## **SENATE BILL No. 1434**

June 27, 2008, Introduced by Senators SCOTT, BRATER, CLARKE, CLARK-COLEMAN, HUNTER and THOMAS and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled "Michigan vehicle code,"

by amending section 307 (MCL 257.307), as amended by 2008 PA 36.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 307. (1) If an applicant for an operator's license or
- 2 chauffeur's license is a citizen of the United States, the
- 3 applicant shall supply a photographic identity document, a birth
- 4 certificate, or other sufficient documents as the secretary of
- 5 state may require to verify the identity and citizenship of the
- 5 applicant. If an applicant for an operator's or chauffeur's
- 7 license is not a citizen of the United States, the applicant
- 8 shall supply a photographic identity document and other
- sufficient documents to verify the identity of the applicant and

- 1 the applicant's legal presence in the United States under
- 2 subdivision (b). The documents required under this subsection
- 3 shall include the applicant's full legal name, date of birth, and
- 4 address and residency and demonstrate that the applicant is a
- 5 citizen of the United States or is legally present in the United
- 6 States. If the applicant's full legal name differs from the name
- 7 of the applicant that appears on a document presented under this
- 8 subsection, the applicant shall present documents to verify his
- 9 or her current full legal name. An application for an operator's
- 10 or chauffeur's license shall be made in a manner prescribed by
- 11 the secretary of state and shall contain all of the following:
- 12 (a) The applicant's full legal name, date of birth,
- 13 residence address, height, sex, eye color, signature, intent to
- 14 make an anatomical gift, other information required or permitted
- 15 on the license under this chapter, and, only to the extent
- 16 required to comply with federal law, the applicant's social
- 17 security number. The applicant may provide a mailing address if
- 18 the applicant receives mail at an address different from his or
- 19 her residence address.
- 20 (b) If the applicant is not a citizen of the United States,
- 21 the applicant shall provide documents demonstrating his or her
- 22 legal presence in the United States. A person legally present in
- 23 the United States includes, but is not limited to, a person
- 24 authorized by the United States government for employment in the
- 25 United States, a person with nonimmigrant status authorized under
- 26 federal law, and a person who is the beneficiary of an approved
- 27 immigrant visa petition or an approved labor certification. The

- 1 secretary of state shall adopt rules under the administrative
- 2 procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 to 24.328, as are
- 3 necessary for the administration of this subdivision. A
- 4 determination by the secretary of state that an applicant is not
- 5 legally present in the United States may be appealed under
- 6 section 631 of the revised judicature act of 1961, 1961 PA 236,
- 7 MCL 600.631.
- 8 (c) The following notice shall be included to inform the
- 9 applicant that under sections 5090 and 509r of the Michigan
- 10 election law, 1954 PA 116, MCL 168.5090 and 168.509r, the
- 11 secretary of state is required to use the residence address
- 12 provided on this application as the applicant's residence address
- 13 on the qualified voter file for voter registration and voting:
- 14 "NOTICE: Michigan law requires that the same address
- be used for voter registration and driver license
- purposes. Therefore, if the residence address
- you provide in this application differs from your
- 18 voter registration address as it appears on the
- 19 qualified voter file, the secretary of state
- 20 will automatically change your voter registration
- 21 to match the residence address on this application,
- after which your voter registration at your former
- address will no longer be valid for voting purposes.
- 24 A new voter registration card, containing the
- information of your polling place, will be provided
- to you by the clerk of the jurisdiction where your
- residence address is located.".
- (d) For an original or renewal operator's or chauffeur's

