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## **HOUSE BILL No. 5916**

March 2, 2010, Introduced by Rep. Lund and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

A bill to amend 1895 PA 3, entitled "The general law village act,"

by amending section 1 of chapter II and section 4 of chapter VI (MCL 62.1 and 66.4), section 1 of chapter II as amended by 2004 PA 300 and section 4 of chapter VI as amended by 1999 PA 259, and by adding section 4 to chapter XIV.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 CHAPTER II

Sec. 1. (1) Except as provided in subsections (2) and (3), in each village, the following officers shall be elected: a president, 6 trustees, 1 clerk, and 1 treasurer. The president and trustees constitute the council. In all votes for which not less than a majority vote of council is required, the calculation of the number of votes required shall be based on the maximum number that

- 1 constitutes council.
- 2 (2) The council by a vote of 2/3 of the members of council may
- 3 provide by ordinance for the reduction in the number of trustees to
- 4 or for the election of all trustees at the same election for 2-
- 5 year terms at the first possible election after 2004 who with the
- 6 president shall constitute the council, and may provide by
- 7 ordinance for the method of changing from 2-year staggered terms to
- 8 4-year staggered terms. If village trustees are elected biennially
- 9 for staggered 4-year terms, the ordinance shall as nearly as
- 10 possible maintain staggered terms and provide for an equal number
- 11 of seats to be filled at each election. The ordinance may extend
- 12 but shall not shorten the term of an incumbent trustee. The
- 13 ordinance may extend a prospective term. The ordinance shall not
- 14 shorten or eliminate a prospective term unless the nomination
- 15 deadline for that term is not less than 30 days after the effective
- 16 date of the ordinance. An ordinance adopted under this subsection
- 17 shall satisfy both of the following conditions:
- 18 (a) The ordinance shall be voted on and adopted at a meeting
- 19 that occurs not less than 10 days after the initial meeting or
- 20 public hearing at which the ordinance was considered.
- 21 (b) Notice of each meeting at which the ordinance is
- 22 considered indicating that an ordinance reducing the size of the
- 23 council or to change the time of election of the trustees
- 24 comprising the council will be 1 of the subjects of the meeting
- 25 shall be published not less than 10 days before the meeting in a
- 26 newspaper of general circulation in the village, OR POSTED NOT LESS
- 27 THAN 10 DAYS BEFORE THE MEETING IN THE OFFICE OF THE VILLAGE CLERK

- 1 AND ON AT LEAST 1 OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 2 (i) THE VILLAGE'S WEBSITE.
- 3 (ii) THE WEBSITE OF THE NEWSPAPER DESIGNATED BY THE VILLAGE AS
- 4 THE OFFICIAL NEWSPAPER OF GENERAL CIRCULATION IN THE VILLAGE.
- 5 (iii) THE VILLAGE'S PUBLIC ACCESS CABLE TELEVISION CHANNEL.
- 6 (3) The council by a vote of 2/3 of the members of council may
- 7 provide by ordinance for the nomination by the president and the
- 8 appointment by the council of the clerk or the treasurer or both
- 9 for such a term as the ordinance may provide. The ordinance shall
- 10 apply beginning with the first term the nomination deadline for
- 11 which would have been not less than 30 days after the effective
- 12 date of the ordinance or shall apply when the office is vacated,
- 13 whichever occurs first.
- 14 (4) The council shall provide that an ordinance adopted under
- 15 subsection (2) or (3) takes effect 45 days after the date of
- 16 adoption unless a petition signed by not less than 10% of the
- 17 registered electors of the village is filed with the village clerk
- 18 within the 45-day period, in which case the ordinance takes effect
- 19 upon approval at an election held on the question. Notice of the
- 20 delayed effect of the ordinance and the right of petition under
- 21 this subsection shall be published OR POSTED separately at the same
- 22 time, and in the same manner, as the ordinance is published OR
- 23 POSTED pursuant to section 4 of chapter VI. The village clerk shall
- 24 verify the signatures on the petitions. If a petition bearing the
- 25 required number of valid signatures of electors is filed, the
- 26 question of adoption of the ordinance shall be submitted at the
- 27 next general or special election. The ballot language for the

