## **HOUSE BILL No. 5253**

January 19, 2012, Introduced by Rep. Damrow and referred to the Committee on Military and Veterans Affairs and Homeland Security.

A bill to amend 1965 PA 190, entitled

"An act to provide for a system of uniformity of service for veterans,"

by amending sections 1 and 2 (MCL 35.61 and 35.62), section 1 as amended by 1997 PA 131.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 1. In order to provide for the uniformity of service

2	dates for veterans, the following dates and terms shall be
3	applicable to FOR all acts of the THIS state relative to veterans,

5	(a) "Veteran" "VETERAN" means a person , who served WHO MEETS
6	ALL OF THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS:
7	(A) SERVED in the active military forces , during a period of
8	war or who received the armed forces expeditionary or other

campaign service medal during an emergency condition and who was

- 1 discharged or released therefrom under honorable conditions.
- 2 "Veteran" also includes a person who died in active military
- 3 forces. FOR 180 ACTIVE FEDERAL SERVICE DAYS.
- 4 (b) "Spanish-American war" means the period beginning on April
- 5 21, 1898, and ending on July 4, 1902, includes the Philippine
- 6 insurrection and the Boxer rebellion, and in the case of a veteran
- 7 who served with the United States military forces engaged in
- 8 hostilities in the Moro province, means the period beginning on
- 9 April 21, 1898, and ending on July 15, 1903.
- 10 (c) "World War I" means the period beginning on April 6, 1917,
- 11 and ending on November 11, 1918, and in the case of a veteran who
- 12 served with the United States military forces in Russia, means the
- 13 period beginning on April 6, 1917, and ending on April 1, 1920.
- 14 (d) "World War II" means the period beginning December 7,
- 15 1941, and ending December 31, 1946, both dates inclusive.
- 16 (e) "Korean conflict" means the period between June 27, 1950,
- 17 to January 31, 1955.
- 18 (f) Civil war and confederate veterans who served between
- 19 April 12, 1861, and May 26, 1865.
- 20 (g) Indian wars. Since the Indian wars were fought
- 21 intermittently over a period of years, the determination as to
- 22 whether a person shall be considered as having rendered military
- 23 service during these wars will be carefully considered by the state
- 24 veterans' trust fund. January 1, 1817, through December 31, 1898,
- 25 is considered Indian war period.
- 26 (h) Mexican wars. Since there were several skirmishes
- 27 involving the Mexican border, such as Mexican border troubles 1911-

- 1 1916; Veracruz expedition April 21, 1914, to November 26, 1914;
- 2 punitive expedition into Mexico, March 15, 1916, to February 5,
- 3 1917; therefore the persons rendering military service in any of
- 4 these skirmishes shall be considered veterans of the Mexican wars
- 5 between 1911 and February 5, 1917.
- 6 (i) Future dates. The period beginning on the date of any
- 7 future declaration of war by the congress or the beginning of an
- 8 emergency condition recognized by the issuance of a presidential
- 9 proclamation or a presidential executive order and in which the
- 10 armed forces expeditionary medal or other campaign service medals
- 11 are awarded according to presidential executive order and ending on
- 12 a date prescribed by presidential proclamation or concurrent
- 13 resolution of the congress.
- 14 (j) Veterans of the Korean conflict and veterans having served
- 15 after January 31, 1955, in an area of hazardous duty for which an
- 16 armed forces expeditionary or Vietnam service medal was received or
- 17 veterans having served in the Vietnam era, which is that period
- 18 beginning February 28, 1961, and ending on May 7, 1975.
- 19 (B) WAS DISCHARGED OR RELEASED FROM THE ACTIVE MILITARY FORCES
- 20 UNDER HONORABLE CONDITIONS.
- 21 (C) WAS A RESIDENT OF THIS STATE FOR NOT LESS THAN 6 MONTHS
- 22 BEFORE ENTERING THE ACTIVE MILITARY FORCES OR WAS A RESIDENT OF
- 23 THIS STATE FOR NOT LESS THAN 3 CONTINUOUS YEARS AFTER DISCHARGE OR
- 24 RELEASE FROM THE ACTIVE MILITARY FORCES OR DURING HIS OR HER
- 25 SERVICE IN THE ACTIVE MILITARY FORCES.
- Sec. 2. Veterans who served in THE ACTIVE MILITARY FORCES IN
- 27 more than 1 period of war service TIME may combine their active

- 1 duty days of ACTIVE FEDERAL service IN THE ACTIVE MILITARY FORCES
- 2 to make the 90-180 ACTIVE FEDERAL SERVICE days required by veteran
- 3 benefit statutes or acts FOR ANY VETERAN'S BENEFITS PROVIDED BY
- 4 LAW.
