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SENATE BILL No. 1251

April 15, 2008, Introduced by Senators GARCIA, VAN WOERKOM, HARDIMAN, JANSEN and KAHN and referred to the Committee on Local, Urban and State Affairs.

A bill to amend 1975 PA 164, entitled

"An act to create a commission on Spanish-speaking affairs, an office of Spanish-speaking affairs, and an interagency council on Spanish-speaking affairs; to prescribe their powers and duties; to provide for appropriations; and to abolish the advisory council for the Spanish-speaking,"

by amending sections 1, 2, and 3 (MCL 18.301, 18.302, and 18.303), section 2 as amended by 2004 PA 94.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 1. As used in this act:
- (a) "Commission" means the commission on Spanish-speaking affairs created in section 2.
- (b) "Director" means the director of the office of Spanish-speaking affairs.
- (c) "Office" means the office of Spanish-speaking affairs as created in section 4.

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- 1 (d) "Spanish-speaking people" means a person, including a
- 2 migrant agricultural worker, who: has a Spanish surname; has a
- 3 parent or grandparent of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Central
- 4 American, South American, or other Spanish origin or descent; uses
- 5 INCLUDES PEOPLE WHO USE Spanish as the primary language or mother
- 6 tongue, ; is ARE identified by an employer in an EEO-1 report as a
- 7 "Spanish-surnamed American", ; or is regarded in the community as
- 8 being of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Central American, South
- 9 American, or other Spanish origin or descent ARE MEMBERS OR ARE
- 10 REGARDED AS BEING MEMBERS OF A COMMUNITY THAT USES SPANISH AS THE
- 11 PRIMARY LANGUAGE.
- 12 Sec. 2. (1) A commission on Spanish-speaking affairs is
- 13 established within the department of labor and economic growth. The
- 14 commission shall consist of 15 members appointed by the governor by
- 15 and with the advice and consent of the senate. The commission shall
- 16 elect a chairperson, vice-chairperson, and other officers from its
- 17 members as it deems advisable.
- 18 (2) Members of the commission shall be Spanish-speaking. and
- 19 of Spanish speaking origin. Members shall be appointed from urban,
- 20 suburban, and rural geographical areas representative of the
- 21 Spanish-speaking people throughout this state.
- 22 (3) The term of each member shall be 3 years. Of the members
- 23 first appointed, 5 shall serve for 3-year terms, 5 shall serve for
- 24 2-year terms, and 5 shall serve for a 1-year term. A vacancy shall
- 25 be filled by the governor in the same manner as the original
- 26 appointment for the balance of the unexpired term.
- 27 (4) The commission shall meet not less than 12 6 times during

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- 1 each calendar year. Each member of the commission shall receive per
- 2 diem compensation as appropriated in the annual budget. Per diem
- 3 compensation shall be paid only for a full day's commission work at
- 4 which a quorum is present. A member shall receive reimbursement for
- 5 actual and necessary traveling expenses incurred in the performance
- 6 of official business. Reimbursement shall be made in the manner
- 7 provided by law for state employees.
- 8 (5) A majority of the members of the commission constitutes a
- 9 quorum. A majority of the members of the commission is required for
- 10 final action by the commission. A vacancy in the commission shall
- 11 not impair the right of the remaining members to exercise the
- 12 powers of the commission.
- Sec. 3. (1) The purpose of the commission shall be to develop
- 14 a unified policy and plan of action to serve the needs of
- 15 Michigan's Spanish-speaking people.
- 16 (2) The commission shall:
- 17 (a) Advise the governor, the legislature, and the office
- 18 concerning the coordination and administration of state programs
- 19 serving Spanish-speaking people.
- 20 (b) Make recommendations to the governor and legislature
- 21 regarding changes in state programs, statutes, and policies.
- (c) Advise the governor and legislature of the nature,
- 23 magnitude, and priorities of the problems of Spanish-speaking
- 24 people.
- 25 (d) Review and approve grants to be made from federal, state,
- 26 or private funds which THAT are administered by the office.
- (e) Review and advise the governor and the legislature on the

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- 1 state's policies concerning Spanish-speaking affairs.
- 2 (f) Secure appropriate recognition of Spanish-speaking
- 3 accomplishments and contributions to this state.
- 4 (g) Review and approve the annual report by the office of
- 5 Spanish-speaking affairs as described in section 5.
- 6 (H) COORDINATE A HISPANIC HERITAGE MONTH CELEBRATION.

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
