "Farm structure" means a farm building and its
- 16 appurtenances, a green house, a fence, or structure used for the
- 17 production or care of farm plants and animals.
- 18 (d) "Residential carpenter" means an individual engaged in
- 19 carpentry on a residential structure.
- 20 (e) "Residential structure" means 1- and 2-family residential
- 21 dwellings, including detached 1- and 2-family dwellings and
- 22 multiple single-family dwellings not more than 3 stories in height
- 23 with a separate means of egress, and their accessory structures as
- 24 further described in R 408.30401 of the Michigan administrative
- 25 code.
- 26 Sec. 5. (1) An individual shall not engage in the business of,
- 27 or act as, a residential carpenter unless registered by the

- 1 department under this act or unless exempt from registration under
- 2 this act under subsection (2).
- 3 (2) Notwithstanding subsection (1), an individual who engages,
- 4 in whole or in part, in the activities of a residential carpenter
- 5 is exempt from registration under the following circumstances:
- **6** (a) The individual engages in or performs carpentry activities
- 7 pursuant to a license or registration issued under another act
- 8 where the carpentry activities are incidental to the scope of
- 9 practice of that other act.
- 10 (b) The individual engages in non-owner-occupied carpentry in
- 11 residential structures involving carpentry work not in excess of
- **12** \$600.00.
- 13 (c) The individual engages in or performs carpentry activities
- 14 for a charitable purpose.
- 15 (d) The individual is licensed or registered under the
- 16 commercial carpentry licensure act and engages in or performs
- 17 carpentry activities.
- 18 (3) A person shall not use the term "registered carpenter"
- 19 unless registered under this act.
- Sec. 7. (1) An individual seeking registration under this act
- 21 to act as a registered carpenter shall apply to the department in a
- 22 manner prescribed by the department and pay the 3-year registration
- 23 fee of \$15.00, and otherwise demonstrate qualification under
- 24 subsection (2). The department shall issue the registration for a
- 25 term of 3 years.
- 26 (2) An individual employed by a residential builder or
- 27 alteration and maintenance contractor as a residential carpenter

- 1 shall register with the department within 30 days of employment.
- 2 The department shall register an individual who demonstrates to the
- 3 department, on a form provided by the department, proof of
- 4 employment and having reached 16 years of age. An applicant is not
- 5 required to demonstrate any experience in carpentry, passage of any
- 6 examination, or having attained any educational level.
- 7 (3) The department shall issue the registration for a term of
- 8 3 years from the date of issuance.
- 9 (4) The department shall deposit any fees or other money it
- 10 receives under this act into the state construction code fund
- 11 created under section 22 of the Stille-DeRossett-Hale single state
- 12 construction code act, 1972 PA 230, MCL 125.1522.
- 13 (5) A registrant shall report any change of address within 60
- 14 days after that change. The failure of a registrant to notify the
- 15 department of the change of address does not extend the expiration
- 16 date of a registration.
- 17 Sec. 9. (1) The department shall issue a card designed for use
- 18 as identification of the individual registered under this act. The
- 19 card shall indicate the year of registration and shall be not
- 20 larger than 3-1/2 inches by 2 inches in size.
- 21 (2) An individual registered under this act shall carry the
- 22 identification card described in this section at all times while
- 23 engaged in activity that is subject to registration under this act
- 24 and shall also carry not less than 1 piece of identification
- 25 containing the individual's picture. The individual, upon request
- 26 of an inspector, enforcement agent, or department representative,
- 27 shall produce the identification card described in this section as

- 1 well as the picture identification. An individual who fails to
- 2 produce the card described in this section is not considered in
- 3 violation of this section if he or she produces the card within 24
- 4 hours after being requested by an authorized person and presents it
- 5 to the local enforcing agency or department. Failure to produce any
- 6 identification upon the request of an inspector, enforcement agent,
- 7 or department representative shall be considered a violation of
- 8 this act by the residential contractor supervising the jobsite.
- 9 (3) The department, on its website or under any other
- 10 circumstance, shall only disclose the name, registration number,
- 11 and date of registration of a registrant under this act.
- 12 Sec. 11. (1) The department may investigate the activities of
- 13 a registrant related to the registrant's activities as a carpenter.
- 14 The department may conduct an administrative hearing under the
- 15 administrative procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 to
- 16 24.328, as part of the investigation.
- 17 (2) The department may issue an appropriate sanction described
- 18 in subsection (3) for fraud and deceit in obtaining or maintaining
- 19 a registration under this act or for a violation of this act or any
- 20 rules promulgated under this act.
- 21 (3) The department may revoke or suspend the registration
- 22 issued under this act for an egregious violation of this act, or
- 23 rules adopted under this act, by the registrant, or may impose an
- 24 administrative fine of at least \$50.00 but not to exceed \$200.00
- 25 for any other violation.
- Sec. 13. The department may promulgate rules under the
- 27 administrative procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 to

- 1 24.328, to enforce and administer this act.
- 2 Sec. 15. This act takes effect 12 months after the date it is
- 3 enacted into law.
