3	GENERAL SECTIONS		
4	Sec. 201. In accordance with the provisions of section 30 of		
5	article IX of the state constitution of 1963, total state spending		
6	from state resources in this appropriation act for the fiscal year		
7	ending September 30, 2009 is \$48,534,700.00. State appropriations		
8	paid to local units of government are \$26,859,700.00 as follows:

12	Sec. 202. The appropriations authorized under this act are		
13	subject to the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1101		
14	to 18.1594.		
15	DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES		
16	Sec. 301. The department of natural resources shall require		
17	local units of government to enter into agreements with the		
18	department of natural resources for the purpose of administering		
19	the natural resources trust fund grants identified in part 1. Among		
20	other provisions, the agreements shall require that grant		
21	recipients agree to dedicate to public outdoor recreation uses in		
22	perpetuity the land acquired or developed; to replace lands		
23	converted or lost to other than public outdoor recreation use; and,		
24	for parcels acquired that are over 5 acres in size, to provide the		
25	state with a nonparticipating 1/6 minimum royalty interest in any		
26	acquired minerals that are retained by the grant recipient. The		

- 1 agreements shall also provide that the full payments of grants can
- 2 be made only after proof of acquisition, or proof of completion of
- 3 the development project, is submitted by the grant recipient and
- 4 all costs are verified by the department of natural resources.
- 5 Sec. 302. Any unobligated balance in a natural resources trust
- 6 fund appropriation made under part 1 shall not revert to the funds
- 7 from which appropriated at the close of the fiscal year, but shall
- 8 continue until the purpose for which it was appropriated is
- 9 completed for a period not to exceed 3 fiscal years. The unexpended
- 10 balance of any natural resources trust fund appropriation made in
- 11 part 1 remaining after the purpose for which it was appropriated is
- 12 completed shall revert to the Michigan natural resources trust fund
- 13 and be made available for appropriation.