- 1 license with a vehicle group designation or indorsement, the
- 2 names of all states where the applicant has been licensed to
- 3 drive any type of motor vehicle during the previous 10 years.
- 4 (e) For an operator's or chauffeur's license with a vehicle
- 5 group designation or indorsement, the following certifications by
- 6 the applicant:
- 7 (i) The applicant meets the applicable federal driver
- 8 qualification requirements under 49 CFR part 391 if the applicant
- 9 operates or intends to operate in interstate commerce or meets
- 10 the applicable qualifications of the department of state police
- 11 under the motor carrier safety act of 1963, 1963 PA 181, MCL
- 12 480.11 to 480.25, if the applicant operates or intends to operate
- 13 in intrastate commerce.
- 14 (ii) The vehicle in which the applicant will take the driving
- 15 skills tests is representative of the type of vehicle the
- 16 applicant operates or intends to operate.
- 17 (iii) The applicant is not subject to disqualification by the
- 18 United States secretary of transportation, or a suspension,
- 19 revocation, or cancellation under any state law for conviction of
- 20 an offense described in section 312f or 319b.
- 21 (iv) The applicant does not have a driver's license from more
- 22 than 1 state or jurisdiction.
- 23 (f) An applicant for an operator's or chauffeur's license
- 24 with a vehicle group designation and a hazardous material
- 25 indorsement shall provide his or her fingerprints as prescribed
- 26 by state and federal law.
- 27 (2) An applicant for an operator's or chauffeur's license

- 1 may have his or her image and signature captured or reproduced
- 2 when the application for the license is made. The secretary of
- 3 state shall acquire equipment purchased or leased under this
- 4 section under standard purchasing procedures of the department of
- 5 management and budget based on standards and specifications
- 6 established by the secretary of state. The secretary of state
- 7 shall not purchase or lease equipment until an appropriation for
- 8 the equipment has been made by the legislature. A digital
- 9 photographic image and signature captured under this section
- 10 shall appear on the applicant's operator's license or chauffeur's
- 11 license. A person's digital photographic image shall be used as
- 12 follows:
- 13 (a) By a federal, state, or local governmental agency for a
- 14 law enforcement purpose authorized by law.
- 15 (b) By the secretary of state for a use specifically
- 16 authorized by law.
- 17 (c) By the secretary of state for forwarding to the
- 18 department of state police the images to persons required to be
- 19 registered under the sex offenders registration act, 1994 PA 295,
- 20 MCL 28.721 to 28.736, upon the department of state police
- 21 providing the secretary of state an updated list of the names of
- 22 those persons.
- 23 (d) As necessary to comply with a law of this state or of
- 24 the United States.
- 25 (3) An application shall contain a signature or verification
- 26 and certification by the applicant, as determined by the
- 27 secretary of state, and, EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN THIS

- 1 SUBSECTION, shall be accompanied by the proper fee. THE SECRETARY
- 2 OF STATE SHALL NOT CHARGE A FEE IF THE PERSON IS INDIGENT. THE
- 3 SECRETARY OF STATE MAY REQUIRE PROOF OF INDIGENCE. AS USED IN
- 4 THIS SUBSECTION, "INDIGENT" MEANS THE INDIVIDUAL'S INCOME IS NOT
- 5 GREATER THAN 125% OF THE OFFICIAL POVERTY LINE ESTABLISHED IN THE
- 6 POVERTY GUIDELINES ISSUED BY THE SECRETARY OF HEALTH AND HUMAN
- 7 SERVICES UNDER AUTHORITY OF SECTION 673(2) OF THE COMMUNITY
- 8 SERVICES BLOCK GRANT ACT, SUBTITLE B OF TITLE VI OF THE OMNIBUS
- 9 BUDGET RECONCILIATION ACT OF 1981, PUBLIC LAW 97-35, 42 USC 9902.
- 10 The secretary of state shall collect the application fee with the
- 11 application. The secretary of state shall refund the application
- 12 fee to the applicant if the license applied for is denied, but
- 13 shall not refund the fee to an applicant who fails to complete
- 14 the examination requirements of the secretary of state within 90
- 15 days after the date of application for a license.
- 16 (4) In conjunction with the application for an operator's
- 17 license or chauffeur's license, the secretary of state shall do
- 18 all of the following:
- 19 (a) Provide the applicant with all of the following:
- 20 (i) Information explaining the applicant's right to make an
- 21 anatomical gift in the event of death in accordance with section
- **22** 310.
- 23 (ii) Information describing the anatomical gift donor
- 24 registry program under part 101 of the public health code, 1978
- 25 PA 368, MCL 333.10101 to 333.10123. The information required
- 26 under this subparagraph includes the address and telephone number
- 27 of Michigan's federally designated organ procurement organization