- 1 question shall be prepared by the village clerk, unless the
- 2 question concerns the appointment of the clerk under subsection
- 3 (2), in which case the ballot language shall be prepared by the
- 4 village council.
- 5 (5) A village that has adopted an ordinance reducing the
- 6 number of trustees to 4 or providing for the appointment by the
- 7 council of the clerk or treasurer may increase the number of
- 8 trustees to 6 or provide for the election of the clerk or treasurer
- 9 by the same process as provided in subsection (2) or (3),
- 10 respectively, and in subsection (4).
- 11 CHAPTER VI
- Sec. 4. (1) Within 15 days after an ordinance is passed, the
- 13 clerk shall publish the ordinance or a synopsis of the ordinance in
- 14 a newspaper circulated in the village, OR POST THE ORDINANCE OR A
- 15 SYNOPSIS OF THE ORDINANCE IN THE OFFICE OF THE VILLAGE CLERK AND ON
- 16 AT LEAST 1 OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 17 (A) THE VILLAGE'S WEBSITE.
- 18 (B) THE WEBSITE OF THE NEWSPAPER DESIGNATED BY THE VILLAGE AS
- 19 THE OFFICIAL NEWSPAPER OF GENERAL CIRCULATION IN THE VILLAGE.
- 20 (C) THE VILLAGE'S PUBLIC ACCESS CABLE TELEVISION CHANNEL.
- 21 (2) Immediately after the ordinance or synopsis of the
- 22 ordinance is published OR POSTED, the clerk shall enter in the
- 23 record of ordinances, in a blank space to be left for that purpose
- 24 under the record of the ordinance, a signed certificate, stating
- 25 the date on which and the name of the newspaper in which the
- 26 ordinance was published OR THE DATE ON WHICH AND THE METHOD IN
- 27 WHICH THE ORDINANCE WAS POSTED. The certificate is prima facie

- 1 evidence of the publication OR POSTING of the ordinance or the
- 2 synopsis.
- 3 (3) (2) A village may adopt a provision of any state statute
- 4 for which the maximum period of imprisonment is 93 days, the
- 5 Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.1 to 257.923, or a
- 6 plumbing code, electrical code, mechanical code, fire protection
- 7 code, building code, or other code promulgated by this state, by a
- 8 department, board, or other agency of this state, or by an
- 9 organization or association that is organized or conducted for the
- 10 purpose of developing a code, by reference to the law or code in an
- 11 adopting ordinance and without publishing OR POSTING the law or
- 12 code in full. The law or code shall be clearly identified in the
- 13 ordinance and a statement of the purpose of the law or code shall
- 14 be published OR POSTED with the adopting ordinance. Printed copies
- 15 of the law or code shall be kept in the office of the village clerk
- 16 available for inspection by or distribution to the public during
- 17 normal business hours. The village may charge a fee that does not
- 18 exceed the actual cost for copies of the law or code distributed to
- 19 the public. The publication in the newspaper OR THE POSTING AS
- 20 PROVIDED UNDER THIS SECTION shall contain a notice to the effect
- 21 that a complete copy of the law or code is available for public use
- 22 and inspection at the office of the village clerk. A village shall
- 23 not enforce any provision adopted by reference for which the
- 24 maximum period of imprisonment is greater than 93 days.
- 25 CHAPTER XIV
- 26 SEC. 4. EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE SPECIFICALLY PROVIDED BY LAW AND
- 27 NOTWITHSTANDING ANY CHARTER PROVISION OR ORDINANCE, A VILLAGE THAT

- 1 IS REQUIRED TO PUBLISH A LEGAL NOTICE IN A NEWSPAPER OF GENERAL
- 2 CIRCULATION IN THE VILLAGE MAY SATISFY THAT REQUIREMENT BY POSTING
- 3 THE LEGAL NOTICE IN THE OFFICE OF THE VILLAGE CLERK AND ON AT LEAST
- 4 1 OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 5 (A) THE VILLAGE'S WEBSITE.
- 6 (B) THE WEBSITE OF THE NEWSPAPER DESIGNATED BY THE VILLAGE AS
- 7 THE OFFICIAL NEWSPAPER OF GENERAL CIRCULATION IN THE VILLAGE.
- 8 (C) THE VILLAGE'S PUBLIC ACCESS CABLE TELEVISION CHANNEL.
