HOUSE BILL No. 6563

November 10, 2010, Introduced by Reps. Wayne Schmidt, Booher, Elsenheimer and Scripps and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to authorize the state administrative board to convey certain property in Grand Traverse county; to prescribe conditions for the conveyance; and to provide for disposition of the revenue from the conveyance.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. The state administrative board, on behalf of the
- 2 state, may convey to Traverse City area public schools, for
- 3 consideration of \$1.00, certain state-owned property located in
- 4 Grand Traverse county, Michigan, and more particularly described
- 5 as:
- 6 The North 25 feet of Lots 8 through 21, Block 12, Hannah's
- 7 Fifth Addition to Traverse City
- Sec. 2. The conveyance authorized by this act shall provide
- 9 for both of the following:

- 1 (a) That the property shall be used exclusively for public
- 2 recreational or educational purposes, subject to the granting of
- 3 necessary easements to adjacent landowners, and that, upon
- 4 termination of that use or use for any other purpose, the state may
- 5 reenter and repossess the property, terminating the grantee's
- 6 estate in the property.
- 7 (b) That if the grantee disputes the state's exercise of its
- 8 right of reentry and fails to promptly deliver possession of the
- 9 property to the state, the attorney general, on behalf of the
- 10 state, may bring an action to quiet title to, and regain possession
- 11 of, the property.
- 12 Sec. 3. The description of the parcel in section 1 is
- 13 approximate and for purposes of the conveyance is subject to
- 14 adjustment as the state administrative board or attorney general
- 15 considers necessary by survey or other legal description.
- Sec. 4. The conveyance authorized by this act shall be by
- 17 quitclaim deed approved by the attorney general and shall not
- 18 reserve mineral rights to the state.
- 19 Sec. 5. The revenue received under this act shall be deposited
- 20 in the state treasury and credited to the general fund.