- 1 or its successor organization as defined in section 10102 of the
- 2 public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10102.
- 3 (iii) Information giving the applicant the opportunity to be
- 4 placed on the donor registry described in subparagraph (ii).
- 5 (b) Provide the applicant with the opportunity to specify on
- 6 his or her operator's or chauffeur's license that he or she is
- 7 willing to make an anatomical gift in the event of death in
- 8 accordance with section 310.
- 9 (c) Inform the applicant that, if he or she indicates to the
- 10 secretary of state under this section a willingness to have his
- 11 or her name placed on the donor registry described in subdivision
- 12 (a) (ii), the secretary of state will mark the applicant's record
- 13 for the donor registry.
- 14 (d) Provide the applicant with the opportunity to make a
- 15 donation of \$1.00 or more to the organ and tissue donation
- 16 education fund created under section 217o. A donation made under
- 17 this subdivision shall be deposited in the state treasury to the
- 18 credit of the organ and tissue donation education fund.
- 19 (5) The secretary of state may fulfill the requirements of
- 20 subsection (4) by 1 or more of the following methods:
- (a) Providing printed material enclosed with a mailed notice
- 22 for an operator's or chauffeur's license renewal or the issuance
- 23 of an operator's or chauffeur's license.
- (b) Providing printed material to an applicant who
- 25 personally appears at a secretary of state branch office.
- 26 (c) Through electronic information transmittals for
- 27 operator's and chauffeur's licenses processed by electronic

- 1 means.
- 2 (6) The secretary of state shall maintain a record of an
- 3 individual who indicates a willingness to have his or her name
- 4 placed on the donor registry described in subsection (4)(a)(ii).
- 5 Information about an applicant's indication of a willingness to
- 6 have his or her name placed on the donor registry that is
- 7 obtained by the secretary of state under subsection (4) and
- 8 forwarded under subsection (14) is exempt from disclosure under
- 9 section 13(1)(d) of the freedom of information act, 1976 PA 442,
- **10** MCL 15.243.
- 11 (7) If an application is received from a person previously
- 12 licensed in another jurisdiction, the secretary of state shall
- 13 request a copy of the applicant's driving record and other
- 14 available information from the national driver register. When
- 15 received, the driving record and other available information
- 16 become a part of the driver's record in this state.
- 17 (8) If an application is received for an original, renewal,
- 18 or upgrade of a vehicle group designation or indorsement, the
- 19 secretary of state shall request the person's complete driving
- 20 record from all states where the applicant was previously
- 21 licensed to drive any type of motor vehicle over the last 10
- 22 years before issuing a vehicle group designation or indorsement
- 23 to the applicant. If the applicant does not hold a valid
- 24 commercial motor vehicle driver license from a state where he or
- 25 she was licensed in the last 10 years, this complete driving
- 26 record request must be made not earlier than 24 hours before the
- 27 secretary of state issues the applicant a vehicle group

- 1 designation or indorsement. For all other drivers, this request
- 2 must be made not earlier than 10 days before the secretary of
- 3 state issues the applicant a vehicle group designation or
- 4 indorsement. The secretary of state shall also check the
- 5 applicant's driving record with the national driver register and
- 6 the federal commercial driver license information system before
- 7 issuing that group designation or indorsement. If the application
- 8 is for the renewal of a vehicle group designation or indorsement,
- 9 and if the secretary of state enters on the person's historical
- 10 driving record maintained under section 204a a notation that the
- 11 request was made and the date of the request, the secretary of
- 12 state is required to request the applicant's complete driving
- 13 record from other states only once under this section.
- 14 (9) Except for a vehicle group designation or indorsement or
- 15 as provided in this subsection or section 314(5), the secretary
- 16 of state may issue a renewal operator's or chauffeur's license
- 17 for 1 additional 4-year period or until the person is no longer
- 18 determined to be legally present under section 307 by mail or by
- 19 other methods prescribed by the secretary of state. The secretary
- 20 of state may check the applicant's driving record through the
- 21 national driver register and the commercial driver license
- 22 information system before issuing a license under this section.
- 23 The secretary of state shall issue a renewal license only in
- 24 person if the person is a person required under section 5a of the
- 25 sex offenders registration act, 1994 PA 295, MCL 28.725a, to
- 26 maintain a valid operator's or chauffeur's license or official
- 27 state personal identification card. If a license is renewed by

