Senate Bill 432 (Substitute S-1 as reported)
Sponsor: Senator Hansen Clarke
Committee: Economic Development and Regulatory Reform

CONTENT

The bill would amend the Michigan Liquor Control Code to allow the Liquor Control Commission to issue a license to a private entity for the sale of alcoholic liquor for consumption on the licensed premises of a restaurant located on land owned by Wayne State University, if both of the following circumstances existed:

- The land was leased or subleased at fair market value to a private entity that owned, leased, or subleased the restaurant.
- The restaurant was located within an area designated for industrial, research, or commercial development by the Wayne State University governing board.

Issuance of a license under the bill would be subject to Section 531 of the Code (which prohibits the granting of a public license in excess of one license for each 1,500 of population and provides for the transfer of on-premises escrowed licenses).