- 1 mail or by other method, the secretary of state shall issue
- 2 evidence of renewal to indicate the date the license expires in
- 3 the future. The department of state police shall provide to the
- 4 secretary of state updated lists of persons required under
- 5 section 5a of the sex offenders registration act, 1994 PA 295,
- 6 MCL 28.725a, to maintain a valid operator's or chauffeur's
- 7 license or official state personal identification card.
- 8 (10) Upon request, the secretary of state shall provide an
- 9 information manual to an applicant explaining how to obtain a
- 10 vehicle group designation or indorsement. The manual shall
- 11 contain the information required under 49 CFR part 383.
- 12 (11) The secretary of state shall not disclose a social
- 13 security number obtained under subsection (1) to another person
- 14 except for use for 1 or more of the following purposes:
- 15 (a) Compliance with 49 USC 31301 to 31317 and regulations
- 16 and state law and rules related to this chapter.
- 17 (b) To carry out the purposes of section 466(a) of the
- 18 social security act, 42 USC 666, in connection with matters
- 19 relating to paternity, child support, or overdue child support.
- 20 (c) To check an applicant's driving record through the
- 21 national driver register and the commercial driver license
- 22 information system when issuing a license under this act.
- 23 (d) With the department of community health, for comparison
- 24 with vital records maintained by the department of community
- 25 health under part 28 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL
- 26 333.2801 to 333.2899.
- (e) As otherwise required by law.

- 1 (12) The secretary of state shall not display a person's
- 2 social security number on the person's operator's or chauffeur's
- 3 license.
- 4 (13) A requirement under this section to include a social
- 5 security number on an application does not apply to an applicant
- 6 who demonstrates he or she is exempt under law from obtaining a
- 7 social security number.
- 8 (14) As required in section 10120 of the public health code,
- 9 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10120, the secretary of state shall maintain
- 10 the donor registry in a manner that provides electronic access,
- 11 including, but not limited to, the transfer of data to this
- 12 state's federally designated organ procurement organization or
- 13 its successor organization, tissue banks, and eye banks, in a
- 14 manner that complies with that section.
- 15 (15) The secretary of state, with the approval of the state
- 16 administrative board created under 1921 PA 2, MCL 17.1 to 17.3,
- 17 may enter into agreements with the United States government to
- 18 verify whether an applicant for an operator's license or a
- 19 chauffeur's license under this section who is not a citizen of
- 20 the United States is authorized under federal law to be present
- 21 in the United States.
- 22 (16) The secretary of state shall not issue an operator's
- 23 license or a chauffeur's license to a person holding an
- 24 operator's license or chauffeur's license issued by another state
- 25 without confirmation that the person is terminating or has
- 26 terminated the operator's license or chauffeur's license issued
- 27 by the other state.

- 1 (17) The secretary of state shall do all of the following:
- 2 (a) Ensure the physical security of locations where
- 3 operator's licenses and chauffeur's licenses are produced and the
- 4 security of document materials and papers from which operator's
- 5 licenses and chauffeur's licenses are produced.
- 6 (b) Subject all persons authorized to manufacture or produce
- 7 operator's licenses or chauffeur's licenses and all persons who
- 8 have the ability to affect the identity information that appears
- 9 on operator's licenses or chauffeur's licenses to appropriate
- 10 security clearance requirements. The security requirements of
- 11 this subdivision and subdivision (a) may require that licenses be
- 12 manufactured or produced in this state.
- 13 (c) Provide fraudulent document recognition programs to
- 14 department of state employees engaged in the issuance of
- 15 operator's licenses and chauffeur's licenses.

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
